MANY of the Rovers younger supporters will tend to take it for granted that a Rovers player will be over the 100 mark in the goals list, but I can still recall the disappointment in 1951 when Freddie Miller failed by 3 goals to become the first Rovers player to the century. However, the next season (1951-52) saw the Rovers at Wembley for the first time and Freddie Miller kicking 101 goals. To put his new Rovers record into perspective it is amazing but true that only 4 seasons earlier the leading goal-scorer was Ken Palmer with 18 goals in the whole of 1947-48.

Where Miller had led, others were quick to follow; and four seasons later Jack Fennell became the second Rovers player to kick 100 goals in a season with 102 in 1955-56. In 1957-58 he did it again with 101, but his record was left well behind by Terry Clawson, who kicked 136 goals in 1958-59. The pattern of 100 goals in a season was now well set, and Clawson kicked 113 in 1959-60 and 125 in 1961-62.

A new name was added to the Rovers "ton-up boys" in 1963-64 when Don Fox kicked 129. Both Clawson and Fox left for new clubs, but the tradition of goal-kicking was maintained by Tommy Smales in 1966-67 when he kicked 122. Two years later another new name appeared when Cyril Kellest kicked 125, and in 1972-73 he lifted the Rovers goal-scoring record to 139.

Now Steve Quinn has become the seventh Rovers player to kick 100 goals in a season. He needs another 35 goals to break the record, with a possible minimum number of 13 games in which to get them.

Did you get your copy of "Touchdown" today. If not, it looks like being the biggest publishing non-event of the season as far as Rovers supporters are concerned. It was back in January that "Uncle Eddie" was waving a copy about on "Look North" with the news that it would be given away at each home game. Bad weather meant that the Rovers supporters could not join in this new official newspaper at the beginning, and there were no copies at our last home game. Rumour has it that it has changed from a weekly to a monthly. Perhaps all will be revealed today.

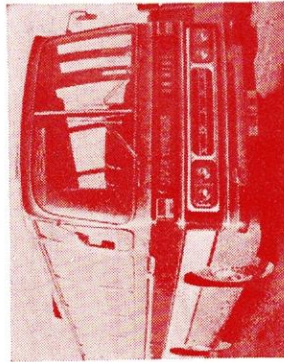

NEWS FROM B.A.R.L.A.

RUGBY League Football has received probably its greatest boost ever with the Sports Council making B.A.R.L.A. a grant offer of £8,500 toward the cost of their proposed Youth Tour to Australia and New Zealand this summer.

The Tour, which is to commemorate the 30th Anniversary of the famous Shaw Cross Boys' Club, will however be a truly representative National Team drawing its players from every corner of the Amateur Game.

The Sports Council has obviously been much impressed with B.A.R.L.A.'s growth record since its formation which has seen Youth Rugby increase ten-fold and University Rugby double. With the Queen's Silver Jubilee having a special accent on "Helping Youth," and the Tour going to Commonwealth countries, there is little doubt that it has attracted much sympathy at top-level. B.A.R.L.A. officials have already had talks with International Board members Kevin Humphreys (Australia), Ron McGregor (New Zealand) and Harry Womersley (Rugby League Chairman), and they have drawn up a six-match programme including Test Matches against the New Zealand and Australian Youth Teams. The games will be played as curtain-raisers to the World Cup games, with the first Test Match being played in Christchurch before the Great Britain versus New Zealand game, and the Australian Test prior to the World Cup Final at the famous Sydney Cricket Ground on June 25th.

B.A.R.L.A. is now launching a major appeal to raise the balance of the money, and this will take the form of "Sponsor a Boy to Australia for only a £1," and it is hoped that every Rugby League enthusiast will support this exciting venture and so play a prominent part in making Rugby League History.

All those supporting this "Appeal" will be registered as "Pioneer Sponsors" and will receive a free copy of the "Silver Jubilee Youth Tour Brochure" when the tour is completed.
