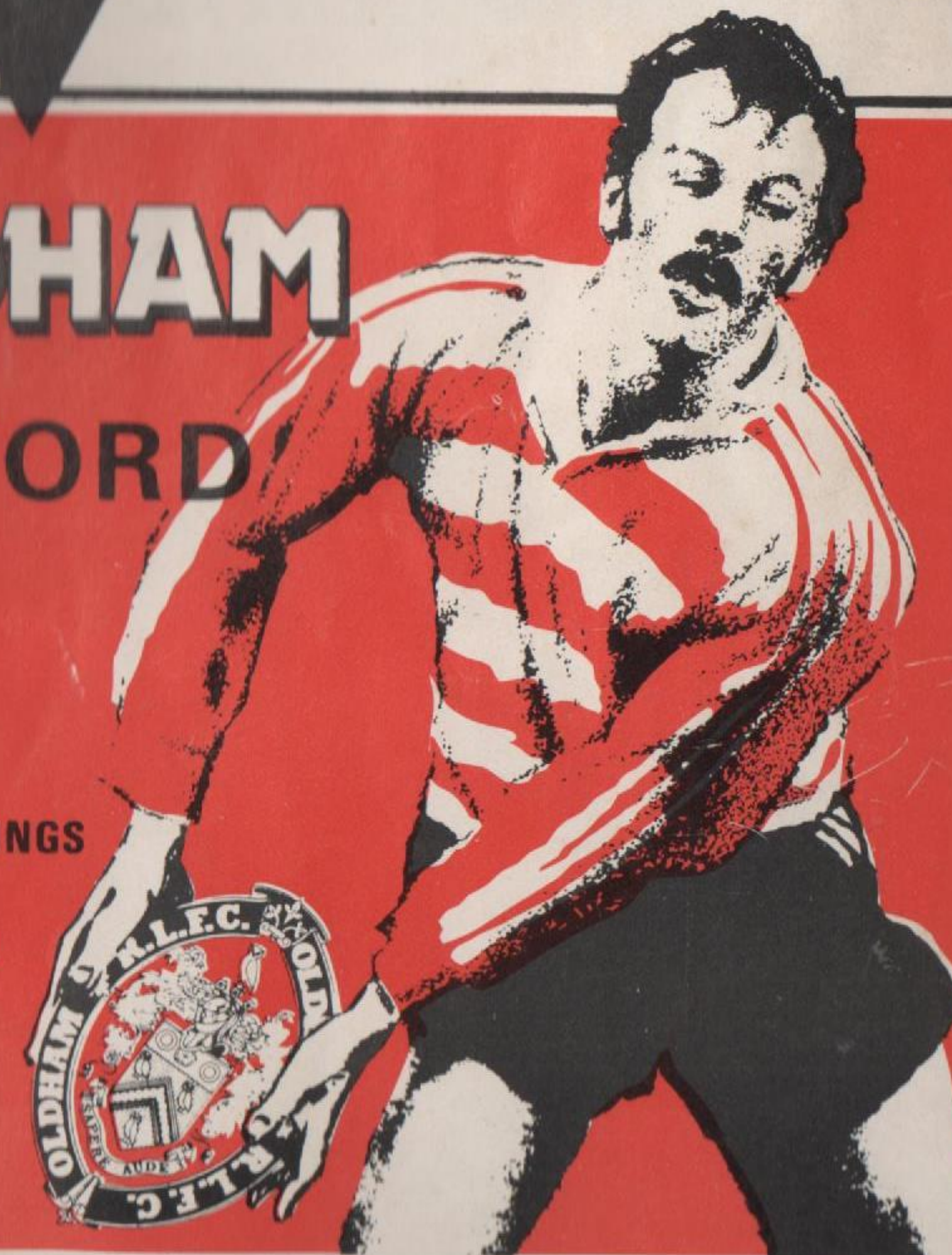

WATERSHEDDINGS SURVEY

WE take the opportunity today of introducing to spectators our new club secretary, John Clark, who took over his duties at Watersheddings last week.

