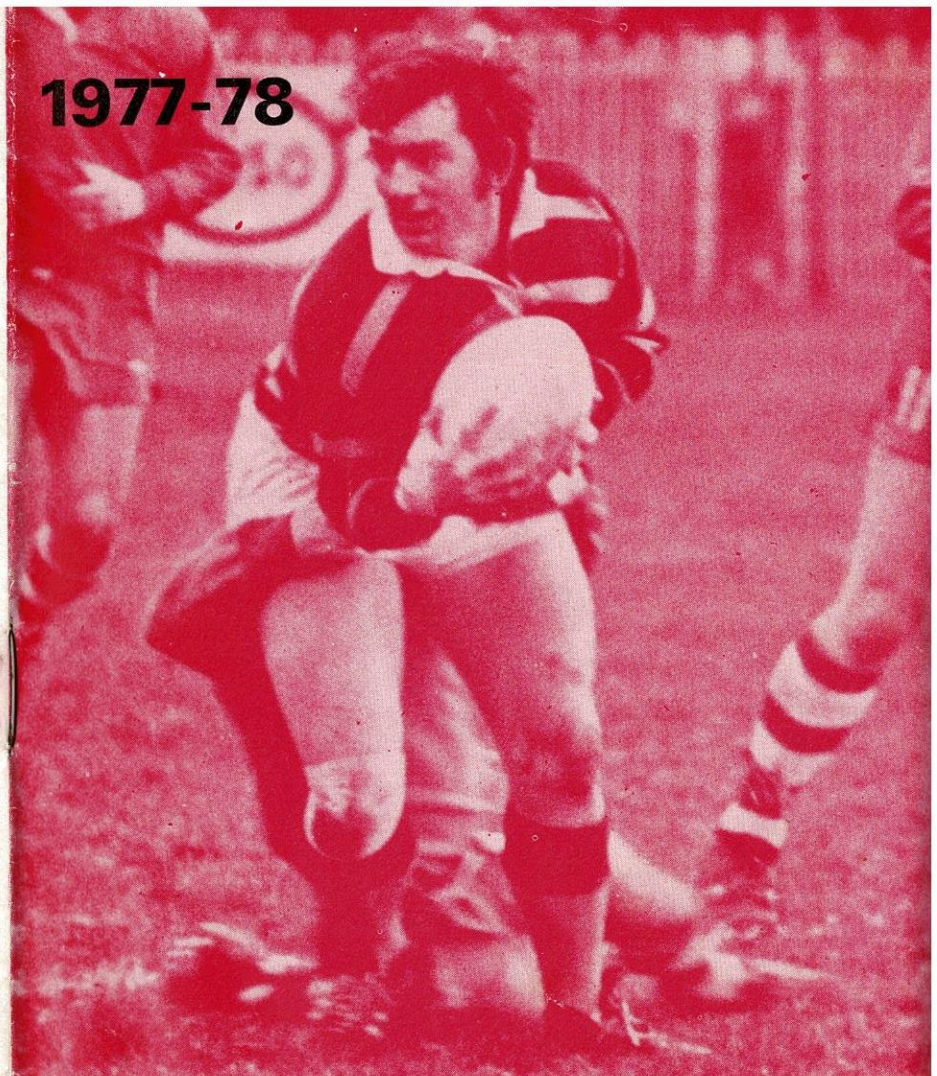

I would like to extend a warm welcome once more to our friends from Oldham and wish them, as well as our own supporters, a prosperous New Year.

This will be a tough match for us and one we need to win to maintain our position in the top six of the Second Division.

The lads from the Watersheddings proved a handful for us in November when they came to Fartown in the second round of the John Player Competition.

Indeed, Oldham were winning with thirty minutes to go and we had David Jeanes sent off for a high tackle on livewire scrum half Alan Bates, since signed after a trial period.

We now have a new board of directors at Fartown and I am optimistic about the future. We will be trying today to start the new year as we mean to carry on — that is with a win, but it will not be easy.

Today's Opponents — OLDHAM

When Oldham came to Fartown in November it was for a John Player Competition match. Yet this league encounter will probably have as much importance for both sides.

Depending on the outcome of the Christmas games — and Oldham had another tough clash with Second Division leaders Rochdale — there can be very little separating the two teams in the top six.

At the time of writing the visitors were hoping to get a few of their injured players back to fitness, though one likely absentee is ex-Fartown forward Alan Forster, who moved to the Watersheddings in the deal which brought Glen Knight back to Huddersfield.

Alan, who was disappointed not to play at Fartown in the cup-tie, may have to see a specialist about his arm injury, which is more complicated than at first thought.

The full back berth is certain, bar injury, to be taken by Martin Murphy, who had a fine game against Huddersfield in November, while there is fierce competition for the threequarter spots.

Keith Jackson and goalkicker Uri Stondin were the wingers on that occasion, and Phil Larder, who sustained an injury early on, and Eddie Barton were the centres.

Coach Dave Cox, in his first season at Oldham, can also call on Brian Anglin, Geoff Munro and Huyton centre Tony Redford, who has been having trials.

When Cox arrived at the Watersheddings he brought with him former Dewsbury skipper Alan Bates, whose scrum-half qualities were proved in a distinguished career at Crown Flatt.

The stand-off position is far less open with John Paterson, Mick McCone and John Blair all competing for places.

Brian Hughes, Roger O'Mahoney and Peter Frodsham made up the front row on Oldham's visit two months ago though Frodsham lost his place to Fred Hall soon after that through injury.

