PREVIOUS ENCOUNTERS

The surprise home defeat by Warrington in the last league match here at Knowsley Road has left Saints trailing by four points behind leaders Featherstone but, with five games in hand, Saints are still confident of landing the trophy and hope to return to winning ways this afternoon with a victory over Oldham (writes Don Yates).

When Oldham visited Saints last season in the opening round of the Premiership play-off they were soundly beaten 42-5 and prior to that Oldham have suffered many heavy defeats against Saints here at Knowsley Road. The last time they came here for a First Division match was in 1973-74 when they lost 33-12 whilst their heaviest defeat here was in 1971-72 when the score was 50 points to 2.

Although Saints have scored several comfortable victories over Oldham here at Knowsley Road, the matches over at Watersheddings have been quite exciting. One of the most thrilling league matches in recent seasons was the clash in October 1972 when Oldham had made such a fine start to the season. They had won 8 of their 10 previous matches and were undefeated in the league. Four days prior to the clash with Saints, Oldham had defeated Salford 12-8 at Watersheddings and so Saints were expecting a tough match. Both sides were at full strength and lined up as follows:

Oldham: Martin Murphy; Mike Elliott, Phil Larder, Tony Wainwright, Norman Hodgkinson; Cliff Hill, Mick McCone; Ken Wilson, Kevin Taylor, Keith Ashcroft, Bob Irving, Arthur Daley and Jim Reynolds.

Substitutes: Tommy Davies (for Hill) and Geoff Munro (for Wilson).

St. Helens: Dave Eckersley; Frank Wilson, Billy Benyon, John Walsh, Roy Mathias; Ken Kelly, Geoff Heaton; Mick Murphy, Tony Karalius, John Stephens, John Mantle, Eric Chisnall and Kel Coslett.

Substitutes: Geoff Pimblett and Graham Rees.

The match lived up to expectations and thrilled the crowd of 6,574. At half-time Oldham were in front 8-7 and the second half was just as close. Saints scored two tries to Oldham's none and so could claim to be unlucky in not taking both points but the 12-12 draw seemed to satisfy both camps. Frank Wilson and Geoff Heaton scored Saints' tries and Kel Coslett landed three goals. Oldham's 6 goals came from Phil Larder, who kicked 5, and Tony Wainwright.

This season Oldham have made a determined effort to retain their First Division status after gaining promotion last autumn. At present they lie 8th in the league table, four points behind Saints but having played three more matches. They have won 9 and drawn 1 of their 17 league matches with double victories having been recorded against both Keighley (13-12 at home and 17-8 away) and Dewsbury (15-6 home, 16-4 away). Another notable victory was the 23-18 win at Wakefield whilst they also drew 8-8 at Salford. Unfortunately for Oldham they have not shown much consistency and have allowed themselves to be beaten at home by the likes of Castleford (8-6) and Huddersfield (28-17). In cup football Oldham have shown the same inconsistency, as was shown in the Floodlit Cup when Oldham pulled off a great 16-10 win over cup experts Widnes but then lost 11-9 to Dewsbury the next time out. In the Player's Trophy Oldham won at Huyton 20-14 but then lost 46-3 at Salford and in the Lancashire Cup Saints won at Watersheddings by 19-17.

That Lancashire Cup-tie at Watersheddings proved to be an entertaining match with an exciting finish and this afternoon's match promises to be a similar affair. Saints must be favourites to win but Oldham's recent run of good form should ensure a close match and one which should provide plenty of thrills for the fans.

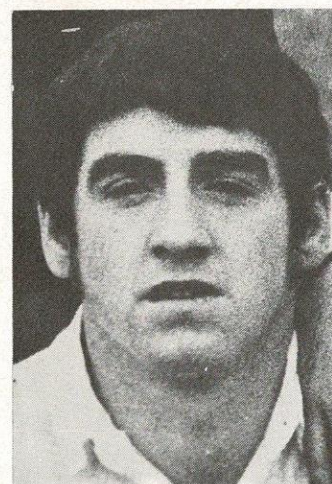

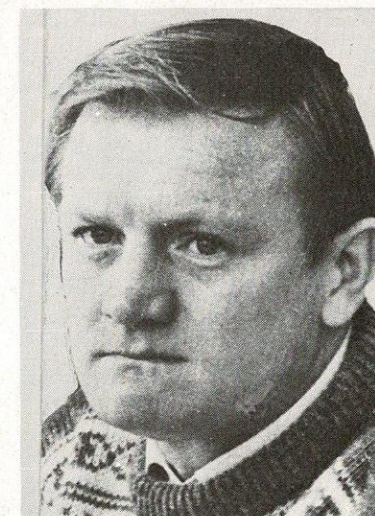

Meet Today's Opponents

This afternoon's visitors to Knowsley Road are Oldham who lie in 9th position in the league table, and so, at present, are the most successful of last seasons four promoted clubs (writes Don Yates). They have lost only one of their last six outings and are sure to pose a few problems for the Saints today.

