Fans in and around Leigh are still talking about that last minute try by Oldham full back Martin Murphy in the Slalom Lager 1st Division Fixture at Watersheddings in October because that try proved to be the match winner as far as Oldham were concerned and two valuable league points were obtained.

Unfortunately for the Oldham fans there has not been a great deal more to cheer about this season although it can be said that only a one point deficit stopped Oldham from entering the Semi finals of the Three Fives Challenge Cup Competition when they lost 6-5 to St. Helens two weeks ago.

It very much seems that Oldham are doomed to relegation and that would be a pity because they have only just been promoted after an excellent season in the 2nd Division last term.

I am sure it will not be the end of the world if Oldham do drop into Division Two because they have some outstanding young players who would surely benefit from a lower grade of football. Players like Terry Flanagan who is one of Rugby League's brightest prospects having already gained International honours at only 20 years of age. Also his former Saddleworth colleague scrum half Paddy Kirwen who has recently been turning in some excellent performances in the first team, and second row forward Alan Platt who at only 19 years of age is a natural footballer and will obviously be a big name in the game in the not too distant future.

Ironically enough these three youngsters could all have joined Leigh. All three were spoken to and in one case actual terms were offered but in the end they signed for the Watersheddings Club who would seem to have three future Tourists.

The Oldham personnel has changed a great deal in recent years but one player who has remained loyal to Oldham throughout his professional career is the player who we referred to at the start of these notes—Full back Martin Murphy.

Martin was picked up by the former Chairman of Oldham, now a great worker with Saddleworth Rangers, Ken Fisher who along with the then Secretary of Oldham and now Secretary-General Manager at "Hilton Park" John Stringer who were at the Leigh Miners ground watching the Leigh Open age Amateur side take on the Widnes Town team. One recalls that John Cooke who later turned professional with Swinton was the one the deputation had particularly gone to watch but it was the dash of the teenage red head Murphy who caught the eye.

Martin signed after three trial games and as we have just said has been a fine and loyal professional. At the time of this signing Martin lived in the XII Apostles Club in Nel Pan Lane but moved to live in the Oldham area some years later. He made his debut against Leigh but could not have had such a hectic baptism as he was carried off on a stretcher after a skirmish with the Leigh full back at the time Colin Tyrer.

Murphy recently broke the all time record for Oldham appearances and that certainly proves just what a loyal player he has been.

Phil Larder was another good Oldham servant who recently joined Whitehaven after completing ten years with the Oldham Club. Phil still resides in the Oldham area owning a Sports Shop in Saddleworth.

Earlier we referred to Alan Platt who of course is part of the famous Platt Rugby playing family with his father Don a fine player on his day with Leigh, Wigan, Oldham and Batley and brother Maurice who had some good days at Leigh before moving on to Wigan. Alan still lives in Gordon Street, Leigh—almost back to back with the "Hilton Park" ground.

Martin Murphy of course was a Leigh lad and another local who is making good at Oldham is youngster Gareth Owen who of course is the son of the great Stan Owen. I know that Stan and Joan (Mrs. Owen) were delighted recently when Gareth was selected to play for Wales in France. It was an honour very much deserved. Another son of yet another Great forward is Oldham prop forward Stephen Herbert. Stephen is the son of that Great Britain forward of the early sixties Norman Herbert. Stephen, together with the Leigh lads at Oldham will be all out to give a good account of themselves this afternoon in what for them is a "local derby."

Against Hull Kingston Rovers the Leigh lads began where they had left off throwing the ball around in fine style and building up a very useful nine point lead.

