



INTRODUCING OLDHAM

Today's game is in fact the third time we've met Oldham this season though the two previous were played at the Watersheddings. The first was the normal league fixture, we were beaten 15pts to 6pts and 10 days later again appeared at Oldham this time in the 2nd Round of the BBC2 Floodlit Competition which we won 11pts to 9pts.

What of the personnel of the Oldham team, first of all I think I must say that their Coach is Jim Challinor a player with Warrington, earned a Cup Winners Medal in 1954 played for Gt. Britain against Australia and New Zealand in 1958 and in the World Cup of 1960. He was Coach to the 1972 World Cup winning team and before going to Oldham was Coach at St. Helens. Regular full back is Martin Murphy born in Leigh and recruited from junior club Astley Colliery. Right wing Eddie Barton was a R.U. player who sustained a serious injury which was treated and cured by Denis Wright former Physiotherapist who only left Oldham this season. Barton had trials with Oldham, was successful and signed. Phil Larder a centre, a native of Oldham but signed from Sale R.U. Club. 77 goals and 10 tries in 33 games last season. Tony Wainwright a Yorkshireman from Leeds, centre or stand off half and was formerly with the Leeds Club. Left winger Mike Elliott a Welshman from Cwmcllyn R.U. 22 tries in 37 games last season. The two half backs David Treasure at stand off and Mick McCone at the base of the scrum are both Yorkshiremen, Treasure a Castleford man was with York and Bradford Northern before joining Oldham and Mick McCone a native of Pontefract was with Doncaster before going to Watersheddings.

Oldham have signed a couple of new forwards this season, in fact not very long ago. They are Terry Ramshaw and Barry Kear. 6ft 2ins, 16sts, Ramshaw a native of Featherstone has certainly travelled in his career. He was first with Featherstone, then Bradford Northern, Halifax, Wakefield Trinity, Salford and finally Hull K. R. Kear, a much younger forward has also travelled quite a bit in his short career. He was first with Featherstone, then Salford, Hull and now with our visitors. In fact a public subscription list was opened to pay the fee for Kear to be transferred from Hull. If Keith Ashcroft is fit, he's had a broken jaw this season, then I expect him to lead the pack from open side prop. Kevin Taylor another very experienced player is one of the best hookers in the league, a Oldham man who graduated in local junior R.L. Fred Hall a sound second row forward was born in Oldham but his first senior club was Blackpool, Stephen Herbert is a youngster not long with our visitors but showing a lot of promise. Bob Welding another very experienced forward is a native of Leigh and reached Oldham via the Leigh club, Bradford Northern and Rochdale Hornets. Ray Hicks is a Widnes man who our visitors signed from Dutton Youth Club, whilst Tony Peters who I feel may be at loose forward is I think another local product. Then there's Brian Hughes another Yorkshireman from Leeds, Journy Blair another local who was recruited from Oldham Juniors Stuart Bottom who Oldham found the same way and Jim Reynolds a Leigh man who was signed whilst with Leigh Miners.

Mr A. E. Fryer (Warrington)

When you speak to Arthur Fryer who is the official in charge today, you'd never imagine that he's a Welshman, for his accent is very much that of Lancashire. But he was born in Maesteg, South Wales and though he left Wales at 5 years of age, he's very proud of his Welsh nationality. As a matter of fact, Arthur's wife is Welsh and he has three children, two boys Peter and Stephen and one girl Debbie. He was a player with Warrington and was with them for about five seasons, he actually made his debut against the Australians in 1956. At 5ft 10ins and 13sts 3lbs he's a big man and his position as a player was looseforward, in fact the only thing that stopped him playing was an arm injury which compelled his retirement as a player.

As far as refereeing is concerned, Arthur was promoted to Grade 2 in 1972 and at the beginning of this season was upgraded to Grade 1. This is in fact his 15th season as a referee and he served a long apprenticeship going through the amateur leagues and as a Grade 5 official. In his career as a referee he's had all the cup finals there are in the Warrington area and some county ones as well and he's also had the Lancashire County Shield Final which is for the second teams. This is Arthur's first appearance here as a senior referee, he tells me that he's been on most grounds as an official and as a player with Warrington, but Dewsbury and Featherstone are two he hadn't been on, at least until today and now he can say there's only Featherstone. We sincerely hope that his first appearance here is a happy one.

In his early forties, Arthur Fryer is a Self Employed Joiner and as far as other sports are concerned, used to play cricket, plays golf and is also very keen on tennis. His refereeing ambitions are the Yorkshire Cup Final and a R.L. Final at Wembley in that order, but he woouldn't of course turn either down if they didn't come in that order. His favourite TV programmes are "The Brothers" and "Poldark", favourite food is steak, though he also has a distinct liking for Chinese foods. His hobby is Rugby League and he loves to go to referees meetings and being on sporting panels, I gather he's never yet turned anyone down and never would unless circumstances made it impossible and he particularly likes helping schoolboys. He very much dislikes the "knockers" of whom we have plenty in our game. He feels that the new laws applying to the scrum have helped a lot though he sees not much point in the piece in regard to pushing before the ball is in the scrum, its almost impossible to carry it out strictly.



LOOKING BACK

They do say, that you should never "look back" but I think its very interesting to supporters of both sides to recall games which have occurred in the past. For example, when we visited Watersheddings in the league game on 2nd November 1975 we were beaten 15pts to 6pts, though I do think that the margin was rather flattering to the home side. Only 10 days later, on the 12th November, we again visited Oldham, this time in the 2nd Round of the BBC2 Floodlit Trophy and we won 11pts to 9pts, though I must say Oldham pulled up so well after we'd got a substantial interval lead, that the end developed into something of a "nail biting" affair. We didn't meet last season, but in 1973/74 we actually pulled off a league "double" winning at Oldham 34pts to 9pts, Nigel Stephenson had a "field" day, kicking 8 goals and scoring a try. In the return game here, things were much keener and Oldham were only beaten by 19pts to 13pts. Nigel Stephenson kicked 5 goals that day, so Oldham memories of Nigel can't be very pleasant ones.

In fact in 1972/73 season the season we won the R.L. Championship, Oldham were our visitors in the 1st Round of the Play Off and were beaten 29pts to 14pts and again Nigel Stephenson was the main contributor to our score, he had 7 goals and a try, Mike Stephenson had 2 tries. The interesting thing about the league fixture in that season is that each won on the others ground. On the 17th December 1972 here we lost 16pts to 12pts, Nigel Stephenson wasn't playing that day, we scored 4 tries and no goals. On 1st April 1973 we went to Oldham for the return fixture and won by 13pts to 4pts Nigel Stephenson kicking 2 goals and Jeff Yoward scoring 2 tries.
