Lawkholme Lines

What a scintillating start to the Eighties! Phew! The few who made the long journey to Cumbria last weekend must still be getting their breath back after the nail-biting excitement of the deserved but 'close shave' 18-16 win over Barrow.

Apart from Keighley only Featherstone have wheeled two League points from the Barrow boys on their own Craven Park pitch this term.

But then the unusual seems to have become usual in this season of inconsistency! Who would have thought Keighley would have a cheerless—and pointless!—run into Christmas and gone down 16-5 at Bramley and repeated the hard-to-take medicine with another dose of the 16-5 defeats at home to Whitehaven. Again making mockery of the form book they rang in the Eighties with a sweet revenge win—to erase memories of the heaviest defeat of the season, 42-9 at Lawkholme in September!

But what a 'heart stopping' finish. Keighley led 7-3 at the interval, added another 11 points in five sparkling minutes and Barrow looked down and out at 18-3 but to prove the point it is never won until it is lost, they staged a spirited come back and snatched 13 points in 10 minutes—to reduce the gap to 18-16 with the clock showing 80 minutes. Four minutes of added injury time seemed like a lifetime but Keighley hung on and in the end it was dropped goals that made all the difference!

From the previous 19 games this season Keighley had one drop goal to show. At Barrow they kicked three from seven attempts, with Diabira getting two from two; Davies one from four and unlucky with a shot that hit a post and bounced back into play. Last season Blackpool Borough used the drop goal ploy—scoring 36 in their climb from the Second—and Bak Diabira who steered them to promotion, after Albert Fearnley left, and Frank Davies, unsettled Barrow with these tactics and 'dropping in' produced the shock of the day. This was a tremendous all-round Keighley performance with the forwards shining and Frank Davies, despite receiving an eye cut that needed two stitches having his best game since his £2,500 transfer from Bramley. Pack leader John Mantle had a sound game—what a difference he made to the forwards—and he seems to have held the key to two different Barrow v Keighley results . . . the only man to finish on the winning side both times!

And with that win Keighley have again got a sniff of that 'vulnerable'-looking 4th promotion place in the see-saw race to go up. They are currently 6th with 16 points from 15 games: five points behind Barrow and three points in arrears of 5th spot Dewsbury BUT have two games in hand over both their rivals!

Today's clash with second placed Oldham should have all the tension and excitement of a cup-tie. Oldham not only look odds on to take the road up but would seem destined to stay in the top flight.

Their £30,000 splash to land Adrian Alexander and Bob Mordell from the RU ranks has caught the headlines but their youth policy is paying rich rewards. Two of today's team 18 year-old Ray Ashton and 19 year-old Terry Flanagan will be lining-up for Great Britain against France in the Colts (under 19 on February 1st) International across the Channel on January 27th. And a third Oldham discovery, Paddy Kirwin—not on the team sheet today—is also in the Gt. Britain team. Not surprisingly with more Oldham players in the side than from any other club the Watersheddings 'whiz kids' top the Lancashire Colts League.

24 year-old Alexander is the former Harlequins captain and was in the England squad against the All Blacks. Mordell is a former England RU international, Coach/captain Bill Francis tends to try and fox opponents, deciding in his last minute tactics the position he plays! In the provisional team-sheet he is listed at No. 4 but could turn out at scrum half or another back position.

A win over Oldham and Keighley could really be on the promotion trail.

Remaining League fixtures are—HOME: Bramley (Feb. 3), Batley (March 9), Featherstone (March 30), Doncaster (April 20) and Halifax on a date to be re-arranged. AWAY: Dewsbury (Jan. 27), Rochdale (March 2), Oldham (March 16), Whitehaven (March 23) and Huyton (April 6).

Including today Keighley face 11 more Div. 2 matches with six at home and five away. Dewsbury still have to travel to Halifax and Featherstone and entertain Barrow at home. Barrow still have Oldham to take on at Craven Park.

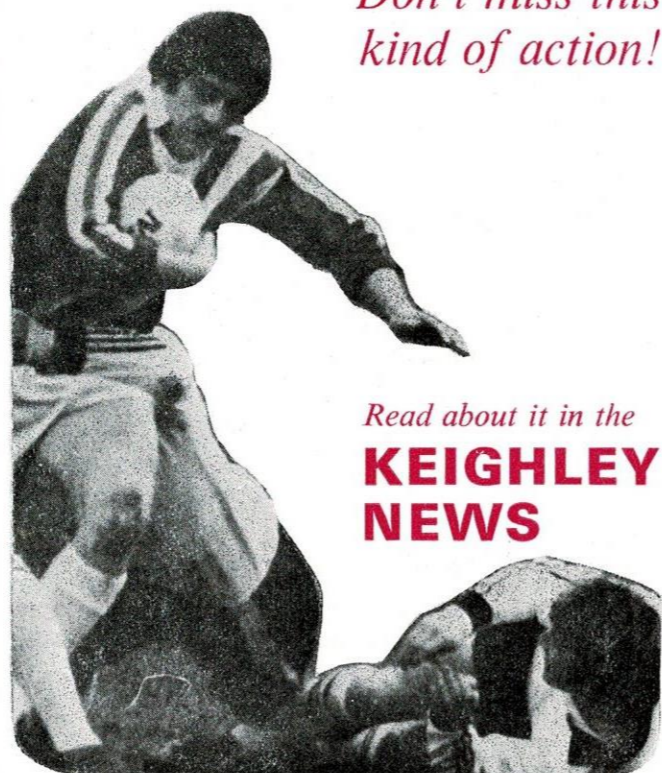

Today's visitors

Today we welcome players, officials and supporters from Oldham who are well-placed for promotion.

