

This afternoon we extend a welcome to Oldham, a club who were promoted with us two years ago, but who escaped an immediate return to the Second Division last season by only two points, and who are again in the relegation zone this season.

Oldham were shocked in mid December last by the tragic death at 42 years of age of their coach Jim Challinor, one of the most respected figures in the game, after an illness of several months. During his absence **Ken Wilson**, their former long-serving prop, had acted as coach, but he resigned shortly after Challinor's death and the job was taken over by former Rovers prop and much travelled player **Terry Ramshaw**. Terry has proved a valuable signing for Oldham and has now come off their transfer list.

Signed from Hull F.C. within hours of Ramshaw, another widely travelled forward Barry Kear has been less successful, and is again on offer, this time at £4,000. Also on the list at the same price is their long-serving hooker Kevin Taylor, who has recovered from a broken thumb but has asked for a move after losing his place to former schoolboy international Roger O'Mahoney.

Now that Ramshaw is again settled at No. 8 the club last week decided against retaining the services of 16 stone prop **Steve Breheny**, the former Blackpool player who had been taken on loan from Leigh to add weight to their pack. They have also taken **Graham Scaife**, prop or second row, on trial from Wigan after he had been playing on permit in Wakefield amateur football.

A prominent transfer out recently has been that of £5,000 valued centre **Tony** Wainwright the ex Leeds player to Rochdale, and Steve Whitmore a former England Under 19 back has been on loan to Blackpool. Dave Treasure, a lively halfback who has played with the Welsh International side was valued at £7,000 when he asked for a move earlier this season.

The club have suffered from injuries which have put several of their leading players on the sidelines for lengthy periods. Second row forward Fred Hall, has