John, aged 39, lives in Leigh at present but he was born and brought up in Newton-le-Willows and, for most of his youth, was a keen St. Helens supporter.

He was only 15 years old when he passed his referee's examinations and, for several seasons, he was a grade five official, refereeing "A" team and amateur games and running the line at professional matches.

He actually applied for the post of secretary at Watersheddings when we advertised it a year ago but at that time it was decided to appoint one of our own committeemen, Paul Lovett.

Paul, one of the few club officials to be a committeeman and secretary at the same time, has done an excellent job in the season now coming towards its close but finds that he cannot continue because his wife, Reta, is expecting another child and he can no longer combine the full-time duties of secretary with his business interests.

The secretary's job entails many hours of work in addition to normal office hours and though Paul would love to continue, he cannot possibly fit it in.

We would like to place on record our appreciation of the job Paul has done over the past nine or ten months and, with that, combine a welcome to John Clark who will soon be getting around the club and getting to know you all.

He comes to Oldham as a keen Rugby League man who is excited about the prospects of getting into the game in an administrative capacity and we wish him a long and happy stay here.

Today's game is our last at home for several weeks. In fact, we will not play here again until the very last day of the season when Workington Town are the visitors on Sunday, May 9th.

The period between now and then will be a crucial one in the Second Division title battle because we play six consecutive away games at Rochdale (next Thursday), Huyton, Carlisle, Bramley, Doncaster and Hunslet before we round things off against the Cumbrians here.

We play Rochdale on Thursday (the match having been brought forward from Friday), Huyton on Sunday, and Carlisle the following Sunday.

It goes without saying that this could be the "big one" because the fact is that if we win all our games between now and the end of the season the title will be ours no matter what Carlisle do. That is, of course, always providing we beat Blackpool and Swinton in the build-up to the holiday games.

The players will need all the support they can get at Brunton Park, on our first visit there, and there is no doubt that the supporters can play a big part in helping us to victory against the side that have rivalled us for top spot since they came down here and beat us in November.

After the Carlisle game we go to Bramley on the following Wednesday, followed by a visit to Doncaster on Monday, May 3rd – two days after the Wembley final – before a trip to Hunslet on May 6th followed by the Workington home match on May 9th.

It will be a hectic run-in to the title bid and it should be a few weeks of great interest and excitement as the nine-month battle, covering 32 matches, reaches its climax.

The next six matches will be crucial and the players will be glad of your support and encouragement.