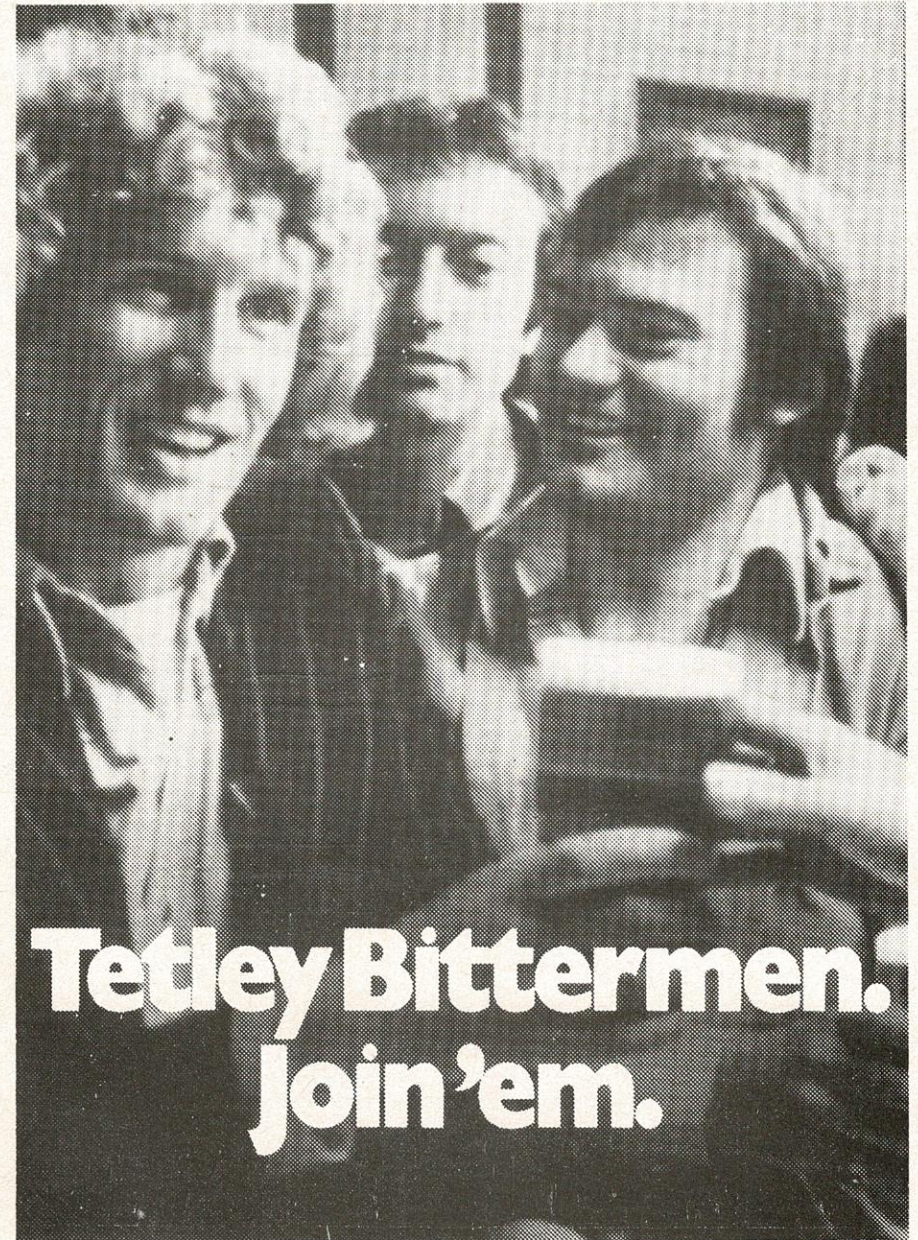

You can't see him but he is there—Referee Gerry Kershaw indicates Leighs opening try to prop forward Alf Wilkinson.

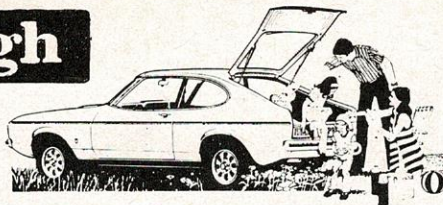
