





#### PRESIDENT'S PAGE

Even though we went down to what must be considered a heavy defeat at the hands of Hull K.R. last Sunday, there were aspects of the game which gave me encouragement for the future. Even though we suffered from lack of the ball from the set scrums, which in itself is a handicap against a powerful team like our visitors were, our boys stuck manfully to their task, had they not done so, I feel the visitors could have run in a "cricket score." That we didn't manage to score a try was a disappointment, but in the first quarter when we did most of the pressing and spent most of the time inside the visitors twenty-five, only a lack of final penetration kept us from registering at least one try. Had we shown the necessary penetrative power in that early period, then the game might have taken on a different form.

One thing is obvious, if we are to make any impact in the 2nd Division this season, then our team needs strengthening and to achieve that is not by any means an easy task. Our financial resources are of necessity limited, but we continue to look out for promising young players and for more experienced players from other clubs, securing the services of John Patterson on a months loan from Oldham was one move in that direction, we are negotiating with Wakefield for the loan of centre David Needham and utility back Adrian Plummer and hope to have these two available very shortly, in fact negotiations could have been completed by the time this article is in print.

Drawn to my attention recently, is the way the press make a big thing about the so called handicaps some clubs suffer through injuries, yet the serious and long lasting injuries which we have suffered in the last year or two get scant attention. The fact that we've a player with a broken neck, two who've had broken ankles and one who is having a cartilage operation, whilst we've two players just returning after being out since last mid season with broken legs, seems to hardly have a mention. I do wish the press in West Yorkshire would give fair coverage to all the clubs and not just to a few who they seem to favour.

This afternoon I extend a warm and cordial welcome to Officials, Players and Supporters of the Oldham Club who are leading the Second Division at the moment.

#### OLDHAM PLAYING PERSONNEL

The Team Manager of the visiting side is Frank Myler a former well known centre or stand off half, who gave eleven years of fine service to Widnes and then went on to give excellent service to St. Helens. He made many appearances with international sides including the honour of leading a Great Britain side in Australia. His Assistant Team Manager is Peter Smethurst who though he was never recognised internationally, had a long and distinguished playing career with Swinton, Oldham, Leigh and Wigan, first as a centre, then as a forward.

Full back for our visitors is most likely to be Martin Murphy who is in his fourteenth season with our visitors and had a well deserved testimonial in 1977. A stylish type of full back, Martin signed from junior club Astley Colliery all those years ago. Probable winger is Brian Caffrey a product of local Amateur R.L. and only twenty-two years of age, a likely centre is Ashley McEwan a New Zealander who was previously with Blackpool as an amateur, the second centre berth is almost certain to be filled by Mick Parrish a Yorkshireman who was signed as a professional from Morley R.U. by Hunslet and then went to our visitors for a large fee. Mick kicked ninety-five goals last season and I reckon has forty-five already this season, he is one of only six players in the history of the game to have played and scored in every match for his club in a season, for Hunslet in 1979/80. Who will fill the second wing berth seems uncertain, though Geoff Munro a product of the "B" team who scored twenty-six tries in 1979/80 is I understand now fit again after a long absence through injury. Phil Ward former Loughborough College R.U., Salford and Bradford Northern who plays centre and wing is I understand unavailable owing to injury, but there is Alan Taylor something of a "utility back who was signed from Swinton and I suspect before that was with Wigan who signed him from Widnes R.U. Then at stand off half we are likely to have Ray Ashton I think a product of the Oldham Colts who is I think already an Under Twenty-Four International, whilst at scrum half Paddy Kirwan a twenty year old of considerable promise who I think was also a product of the Colts side.

