





"Why don't they buy some players?" was the question from the not-too-wellinformed when the Dons were bottom of the table and in financial difficulties.

The simple answer was that there was no way that they could afford a trip into the transfer market and, without the resources to run an "A" team, there was no way the club could bring on their own talent.

Now the position has changed but, although the directors have put the club back on its feet and given it a much brighter future, there is not an abundance of money and it is still a case of looking for bargains.

In this respect the Dons have a pretty good track record. Since they took the plunge to re-build the side nearly a year ago, club officials have made some very astute signings.

They kicked off with the aguisition of Tony Banhan and Don Robson from Hull.

Banham was an instant hit, even though his workrate has been criticised from time to time, and he went on to become last season's leading try-scorer with a barnstorming style which appealed to the fans. He is one of the few players who has the fans on the edge of their seats with anticipation every time he gets the ball.

Even though Robson left the club recently in somewhat unhappy circumstances his signing served its

purpose and he introduced a steely hardness into the pack at a time when it was most needed.

Young goalkicking centre David Noble followed from Wakefield Trinity at a giveaway price and he has collected a bagfull of points with tries, accurate kicking and a flair for dropping goals.

The signing of Noble was a fine investment for the Dons could recoup their money an time they wanted. In the last two weeks they have rejected approaches from Barrow and Huddersfield and other clubs have had him watched.

Second row man Norman Cooper also came from Wakefield to play a vital part in the Dons revival. Cooper, possibly the best all-round forward the Dons have had in recent years, gets through a vast amount of work which is not always noticed by the fans...but it is appreciated by his fellow-professionals on the field.

Dick tries to bring the best out of his players and, although he will soon be approaching the twilight of an honourable career, he has the know-how to play a big part in the long-term future of the club.

Within days of his appointment he was considering bringing new players to Tatters Field and his contribution is far more than 80 minutes on a Sunday after-

In addition the Dons picked up Kevin Hanley, Jimmy Irwin and Alan Walker from amateur clubs last season and the decision to re-form the "A" team is proving a sound investment this term. Wayne Mountain and Roy Lockwood have already signed professional forms and there are more good prospects on the way up.