Currently second in division two—and with a game in hand over leaders Featherstone Rovers—they must have their eyes on repeating their second-division championship success of 1963-64.

Over recent months Oldham have been building up a strong pack with a lot being expected from recent signings Bob Mordell and Adrian Alexander. Mordell won an England Rugby Union cap, and Alexander was in the England squad for the recent international against New Zealand. He is a former Harlequins skipper and scored a try on his league debut.

Mordell, in particular, has been showing up well in several senior games and appears entirely suited to the professional game. And while Alexander is the more recent of the signings he has given every indication that he is going to become a force as a front-row man, though he operated as a flanker in Rugby Union.

Keighley and Oldham first met in season 1903-04, and Keighley had to wait until 1934-35 until they gained their first win after nine meetings between the clubs. The record has evened out over the years, and each side can claim 13 wins from the 26 games played at Lawkholme Lane. On their own ground Oldham hold the edge with 16 wins and two draws in 24 meetings.

The last meeting at Lawkholme was on October 1st, 1978, when Keighley gained a comfortable 20 pts. to nil win after having lost at Oldham by 15 pts. to 12 pts. just a month earlier. Keighley's points in that big home win came from Kevan Robinson (2), Arthur Waterhouse and John Stephenson (tries) and Graham Beale (four goals).

On and off the field

Despite much press and radio publicity Keighley RLFC again send apologies to Keighley and Halifax spectators for the 10 minute before scheduled start call off of the Keighley v Halifax match on December 30th. Keighley RLFC have made an official protest to the Rugby League mainly on the grounds that Halifax 'didn't want to play'. The turnstiles opened at 2.00 p.m. after referee Peter Massey had declared the ground playable: unfit talk only started after Halifax officials arrived around 2.45 p.m. A new date has still to be fixed for this 'local derby'. Keighley had hoped it could be slotted in on the vacant Sunday of January 20th but Halifax have already arranged to play Oldham on that date.

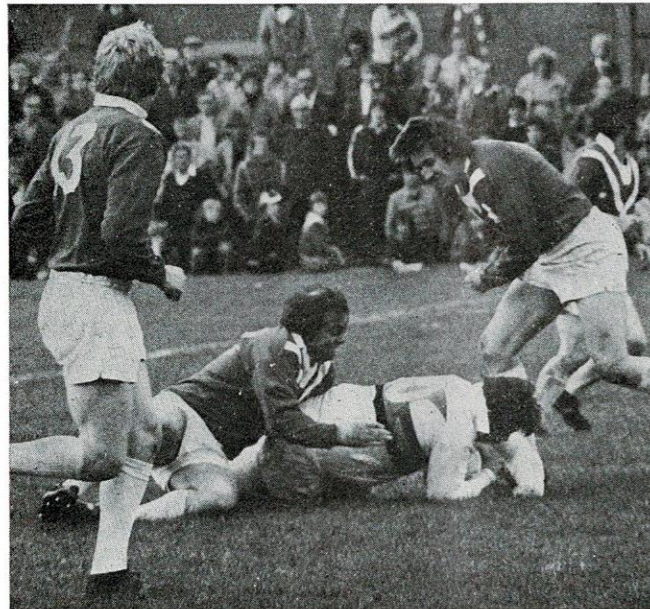

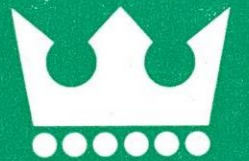

Keighley have a 'plum' home tie against First Division Castleford in the 1st round of the State Express Challenge Cup on Sunday, February 10th. And what a thriller that promises to be! Despite the topsy-turvy League form Keighley have risen to the occasion in the sudden death atmosphere of cup ties this season. 48 hours after the Barrow hammering they knocked Dewsbury out of the 'Floodlit' and were the only 2nd Division side to reach the 2nd round of the BBC Competition. And when Bradford Northern were sipping the John Player Trophy win celebratory champagne last weekend—and congratulations to our near neighbours on their fine victory—a few must have given a fleeting thought

to the scare Keighley gave them in the second round when even Northern had to admit they were a shade lucky to win 15-9.

Castleford aren't having the best of seasons and are only two points clear of the bottom four in Division One, having won 6, lost 9 and drawn 1 of their 16 games in the League.

If Keighley come good they could be on the Cup trail . . . bringing back memories of 1976 when they got so near to Wembley, going out to St. Helens in the semi-final. Castleford figure in the Keighley record books. It was against Cas that Keighley recorded their highest ever score . . . 67 points in 1906. 7-6 would do on February 10th!