The Oldham skipper is Leigh born Martin Murphy, a former Lancashire under-17 player who joined Oldham in April 1967 from Astley and Tyldesley Colliery juniors. He is a fine attacking full-back who has played twice for Lancashire and once for England.

The leading try scorer at Watersheddings both last season and this is elusive winger Mike Elliott who crossed for 22 tries last season and who, so far this term, has scored 11 tries. He is an experienced player who joined Oldham from Cwmcllyn RUFC in August 1962 and has been a loyal servant to Oldham. He was most unlucky in not representing Wales in the recent World Championship series.

Eddie Barton can play either wing or centre and is a strong running back who joined Oldham in February 1974 from Manchester RUFC.

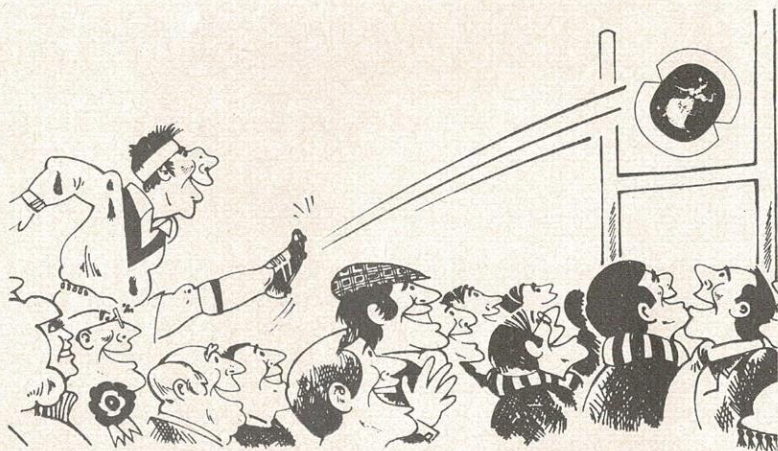
Goal kicking centre Phil Larder will be hoping to make a comeback this afternoon after receiving a leg injury on Boxing Day. He is a former Sale RUFC player who turned professional with Oldham in August 1968. Last season he was Oldham's leading point scorer with 10 tries and 77 goals whilst this season he has already scored 5 tries and 54 goals. Larder once landed 11 goals in one game against Blackpool which Oldham won 55-3.

Stuart Bottom is a promising 23-years-old centre who was signed from Oldham's 'B' team in May 1971.

The star of the Oldham back division is stand-off David Treasure whose lightening breaks have led to several Oldham scores this season. Twenty five years old Treasure is a product of the Yorkshire Copper Works junior club who turned professional with Bradford Northern in January 1971. He was transferred to Oldham for £4,500 in November 1973 and whilst at Watersheddings clinched a place in the Welsh squad for last summers World Championship series in Australasia. He played in all three full internationals on that tour and then in a further two when the series switched to Europe last autumn.

Treasure's half-back partner is Mick McCone, a former Wakefield junior who turned professional with Doncaster in 1966. Thirty years old McCone was transferred to Oldham for a bargain £1,000 fee in January

1972 and his form during the past few months has been outstanding. He has represented Yorkshire at under-19 level.

The Oldham hooker is thirty years old Kevin Taylor who has been with Oldham since October 1962 when he was signed from Werneth juniors. He has been a tremendous servant to the Oldham club and must rate as the best hooker never to represent Great Britain. He did, however, represent Lancashire both at schoolboy and under-17 level before turning professional and since joining Oldham has played twice for Lancashire, twice for England under-24 and once for the full England side.

The heaviest member of the Oldham team is 16st. 7lb. prop Terry Ramshaw who has made such a big difference to the Oldham pack since his inclusion into the team last October. He is an experienced campaigner who is with his seventh club. He began his career with Featherstone Rovers and then served Halifax, Bradford Northern, Wakefield Trinity, Salford and Hull Kingston Rovers before moving to Oldham for a bargain £500 fee. He has played for both Yorkshire and England under-24.

Oldham's other prop, Barry Kear, also joined his present club last October and, like Ramshaw, he began his career with Featherstone Rovers. He then moved to Salford and Hull before joining Oldham and has made one appearance for Yorkshire.

Second-rower Fred Hall is an Oldham lad who played amateur football with Waterhead before turning professional with Blackpool Borough. He made his debut in August 1968 at Oldham, the club he eventually joined for £700 in January 1973.

Loose-forward Tony Peters joined Oldham on a free transfer from Leigh in August 1973. He has developed tremendously whilst at Water-sheddings and has been one of Oldham's best forwards this season. Peters is a product of Leigh junior football who first turned professional in June 1971.

Although there are no big name stars in this Oldham line-up, they are a well balanced side which has been skilfully assembled by former Saints coach, Jim Challinor, who will be a delighted man if his plans to sink Saints this afternoon meet with success.

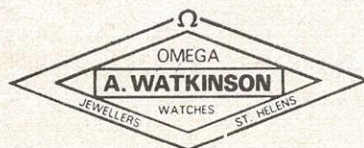