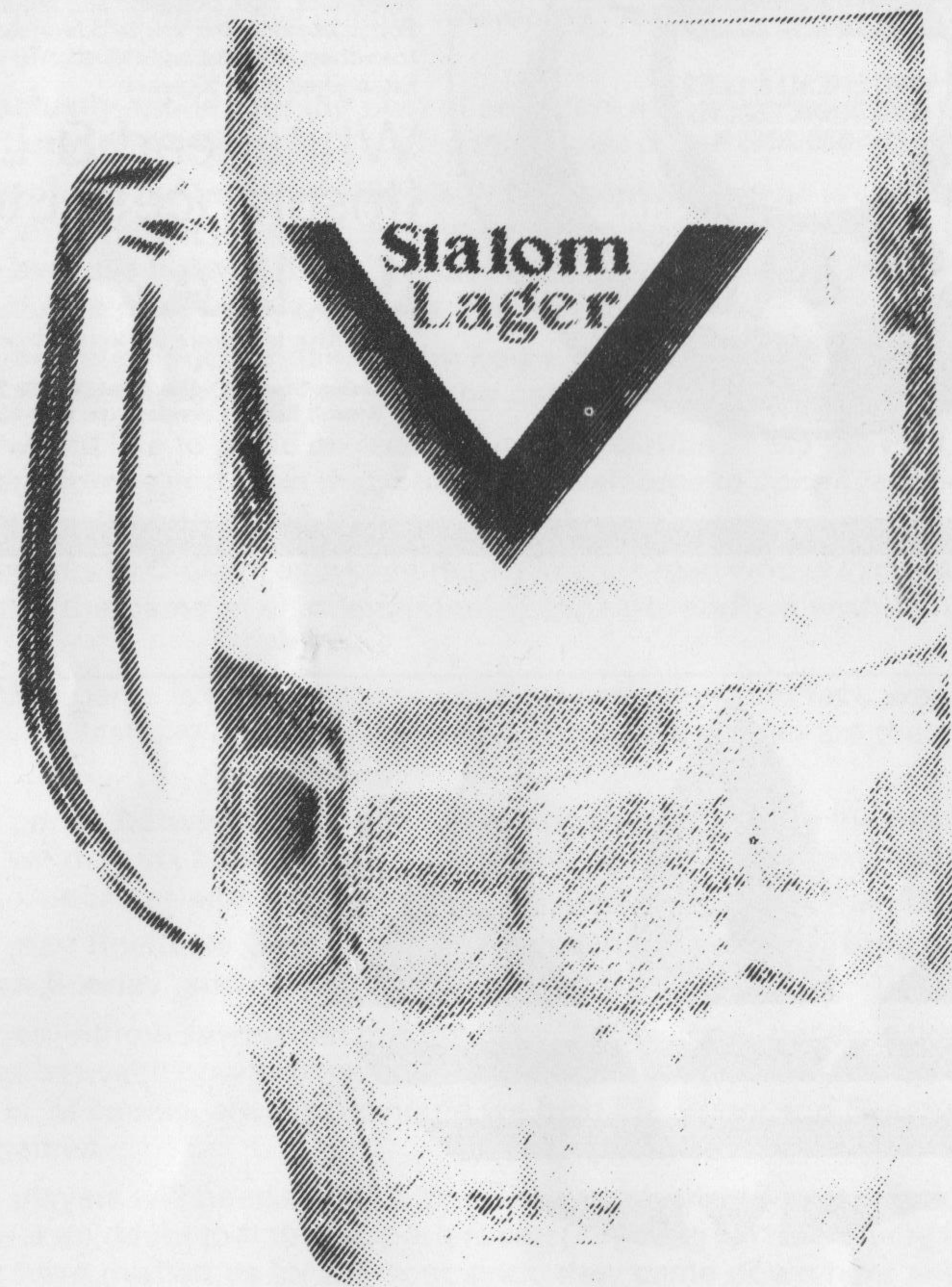

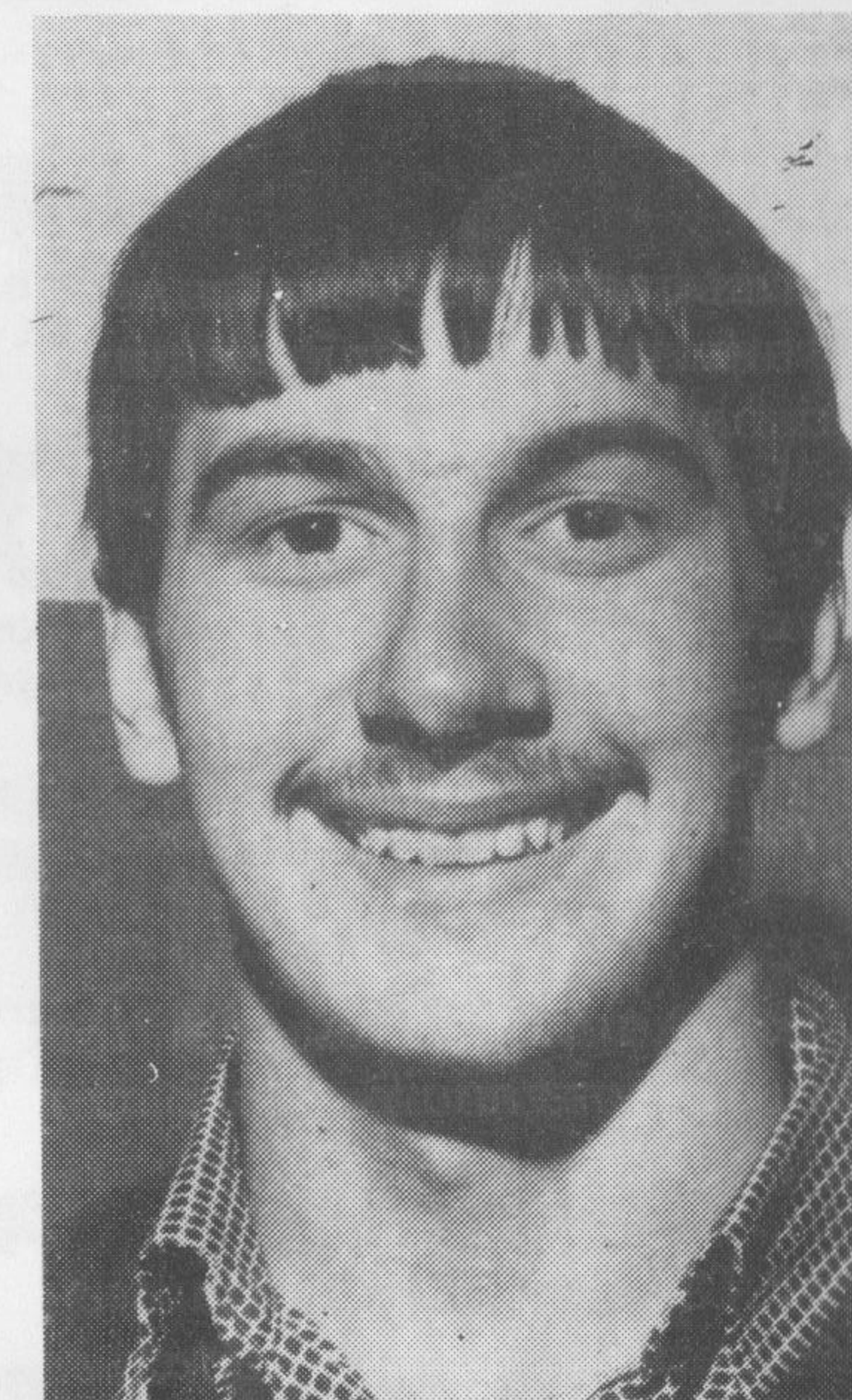

THE RED DEVILS ARE HERE

THOUGH Salford, today's visitors to Watersheddings, have had a disappointing season in the Second Division they will probably still be in with a shout of promotion and needing the points badly from today's game.

Like Rochdale, who were here on Friday, Salford currently have a caretaker coaching set-up operating behind the scenes at the Willows.

Coach Kevin Ashcroft quit to take over at Warrington on March 5th and the club are currently in the throes of advertising the vacancy in a bid to appoint a successor in readiness for next season.

The closing date for applications to be received is April 15th and, in the meantime, the job is being performed by Alan McInnes with assistance from Mike Coulman and Les Bettinson.

Salford have been busy in the transfer market this season and they hit the headlines when they sold Great Britain under-24 centre David Stephenson to big-spending Wigan for a cool £60,000.

Centre or full back Colin Whitfield also went to Wigan, in exchange for backs Trevor Stockley and Roy Heaney.

Also signed at the Willows this season was back-row forward Steve Dickens from Keighley, who cost about £11,000.

Injuries have not helped the Red Devils in their bid to win promotion at the first attempt, stand-off and schemer Bill Francis having been forced to miss much of the season because of a shoulder injury.

Full back Steve Rule was involved with Lyn Hopkins of Workington in a neck-and-neck race for most goals in the season but then he was out with a knee injury and Hopkins built steadily upon his lead.

Hopefully, Rule will be back in action over the Easter holiday period when Salford will be bidding for maximum points in the hope of clinching that fourth place.

At the time of writing Carlisle, Oldham and Workington looked certain to go up with the fourth place still open and Salford, Hunslet, Halifax and Cardiff very much in contention.

