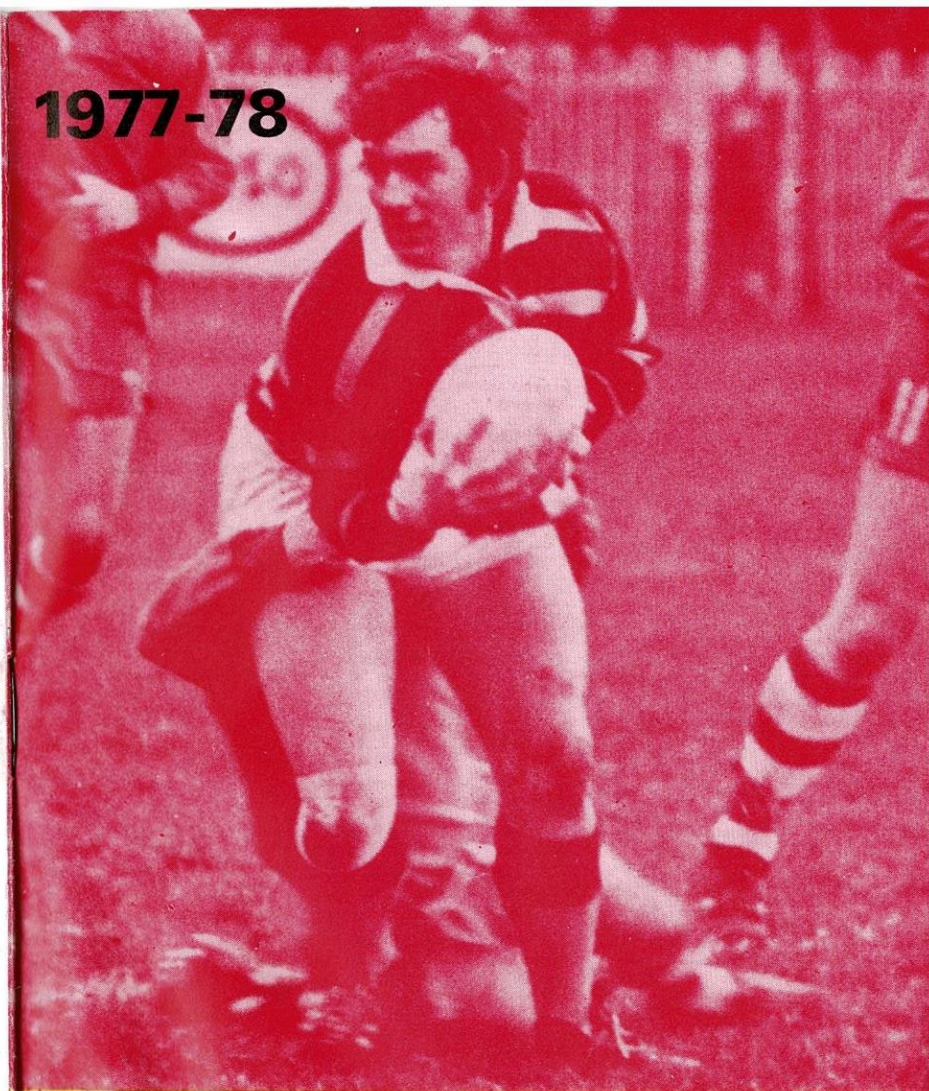

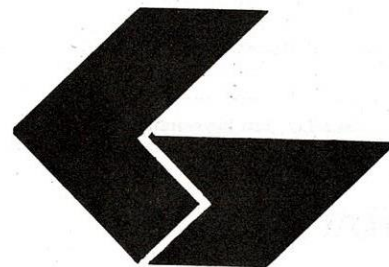

Today's Opponents — OLDHAM

Oldham are among Huddersfield's closest rivals for promotion to the First Division. And they are in the middle of a great League run having lost just one of their matches so far this season.

Because of their Floodlit Cup tie at Salford earlier this week the Oldham team had not been decided when these notes were compiled but they have a useful pool of players from which to settle their line up.

Brian Anglin, signed from Oldham amateur football, played full-back against Salford while John Blair, a very useful footballer, has been injured, and first choice number one Martin Murphy has been playing up at stand off.

