Today's Opponents: Oldham

We entertain Oldham today in the BBC 2 Floodlit Trophy Preliminary Round. The winners will play Leigh at home in the first Round proper.

Oldham narrowly failed to gain promotion last Season, finishing fifth in Division 2 behind Leigh, Barrow, Rochdale and Huddersfield.

Like ourselves Oldham were knocked out of this Season's Lancashire Cup at the first hurdle. They lost to Salford and although they conceded 30 points they managed to score 15 through tries by Blair (2), O'Mahoney, and three goals by Standin.

The Oldham Club was formed in 1876, and they were one of the founder members of the Northern Union in 1895, Mr. Joseph Platt of Oldham becoming the first Secretary of the Northern Union.

They have won the Rugby League Challenge Cup 3 times and been Runners Up on 4 occasions. They have won the League Championship 3 times, and finished second 5 times. 16 times they have reached the Final of the Lancashire Cup, winning it 9 times.

One of the occasions they were Runners Up in the Lancashire Cup was in 1954 when Barrow defeated them 12 - 2 in the Final at Station Road, Swinton. Goodwin and Parker each scored a try for Barrow, with Willie Horne getting 3 goals. Bernard Ganley scored Oldham's points.

AMATEUR NOTES (By Paddy McAteer)

Amateur Rugby to Clubs in the Barrow and District this Season will have a new look to it, for we have joined forces in a small way with our West Cumbria neighbours in making a super League. Although it has not got off the ground in the way both Leagues would have wished at least it has got off the ground.

Four Clubs from each League was the aim but for this Season Millom, Askam, Dalton, Ulverston, Walney and Holker Pioneers will represent Barrow while Wath Brow and Hensingham will represent West Cumbria.

Over the years the Barrow and District League has supplied many stars to the Barrow Club and it is hoped that many more will follow.

Ex-Professional players now helping in coaching with amateur Clubs include Ivor Kelland (Ulverston), Mike Sanderson and Dennis Jackson (Askam), Podder Morris (Millom), Derek Hinchley (Roose), George Matthews (Walney) and Brian Backhouse (Barrow Island)

Millom came out tops again last term winning no less than seven Trophies out of nine. Barrow Island and Walney won the others.

THIS WEEK. (by Stan Morgan)

Under the above heading, each future home programme will try to revive the old days for the Craven Park fans who count the hairs on their heads on their fingers and toes. There will, however, be occasions when those with hair will relish the memories of our past glories - and we have had them!!

It is the sole intention of the writer to remind his readers that our team has had some marvellous victories - and not a few glorious defeats, during our long history. Wins are always acceptable, but if we cannot learn the lessons our defeats bring, we waste our time playing and supporting the finest spectator sport ever.

This first week's memories unfortunately include very few which uphold our pride as we were knocked out of Round 1, Lancashire Cup in 1977 and 1976 earlier. We were beaten in the same Round in 1975, 1974 and 1973, at home, by Swinton, Leigh and again Swinton. Our best recent results go back to 1964 when we played three League games in six days - 26th, 29th and 31st - two away and one at home. Keighley (a) 22 - 5, Huddersfield (a) 12 - 19, and Workington Town (h) 11 - 8. A total of 45 - 32 under the circumstances was quite creditable, the Barrow scorers being Challinor (2), Woolveridge, Redhead (2), Smales, Boylan - tries; and Irving (8), Dawes (4) - goals

We must now forget several previous years and return to the Willie Horne era - to 27/8/56, when we beat St. Helens at home in the Lancashire Cup, 1st Round by 18 - 12, only to lose to Leigh in the Semi-final by 7 - 11. The year before, 1954, we managed our only Lancashire Cup success in beating Rochdale H., Widnes and Leigh on our way to winning the Final against Oldham, at Swinton, by 12 - 2 before a crowd of 25,462. The team that day was: Poole, Hinchley, Jackson, Goodwin, Castle, Horne, Toohey, Belshaw, McKeating, Barton, Grundy, Parker, Healey - how many of you remember them? In that same season, of course, we had our only success in the R.L. C. Cup at Wembley against Workington Town, on 30/4/55. This, without doubt, was our best ever season with two Cups and a very creditable final League position of eighth, having won 24 of the 36 games played in addition to some really tough Cup matches.

These memories are just a taste of things to come - many in greater detail, and even further back than 24 years ago. If any reader wants further details of any game played since 1925 a letter to the writer will receive prompt attention.