Peter Jewitt could be joined in the second row by either Steve Herbert or Paul Starbuck while Leigh-based Tony Peters is a very capable loose forward.

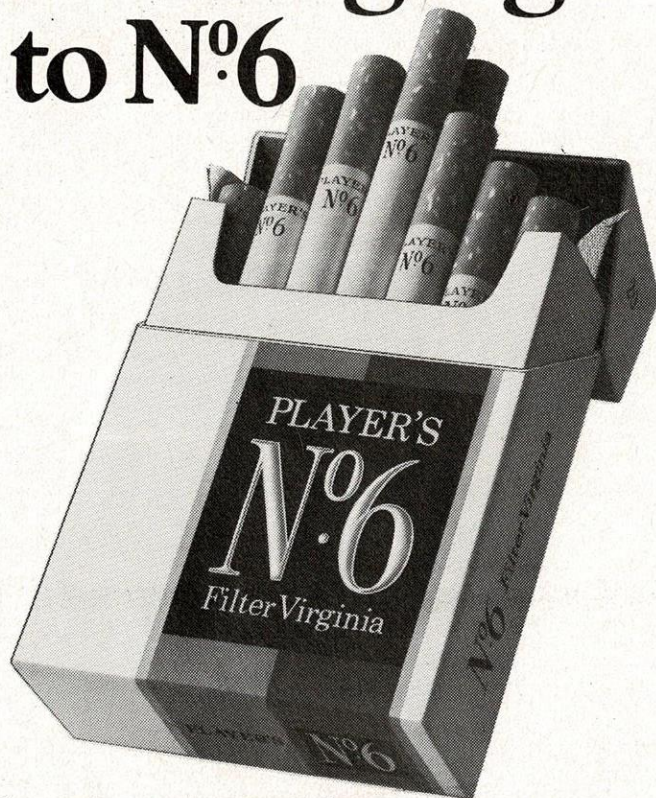

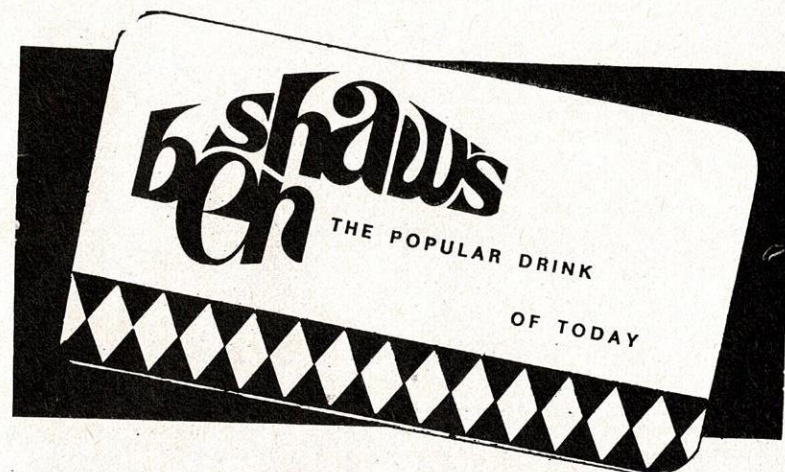

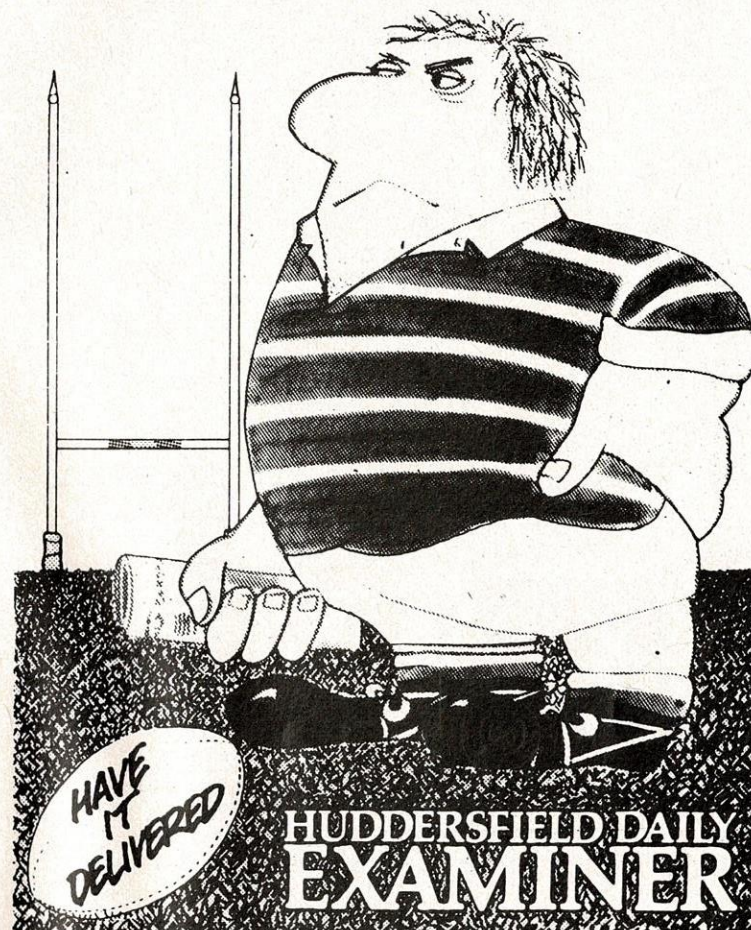
