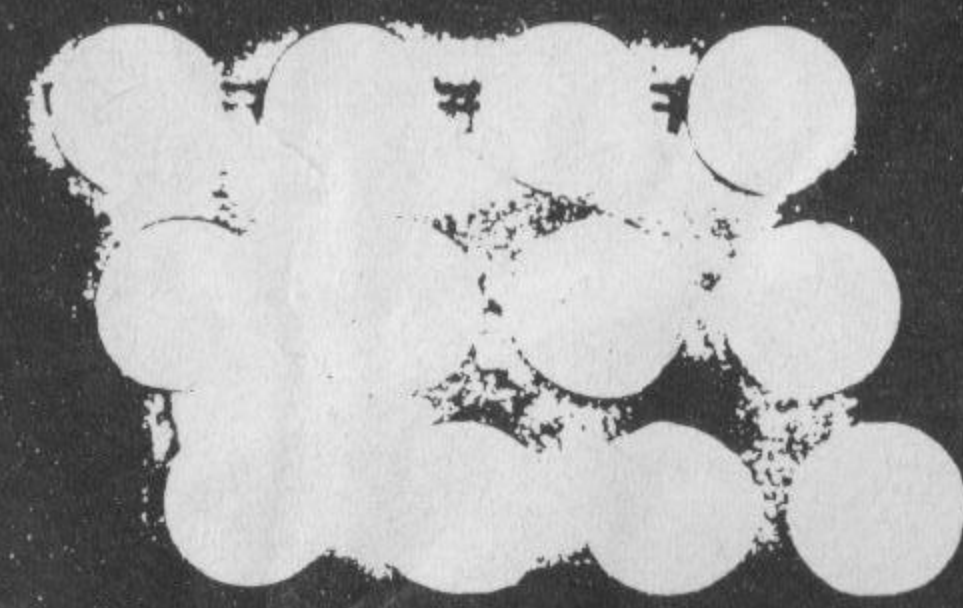

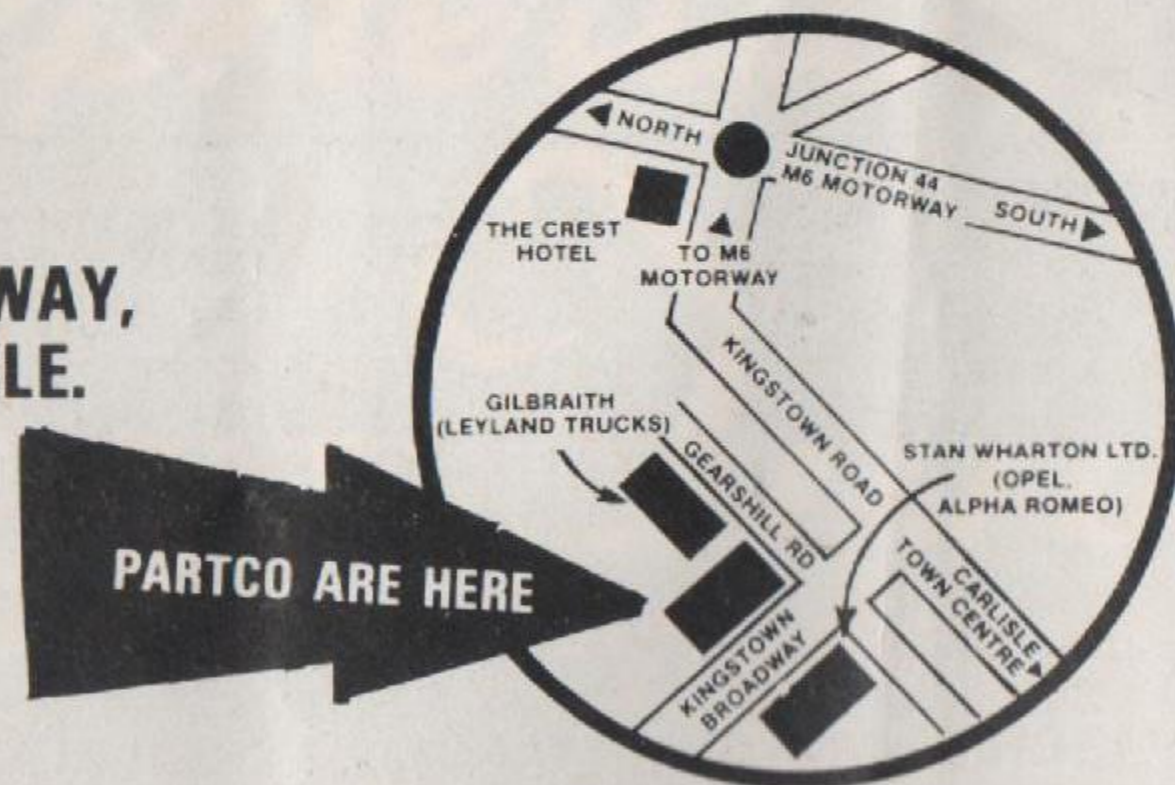

Today's crucial match with Oldham which could well decide the Second Division Championship, is to be preceded by a "curtain raiser" with the Dalston under 17's and the Derwent Park Rangers under 17 teams playing a 15 minutes each way match.

The K.O. is timed for 2.15 p.m. and should make a good appetiser for the "big one" to follow.

I learn that the Huyton club have suffered a severe blow with the news that their sponsors have gone into liquidation. I suppose it is a sign of the times when the backers of financially hard-pressed clubs, themselves go "into the Red".

Mick Morgan, not content with having broken the existing world record for tries in a season by a "prop", seems bent on creating a new one which is unassailable. At the time of writing these notes Mick's tally stands at 22. A formidable figure.

Incidentally, Mick's absence from the Carlisle side in the Huyton match was his first since joining the club. He injured a knee in the Good Friday match with Cardiff City but recovered in time to take his place in the line-up for the Workington clash.

Our visitors today, Oldham, created a new record in their recent match with Blackpool Borough. They scored a total of 16 tries, the highest this century in one match for the club, beating the previous best of 14 tries created by the Championship winning side of 1956-57.