Salford are blessed with many big names of Rugby League and they do not come any bigger than Steve Nash, the Great Britain scrum-half and a player who is generally recognised as one of the finest half-backs of the last decade.

Keith Fielding and Maurice Richards, on the wings, need no introduction while Salford can boast two strong and mobile props in Mike Coulman and Malcolm Yates.

Coulman has destroyed Oldham's defence time and again over the years while Yates has come into his own as a prolific try scorer in the past few weeks.

At the time of writing he had scored 16 tries, having scored a couple at Workington, and he and Carlisle's Mick Morgan were bidding to overtake the record of tries in a season from a prop-forward, currently held by Colin Forsyth of Bradford and Trevor Walker of Batley.

There is every chance that Yates, if not Morgan, will have broken the record of 17 tries by now and there is no doubt that the former Leigh prop will be anxious to add to his tally today.

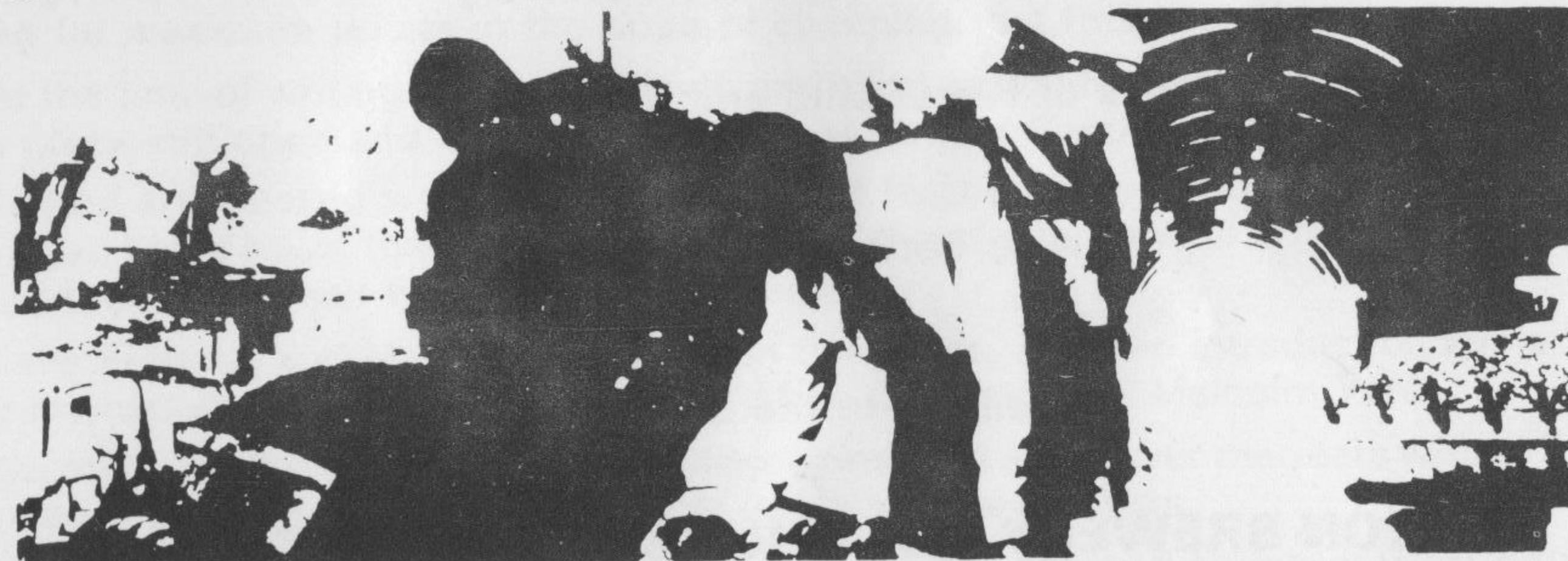

AUSSIE TOUR

AUSTRALIA'S strengths and weaknesses will surely not take long to be revealed judging by the demanding start to their tour of this country next autumn.

