

Their is better news of our injured players both John McFarlane and Phil Hogan see specialists this week and could be cleared to resume football, incidently Phil fancies going back to playing centre and seeing that he is probably the fastest player on the Barrow books he would certainly add speed and ability to our backs with Dave Seker filling the bill at loose forward. Ralph McConnell had a bad dose of the flu but should again be available for this game.

After a break of seven years the great Britain under 24 side makes it's re-appearance against France at Craven Park Hull to-day and we are represented in the match by Eddie Szymala who will be hooking for Great Britain. We offer Eddie our warmest congratulations on his selection and hope he has a good game to-day in what we also hope is the start of a long career in a Great Britain jersey.
