PRESIDENT'S PAGE

You will see on another page of this programme the 2nd Division league table as it was before last weekends games and there is also a comparison of the games to be played by our promotion rivals and those to be played by this club. It's plain from the information given, that as far as we are concerned every post must be a winning post in the remaining games and even if we manage to complete our programme without a slip, a lot really depends on our rivals, particularly York, Halifax and Blackpool Borough. I have every confidence that if luck is with us we shall achieve our object, promotion to the 1st Division, if we fail it will certainly not be for lack of trying by everyone both on and off the field.

All these injuries and there have been plenty of others disrupt the rhythm of the side, though I must also pay tribute to those who have gone into the side as replacements.

A recent example, is John Clark, John has played at centre, wing and loose forward in recent times without really finding a regular place, but Alan Lockwood in the absence of Richardson gave him a run at full back and his last ditch tackling has at times proved crucial culminating in a first class showing at Bramley on Easter Monday. After tragically losing scrum half Malcolm Thornton before the season started, another long serving player who had not been able to command a regular place was given a run in that berth and now Steve Lee has completed nineteen games in succession without conceding second best to any of the opposing scrum halves, including £20,000 Clive Pickersgill of Hull. The youngsters have also played their part, for instance, Malcolm Agar took over the goal kicking role and has kicked 36 in 12 games, whilst in the last two games John Eastwoods 4 tries have shown his potential if he gets the running chances.

Finally, I extend a warm and cordial welcome to Officials, Players and Supporters of the Oldham Club who are visitors this evening.

It's interesting to note that of the last ten games between Dewsbury and Oldham, Dewsbury have won six and Oldham four and of these ten games, one was a 2nd Round Floodlit Competition game at Oldham, another was a 1st Round R.L. Cup also at Oldham and a third was a 1st Round of the Premiership here at Crown Flatt. Dewsbury won all of these games, the remaining seven games went three to Dewsbury and four to Oldham. After that analysis it seems that Dewsbury may have been much better in games other that league games, but Oldham had the edge in the league.

The last time Oldham were at Crown Flatt, was on January 18th 1976 and they won by 16pts to 4 pts. The Rugby Football League now confirmed that the legendary Neil Fox is the official world record points scorer of all time. Wakefield born Fox has amassed the formidable points total of 6,212. It had generally been agreed that the former Test full back the late Jim Sullivan had built up a total of 6,206 points but this total included friendly matches which are not counted for official purposes, it has now been agreed that Sullivan's total of official points was 6,005. Fox's total is made up of 2,571 goals (including four one point drop goals) and 358 tries. Sullivan still has the record for most goals, 2,860, the remainder of his points being made up with 95 tries.