But this exceptionally tough opening is by special request as well as the tight schedule.

Certainly it looks the sort of challenge that would be beyond a British party judging by our present standards.

If the Aussies do not get their build up right they could run into trouble with the results especially if they sustain an early crop of injuries.

To tackle Hull KR, Wigan and Barrow within six days is a tall order and the run in to the First Test is pretty fierce.

After taking on St. Helens and Leeds they go to Cardiff's Ninian Park for a "fourth" international against Wales who took them so close last time.

This is certainly a flying start to the 15-match trip and we all know of course that what really counts in their eyes is the Test series and retaining the Ashes.

It is good to see that the League's boom area of Humberside is rewarded with two club games and a Test encounter.

The Kangaroos go to Fulham by special request and even though the Londoners may be in the Second Division a fair crowd is anticipated.

With Carlisle tipped to get the tourists game against Cumbria we will have the tourists playing on four Soccer grounds.

There is every chance that the First Test will be at Boothferry Park after that successful turn up for the Kiwis game two years ago.

Tour itinerary: October 10th, Hull KR; 13th, Wigan; 15th, Barrow, 17th, St. Helens; 20th, Leeds; 24th Wales; 30th First Test at Hull.

November: 3rd, Leigh; 7th, Bradford; 9th, Cumbria; 14th, Second Test at Wigan; 17th, Hull; 21st, Fulham; 23rd, Widnes; 27th, Third Test at Leeds.

MORE OF SALFORD'S HISTORY

SIR LEES KNOWLES opened the new grand stand at Salford on November 28th, 1891, when the club played at New Barns which is now part of the Manchester Docks area. He said that "Rugby Football is the only absolutely masculine game in the country". He added that 'hacking, tripping and scragging had been eliminated from the play and the game was no longer a dangerous past-time.'

In 1896 at the start of the second season of the Northern Union, Salford, probably influenced by Swinton's decision to switch codes, joined the new body. Among the players making the changeover were Barrington, Bedford, Braithwaite, Blake, W. Brown, Coleman, Doran, Fawcett, Fisher, Harter, Haslam, Hanson, Hildebrand, Jones, Jordan, Lyons, Manwaring, Moss, Treakston, Walsh, Whitmore, Wild, Woodhead and Vipond. Sir Lees Knowles remained as club president.

In 1900 Salford met Swinton in the challenge cup final at Fallowfield, losing by 16-8. The Reds team was Smith; Pearson, T. Williams, captain, Harter, Hadwin; Grey, Griffiths; Rhapps, J. Williams, Gledhill, Tunney, Shaw, Shore, Fisher and Brown.

In 1901-02 Salford were second in the Northern Rugby League and reached the final of the challenge cup but Broughton Rangers won both league and cup. This time the Salford line up was Smith; Bone, T. Williams, Davies, Price; Lomas, Griffiths; Rhapps, Buckler, Tunney, Heath, Shaw, Brown, Gledhill and J. Williams. Lomas was Jimmy Lomas who later joined Oldham.

It was in this period that Salford moved to the Willows. A company was set up to raise the necessary capital and a number of directors were obtained before the move. It was planned to have a stadium covering many sports and branches of athletics.

Salford were runners up in the league for three successive seasons, 1901-02, 1902-03 and 1903-04, and were again beaten in the cup final in 1902-03. The team on this occasion was Smith; Norris, Messer, Lomas, Bell; Hater, Griffiths; J. Williams, Rhapps, Tunney, Heat, Brown, Buckler, Shaw and Shore. In the league Salford and Bradford tied at the top in 1903-04 and in the play off Bradford won by five points to nil.

In 1905-06 Bradford again floored Salford by 5-0, this time in the cup final. Cochrane; McWhirter, W. Thomas, Lomas, Hampson; John, Preston; Rhapps, E. J. Thomas, Rees, Brow, Spencer, Warwick, Lewis and Foter formed the line up on this occasion.

