



The Colts also suffered injuries in their defeat by a bigger Salford side, the major one being a dislocated knee of loose forward Steve Sawles.







Their achievements are at last being recognised with the launching of the new £3,000 award scheme for the Coach of the Month in both the First and Second Division.

Sereena Sports, who have given the Dons their new sponsored kit, are the firm behind the scheme.

It means monthly awards of £150, a trophy and sports goods to each divisional winner throughout the season.

Eric Ashton, of St. Helens, was the first winner of the Division One Coach of the Month award while Maurice Bamford, who has engineered the Halifax revival this season, captured the Division Two prize.
