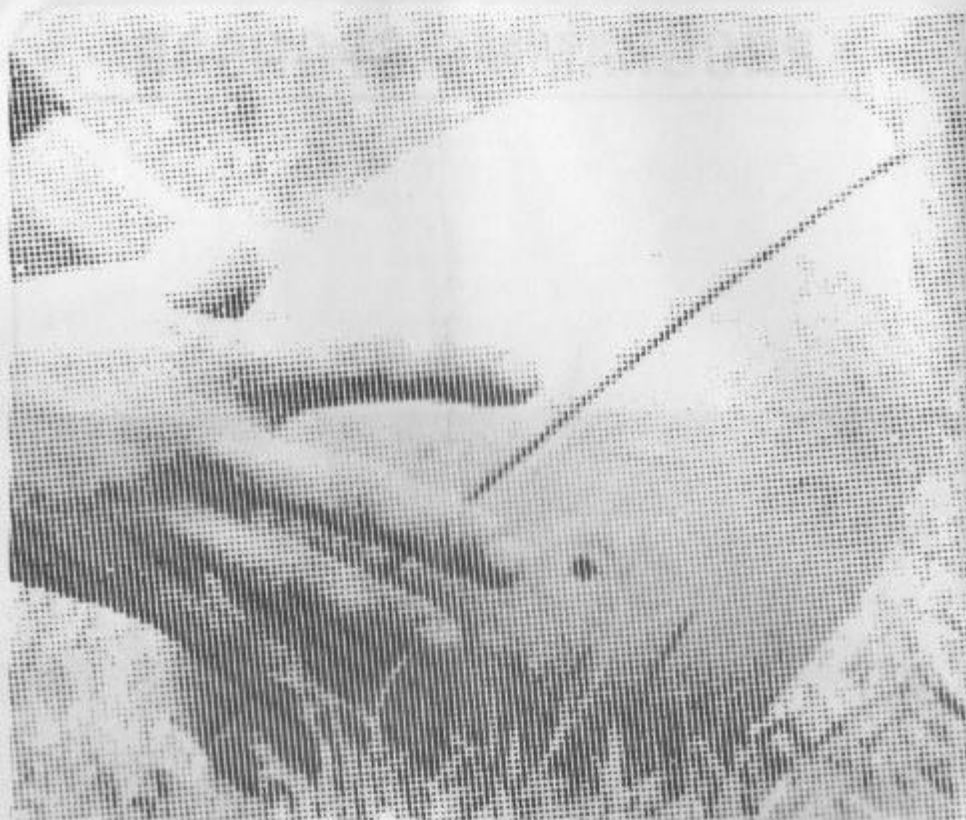

THE constant struggle Huyton have had to endure over the years to keep the League flag flying on soccer-mad Merseyside has never been more intense than in the last 12 months.

"Yes, we're having a rough season", admits secretary Ken Grundy, who has served Huyton loyally for 27 seasons, first as a player in the old Liverpool City days and for the last 19 years as secretary.

"We're having to sell to keep the club going, but it's desperately hard work, although we don't make a habit of going around crying poverty.

"One thing is certain: we'll still be there at the end of the road".

The men Huyton have sold this season are former Oldham forward Arthur Daley to Leigh for £4,000 and Keith Wills to big-spending Barrow for £2,500.

Daley joined Huyton on a "free" from Watersheddings, yet two weeks before his move to Hilton Park, he was the subject of a massive £8,000 offer by Second Division leaders, Hull.

Selling like this throws a huge burden on popular player-coach Geoff Fletcher, another former Oldham stalwart, who must have one of the smallest playing staffs in the whole of the Rugby League.

Most of the current crop of Huyton players have been recruited from amateur rugby -- apart from their experienced halves Jimmy O'Neill and Alan Bishop -- and many is the time Fletcher has had to recruit from the amateurs only the day before a match.

Nevertheless, Huyton can always be guaranteed to put up a brave show and, indeed there were neutral observers who felt they had played the better football in the match against Oldham at Alt Park just before Christmas.

Two great solo tries by Phil Larder swung the match Oldham's way, but there was plenty of evidence to show that coach Fletcher is succeeding in some small degree in his eternal plea for bright attractive football.

Says Geoff, "We always try to throw the ball around and play good stuff. We will certainly give Oldham a good game at Watersheddings".

At last it looks as if one barrier between Rugby Union and League is going to be broken down.

There are increasing signs that Union is going to have to stop discriminating against the League amateurs who want to play their code.

The outcry in the face of the stubborn Union attitude has reached a pitch where we can now expect some positive action.

At the moment the Rugby Union is struggling to survive an attack brought by the growing allegations of illegal payments to many players in the form of surprisingly high expenses.

The situation has been brought to a head by the payment by Blackheath of £750 to 11 players involved in a charity raising game last April.

What has caused even greater concern is that money was lost on the match and this has upset even protective Union officials.

But it is the widespread system of generous expenses to Rugby Union players that amazes the League players who come into touch with their counterparts.

The Welsh have had a reputation for years of handing out 'payments' to their players to the point that it has become accepted in many quarters.

A famous Scottish Union star, who had toured with the British Lions, was asked down to Cardiff a few years ago for a game for the Barbarians and is reputed to have received expenses topping £200.

Now even though the tales of some of the expenses collected in Union could be exaggerated there is no doubt that many of their players are better off than they would be playing in League.

The one area where the Union player could gain is in getting a handsome signing on fee to set up in life.

I heard recently of an Orrell player claiming he was offered £25 a week expenses if he moved to join a top Cheshire club who have recruited a team of stars over the years.

It all points to the reason perhaps why Union players can afford to turn down attractive League offers.
