Personally Speaking

CHARLTON Athletic's decision to apply for admission to the Rugby League has sparked off considerable discussion among officials, players and fans.

This move has come at a time when Cardiff City boss David Watkins has firmly denied that his club are in danger of folding.

There has also been the problems at Fulham where a severe injury crisis finally caught up with them and forced them to call off a fixture against League champions Bradford Northern.

Fulham have been hit by a remarkable number of injuries throughout the season and with the Soccer club doing well there does not seem to be the cash available for team strengthening.

I sense a strong feeling of disappointment in this respect by player-coach Reg Bowden when he says: 'It will not be the players' fault if the club is relegated.'

After that wonderful promotion winning first season is it now a case of Soccer rules at Craven Cottage at the expense of Rugby League?

If so it is a surprising attitude because despite their push for promotion the Soccer clubs are not pulling in all that many fans.

But while we are entitled to feel concerned at Fulham's present situation we have Carlisle poised to step into the First Division.

We have to congratulate Carlisle on succeeding at the first attempt but in the light of present events hold back on our judgement until they have experienced a season in the First Division.

The gap between the two divisions is so great that clubs like Oldham, Carlisle and Workington Town realise that winning promotion is only part of the job.

It is finding the players and the cash to survive that is so important, particularly when there is so little breathing space between the seasons.

It is not surprising that a lot of questions have still to be asked and answered about Charlton's prospects if they were to get the go-ahead.

One school of thought is that once we reject one club's application we might be felt to be slamming the door forever on the chance to continue expanding.

Tom Graine must have had some strong words to say to "The Lions" at the interval, as they came out and scored more points than Oldham in the second half. However, despite a good try by Les Bolton, easily Swinton's best forward, Oldham held out to win fairly comfortably.

Swinton were hampered by injuries to Alan Grice and Dennis Ashcroft and this made their task all the more difficult. One interesting fact emerging from the substitutions was that Kevin O'Loughlin, that most loyal and dedicated player, finished the game playing in the blind-side prop position. Such is Kevin's versatility, he now only needs spells at scrum half, open-side prop and hooker, to complete a "full set" for the first team!

LEEDS & WIDNES—TROPHY SPECIALISTS

SATURDAY's State Express Rugby League Challenge Cup Semi-final at Swinton brings together the two most successful trophy-hunting clubs of modern times. Leeds are aiming to make it 16 successive seasons in which they have won at least one trophy. Starting from 1966-67 when they won the old League Leaders and Yorkshire League titles, their run of success has brought them an amazing 26 trophies—just twice as many as Widnes since then. Included in this are 21 Finals in which Leeds were beaten only four times.

In the same period, Widnes have appeared in even more Finals (winning 12 of 22) although their first in this era did not come until 1971-72. Widnes's appearance in last September's Lancashire Cup Final extended their sequence of Final appearances to 11 successive seasons.

Leeds are still hoping to make this the 15th successive season in which they have reached a Final.

The only time the two clubs have clashed in a Final was at Wembley in 1977 when Leeds beat Widnes 16-7.
