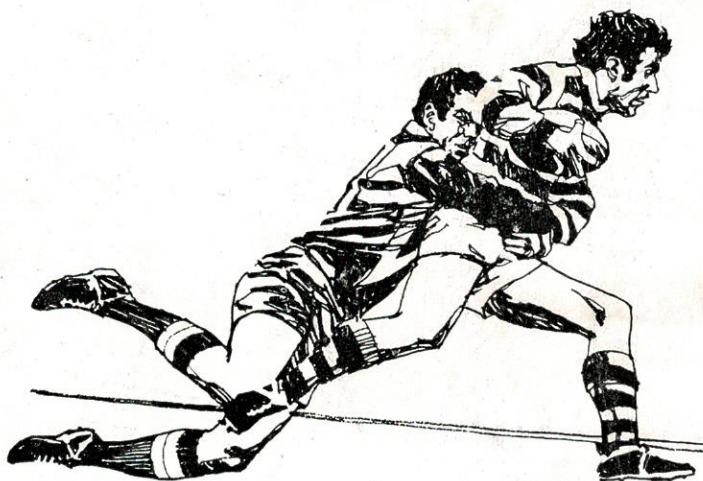

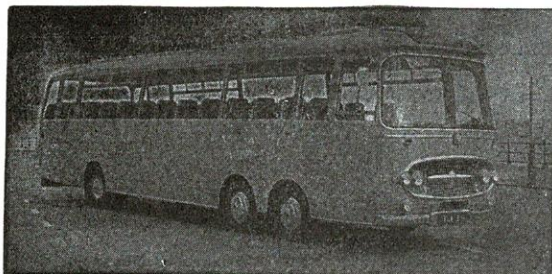

new competition will be staged on a direct knock-out basis with the first club out of the bag gaining home advantage through to the final.

This has left many of the First Division clubs feeling considerably bitter. They had expected that by finishing high in the League they would gain home advantage as long as they progressed in the play-off.

'We are really sore for we had been paying our players a bonus on the strength of finishing high and now we feel like suing the League,' said one club official.

I can sympathise with the clubs for it seems we are cheapening the competition as well as causing the fans plenty of confusion.

The ideas of playing the semi-finals on the Saturday after Wembley is to avoid squeezing them in on the midweek.

But there again this means having the final on May 24 when a large number of fans and players could well have arranged their White holidays—or even want to watch the cricket!

There is also the fact the two 20-strong England and Welsh squads will be leaving for Australia a week after the final.

Coaches Alex Murphy and Les Pearce would obviously have preferred to have a fortnight to spare in the case of injuries and this could have been done if the final had been on the normal date.

It makes one wonder just what sort of a competition it will be next season and how long it will be before the League realised they should have stuck to the Top 16 play-off and let the Second Division have their own competition.
