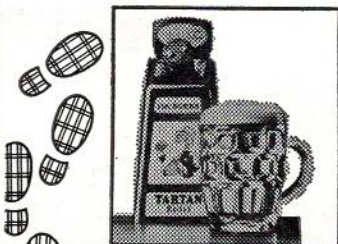

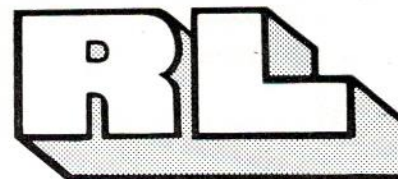

CLUB GOSSIP

After another fine away win last weekend at Warrington we retain our position at the top of Division 1. After we gained a five point lead the Wires hit back with two good tries and led at the interval by 8 pts - 5. They increased their lead with a penalty goal and a drop goal giving them a six point advantage. Then came a scoring blitz by Cas with 13 points in ten minutes, including two sizzling tries, one scored after a wonderful individual effort by Aussie Paul Khan, and the other by Steve Fenton after a dazzling run.

This typifies the brand of rugby played by our players, and to quote Alex Murphy from last week's programme, who said, "Cas are a very good footballing side who don't get involved in the physical side of the game but just keep on moving the ball and backing up" This feeling is confirmed by our scoring feats, 152 pts in six league games, four of them away from home, which gives an average of just over 25 points per match. This standard of football is sooner or later going to result in much improved attendances both home and away. Last week, for example, we received a letter from a family at Scunthorpe, who regularly watch rugby league on TV, but now wish to see the game live and have asked for our fixture list so they can come and watch Castleford. Could this be the trend of sports supporters transferring their affections to R.L. from the sordid scenes and unruly behaviour at Soccer grounds? Time will give us the answer.

TESTIMONIAL FUND

We are pleased to announce that permission has been granted by the R.L. Council for the club to organise a testimonial fund for Dennis Hartley, commencing on the 1st November.

Dennis, the genial giant, was signed from Hunslet in September 1966 at a fee of £4,750, and this has proved to have been one of the best buys made in Rugby League. He has played a total of 268 1st team games, scoring 13 tries and kicking 2 goals. He dare not kick any more goals at that time or he may have had the goal kicking job regular.

OUR VISITORS

For this evening's game we welcome to Wheldon Road the Officials, Players and Supporters of Oldham. The team just avoided relegation last season and this term have gained six points from their six league games, having won their last two games at Wakefield and then at home to Barrow.

R.U. club and Paul Starbuck who they signed from Townville Juniors.

We would like to send a get-well message to their coach, Jim Challinor, who has had a serious illness and will be out of action for the rest of the season. His duties are being taken over by 'A' team coach "Tug Wilson".