Open side prop is very likely to be Adrian Alexander a former Harlequins R.U. captain, six feet three inches, sixteen stones and in his middle twenties. Hooker Roger O'Mahoney is I think another local product and has plenty of experience, likely blind side prop is another Yorkshireman, he is Billy Harris formerly of Featherstone Rovers and York, a candidate for a second row berth could be Andy Goodway whom Oldham recruited from Amateur R.L. in Castleford, Mike Worrall another back three candidate is from the Warrington area, then there's Dave Nicholson, who Oldham signed from Swinton same time as Taylor and at loose forward Terry Flanagan another Colts product who is already an Under Twenty-Four International, is the Oldham skipper and was in a full international squad last season. Two more possibilities are, Gareth Owen with a Welsh name but I think was born in Lancashire and a prop forward, Denis O'Neill, a Widnes man, signed for Widnes in 1966, but signed by Oldham from Whitehaven, has appeared for Great Britain in the past.

#### SOME FACTS ABOUT OLDHAM

Oldham were of course one of the clubs relegated from the First Division last season, but already this season they are making a strong challenge to regain that First Division status, having lost only one of the eight Second Division games they have played to date. They are also in the Second Round of the John Player Trophy, having accounted for Doncaster at the Watersheddings without much difficulty last Sunday. The Club was founded in 1876 and became a founder member also of the Northern Union, the forerunner of the present Rugby Football League. According to my information, they played their first game on their present ground at the Watersheddings on September 28th 1889, when they entertained Swinton.

They have taken part in the R.L. Challenge Cup Final seven times and won it three times, but everyone of these Challenge Cup Final appearances was before the Final went to Wembley, that honour still eludes them. They have been in eight Championship Finals and won three times, the last appearance was in 1956/57 season, when they beat Hull by the narrow margin of fifteen points to fourteen points. In their side in those days were, Bernard Ganley, Dick Cracknell, Alan Davies, John Etty, Frank Pitchford, Don Vines, Charlie Winslade, Syd Little and Derek Turner. I reckon they have won the Lancashire Cup nine times and been Runners-Up about seven times.

#### FLASH BACK

Looking back at the last sixteen games between Dewsbury and Oldham, and that means going back to 1970/71 season, I see that during most of the 1970's we won regularly at Oldham. We beat them at the Watersheddings in 1970/71, 1972/73, 1973/74, 1975/76 (Second Round Floodlit Trophy), 1976/77 (First Round Challenge Cup). Not until 1979/80 season did Oldham gain the ascendary over us, that season, they beat us three times, at home, away and again at home in the First Round R.L. Challenge Cup.

Altogether, in the sixteen games dealt with, we had seven wins, five of which were at Oldham, we lost eight times, five of these were at Crown Flatt and there was one drawn game. Today, Oldham will be looking for a Second Division "double", they beat us at Oldham on 13th September, by nineteen points to five points. The teams that day were: Oldham—Taylor; Ward, McEwan, Parrish, Caffrey; Ashton, Kirwan; Owen, O'Mahoney, Harris, Worrall, Nicholson, Flanagan; Subs. Goodway, Herbert. Dewsbury—Richardson; Squires, Collins, S. Brunt, J. Wood; Lowe, Jennings; Briggs, Dufton, Mason, Long, Gant, Craven; Subs. Lee, Broadhead.

#### REFEREES WANTED

The Honorary Secretary of the Heavy Woollen Amateur Rugby League, Mr. Bill Barker, tells me that there is a shortage of trained referees in the district and with the growth of Amateur Rugby League in the past year or two, the shortage has become rather acute. It amounts to the fact, that many juniors these days are having to play in games without the assistance of a trained referee, which is a great pity, because every game should have a proper referee to see that the Laws of the Game are observed and interpreted in the right way and that discipline is maintained. The junior players of today are the potential professionals of tomorrow, if they do not have the advantage of a trained referee, in their formative years, then their potential could suffer as a result.

Therefore, the call is, for people to come forward and show an interest in becoming referees. Who knows, once you get started and make progress, you could be following in the footsteps of such illustrious predecessors from this district, as Alfred Hill, Alfred Howgate, Albert Durkin, Derek Brown, George Wilson and present day Kevin Allatt amongst many others. Anyone who is interested in taking up refereeing, can go along to one of the meetings of the Dewsbury and Batley Referees Society, which are held on the second Wednesday of each month at 7.30 p.m. at the Savile Town W. 




