Today we complete our home league programme with a visit from Oldham, a club who gained promotion to Division One along with ourselves eleven months ago, but who started the current season—and also their Centenary year—with a players' strike, have struggled for much of the season, and are now needing every point they can muster to avoid being candidates for Second Division football again next season. In their defence it may be added that they have suffered their worst injury jinx for years, and currently they have a full team out of action.

The season started with loose forward **John Farrell**, one of their leading players in last year's promotion drive who had a reputation for a tremendous workrate, collapsing during a training session and it is feared he will not play again. Winger **Ian Holland** was sold to Swinton for a reported £2,500, but two players signed on free transfers from Rochdale were scrum half **John Hammond** and ball-playing forward **Kevin Flanagan**.

Leading forward **Bob Welding**, signed from Rochdale just two years ago, has been out with a neck injury for much of the season, and later a gashed shin which looks like keeping him out for the rest of the season. Prop **Keith Ashcroft**, formerly with Wigan, St. Helens, Bradford and Warrington, broke his jaw in October and has been out of action ever since. Top centre **Tony Wainwright**, listed at £9,000 also suffered a fractured jaw during their defeat of Rovers last January and will not play again this season. Centre **Phil Larder**, who had been in dispute with the club and listed at £3,500, has been back in action this season and off the transfer list, and has kicked 72 goals, but scrum half **Mick McCone** has stood down for the few remaining games of the season, and off half **Dave Treasure** listed at £7,000 last November, has taken the number seven jersey.

Two forwards with Humberside connections were signed within a couple of days early this year. 32 year old much travelled prop **Terry Ramshaw**, was hailed the bargain of the season when after a year's absence from the game he moved from Craven Park to Watersheddings for a nominal fee. Oldham quickly made Ramshaw,

The second signing was that of second row forward **Barry Kear** from Hull, signed with assistance from the fans in the form of collections of an undisclosed total. The Castleford born forward previously played for Featherstone, Yorkshire County and Salford, but recently tore ankle ligaments and he too will miss the remaining games of the season.

Currently they have been negotiating with Workington for prop Harold McCourt, a player for whom we made a big offer a couple of years ago, but at that time Workington declined.

Skipper is full back **Martin Murphy**, who played for England in France last season, but has missed his club's recent games with a thigh injury. Coach is **Jim Challinor**, the former Great Britain coach, with Oldham's long serving prop **Ken Wilson** as his assistant.

A late new signing this week is **Gordon Baker**, Halifax's long serving scrumhalf, on a free transfer.

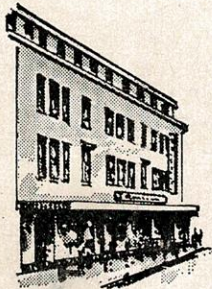
