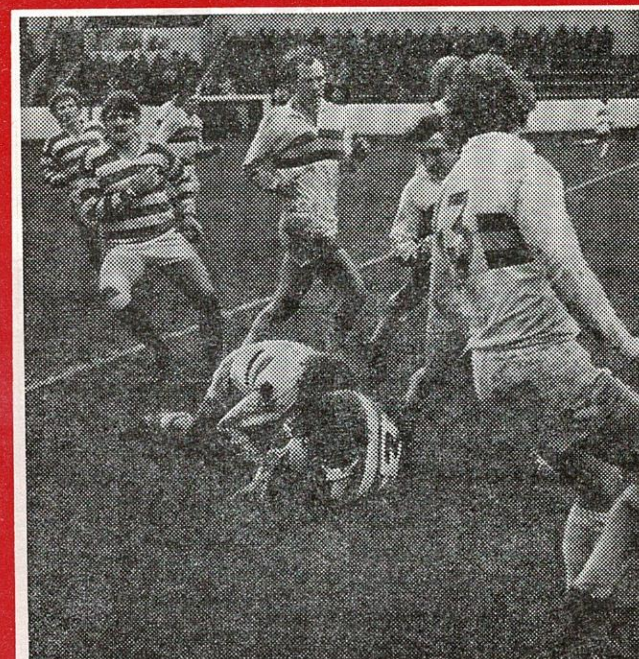

## OLDHAM OUTLOOK

So keep an eye, and an ear, open for details of all the celebrations as they come up and we trust that there will be something to appeal to all of you.

May we take this opportunity, too, of wishing you all a happy and prosperous New Year and link that sentiment with the heart-felt wish that some of your best moments of 1976 will be spent here at Watersheddings.

The turn of the year saw us just out of the reach of the bottom-four relegation zone, following our satisfying 20-14 win at Bradford.

There is a long way to go yet but it does look as though Swinton, Keighley and Huddersfield will be struggling to avoid the drop, along with one other club.

It is up to us to see that the fourth club is not Oldham and the win at Odsal took a lot of the pressure because it was very much a "four pointer".

## Brian Batty

Neil Fox will go down in Rugby League history as one of the most successful free transfer signings.

There were more than a few eyebrows raised in dressing room and boardroom when, at 35, Fox stepped down into Second Division football last season.

It was felt in many quarters that he would not last the season for a number of reasons.

Well, Neil's answer was pretty convincing for he proceeded to add two more records to his lengthy and distinguished career.

The strain of scoring 5,115 points in 666 appearances with Yorkshire, Great Britain, England, Wakefield Trinity and Bradford Northern scarcely showed as he became one of Humberside's heroes.

There must have been many an envious glance cast towards the coast as he claimed 333 points, a club record for Rovers, along with his 145 goals.

Now here he is back in the First Division where his talents belong, surprisingly after spending a summer play-

ing and coaching the New Zealand side Wellington.

He found time and enthusiasm to travel up to Auckland when England played the Kiwis in the world championship but his hopes of a pleasant holiday with his wife on the way home were dashed.

"We stopped over in Fiji but it rained for five solid days so we returned to this country to try Blackpool," he told me. "It rained there so we went to Bridlington and it was foggy."

But the sun is shining on him now for Rovers Supporters' Club marked last season's feats with a presentation and obviously hope they will be repeating the performance next season.

There seems every chance the way I saw him score 13 points against Leeds—five goals and a try—for he is still the game's finest goalkicker on his day and uses his brain to save his legs when possible.

"I have no thoughts of retiring at the moment for I am still enjoying the game," he told me.

The committee wishes to take this opportunity of thanking all our supporters who gave so generously to the Barry Kear Appeal Fund. Without this support Kear could not have been signed. There were so many donations, both large and small, that it is impossible to prepare a list of everyone involved, but whether the donation was £5 or upwards, given so readily by so

many people or 50p or less by a pensioner or schoolboy, the gesture is equally appreciated.

The committee feels that this is one of the most encouraging gestures by our supporters for a long time and one that gives an indication of the basic spirit within the town towards a successful Rugby League side.
