In the past three months no less than five very promising youngsters have been signed by Oldham after first having had talks with ourselves.

THE CHAIRMAN SPEAKS

TO all Swinton supporters, welcome to a new season at Station Road. A season which we hope will herald a new and exciting chapter in the club's history. For it is the honest and avowed intention of the Board of Directors to do everything possible to put the club back where it belongs—AT THE TOP!

These days *all* clubs, even those who enjoy good attendances require revenue from outside sources in order to survive. Swinton, even when successful have never had sufficient money coming through the turnstiles to show a profit. As a result the club continuously lost money, this fact coupled with currently poor team performances which have been reflected in low gates created certain cash-flow problems. This was one of the reasons why the club most reluctantly sold Graham Johns and Dennis Ashcroft. Though it must be said that both players asked for the moves. These two transfers and great Boardroom effort meant that at the end of last season the club, financially at least, was in a stronger position than for many years, but still in a situation where not enough revenue was coming in from those outside sources.

Having, so to speak, stemmed the financial tide, the question then was how could the club not only turn with the tide, but also rise with it. Obviously a policy of continually selling good players is suicidal.

The absolute priorities these days for any club are success on the field and enough money coming into the club to achieve and maintain that success.

In an effort to create a solid foundation on which to build the Board decided on two major steps, these steps resulted in two of the most important "signings" Swinton have ever made.

Regarding money coming into the club it was felt that a new concept, at least as far as Swinton are concerned, was needed in fund raising. With this in mind John Lloyd was recruited as Commercial Manager. A man of proven ability in his particular field, John has an excellent track record and he is looked upon as a more valuable signing than any player. He comes to us from Runcorn F.C. and has brought with him David Rylance as his assistant. He has also brought with him the lottery ticket that was so successful for him there and we regard the "Goldliner" as it is called, as the best value lottery ticket in the market. John is very confident about the potential of the "Goldliner" in the area and his immediate aim is to wipe out the club's overdraft. If this can be done, Swinton will be able to move forward with greater confidence than at any time in their history.

Our other major signing came late last season when our former half back Colin Lenton became the club's first ever Chief Scout. Colin comes to us after a distinguished career in the amateur game during which time he coached Blackbrook of St. Helens Under 18's, Lancashire Under 18's and

Although we made excellent offers we could not compete with their abundance of lottery cash. This situation of unearthing players for Oldham to sign is very exasperating for our Chief Scout Colin Lenton, who jokingly says "I'm going to have to find a hit man in St. Helens and put out a contract on Terry". Mind you, there's many a true word spoken in jest.

Oldham have certainly signed an exciting array of junior talent. Some names to look out for in the future are Ray Ashton (brother of Alan) Terry Flanagan (brother of Kevin), Les Cooke, Steve Littler, Mike Coombes and Mike Cowley. It could well be with players like the evergreen Martin Murphy, Mike Elliott, Phil Larder plus the likes of Francis, Fiddler and Ashcroft laying alongside the youngsters, Oldham could have a most exciting blend of youth and experience.

We wish the officials and staff of Oldham well in their efforts to lift the club, it's about time there were some new faces in the honours list.