Several players were honoured by gaining county caps for Lancashire including, Smith, Tunney, Rhapps, Heath, T. Williams, B. Griffiths, J. Williams, Hoskins, Hadwin, Lomas, Buckler and Rees. Some of them qualified by having been born in Lancashire and others by nature of residential qualifications.

In 1911-12 the Reds finished 20th in the final table out of 27 clubs. In 1912-13 the club shared the sixth and seventh places with Broughton Rangers. However in 1913-14 the club finished second to Huddersfield. In the top four play-off Wigan were beating at the Willows by 16-5 and in the final Salford defeated the powerful Huddersfield side at Headingley by 5-3. Only Willie Thomas, John, E. J. Thomas and Rees of the 1906 squad played in this final.

At the time of winning the championship the Salford club was in grave financial difficulties and the club was in the hands of the receiver. A great effort led by the Mayor of Salford helped the club back to a firm basis. The club has survived many vicissitudes and the present slump in their affairs will be followed by a great revival.

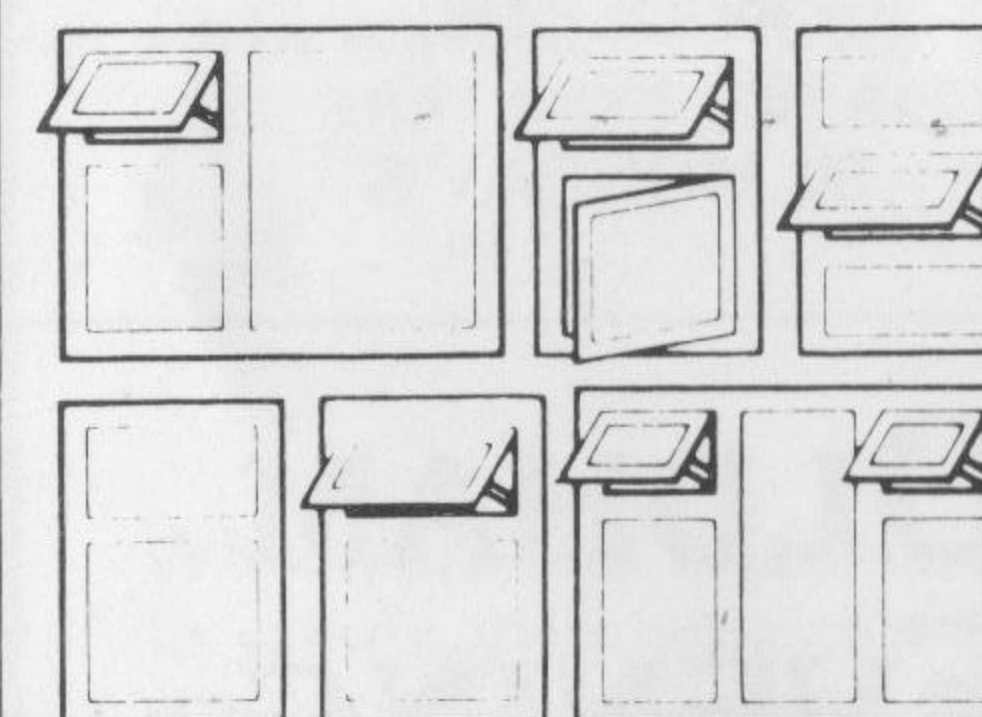

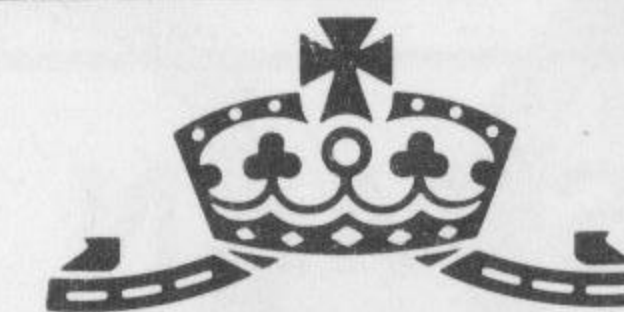