Phil Larder has recently returned to Oldham's first team after being sidelined with an army injury and he is forming a useful partnership with his Saddleworth based teacher colleague, Eddie Barton.

Keith Jackson and Uri Stondin are both Oldham youngsters who are making their mark in the Watersheddings back division.

The half-back pairing will depend on the injury situation. If John Paterson is fit he will probably play at stand off half with mercurial Alan Bates, the former Dewsbury star, playing at scrum half. Both are very clever players and Huddersfield will have to watch them very carefully.

Brian Hughes, Roger O'Mahoney and Peter Frodsham have formed Oldham's front row for most of the season. Hughes is a former Leeds player who was highly rated by Derek Turner, O'Mahoney has worked his way up through the ranks and Frodsham was signed from Salford this season.

Their back three at Salford was Steve Herbert, son of former Workington player, Norman Herbert, former Warrington starlet Peter Jewitt who is now playing with his home town club and Leigh-based Tony Peters.

And Oldham still have to introduce former Fartowner Alan Forster into their pack. Alan suffered a shoulder injury shortly after joining Oldham. Other players likely to be part of Oldham's plans are former Blackpool second rower Fred Hall and powerful running utility player Geoff Munro.

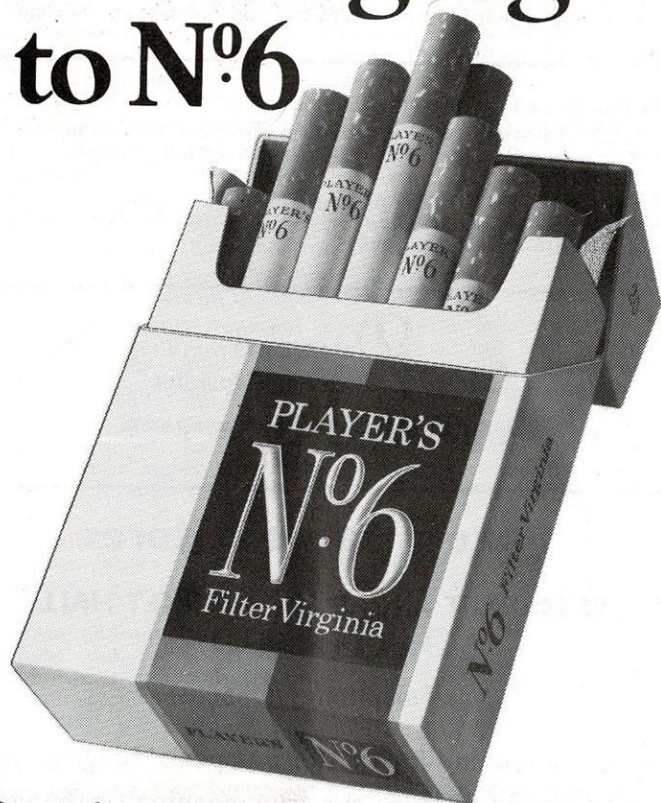

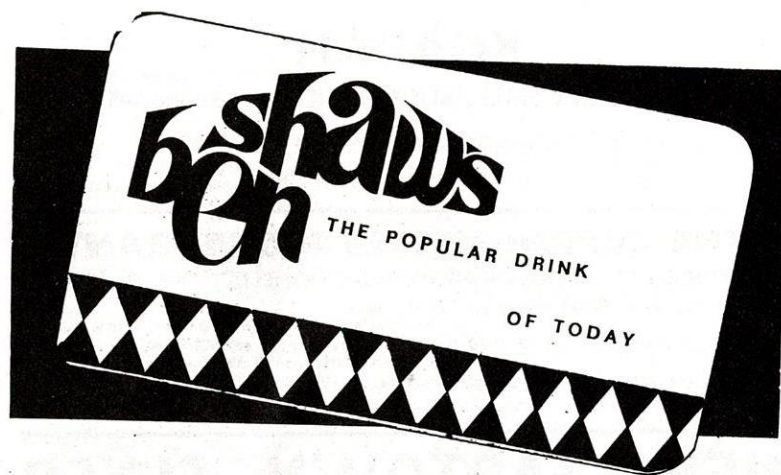
