



FROM THE EDITOR'S PEN

With the end of the season approaching, and this being our last home programme to be published, it is time to give a vote of thanks to the many helpers who make up the backroom staff of the Hunslet club — to all those too numerous to mention by name, we thank you for your assistance throughout the season and look forward to your help again in the future.

Looking back on the playing side of affairs, the past season was a story of a run of bad injuries which left coach Paul Daley unable to call on Ian Nicholson, Graham King, John Wolford, Francis Jarvis, Roy Appleyard and Bryan Murrell for numerous games. Despite this, we are destined to finish in a creditable position in the league table and up to a few weeks ago were in with a chance of finishing in the fourth promotion place, which in retrospect might have been a season too early. There are some good signs for the future, with young players such as Mick Allan, Dean Booth and Neil Rudd having matured into first-team rugby, and with a few more to follow them, thanks to the production line from Dave Mawson's Colts team. Our 'A' team under KEITH COTTON have had mixed fortunes after leading the Yorkshire Senior Competition table in the early part of the season. The injuries to first team players obviously weakened the reserve team mid-way through the season but they again came back to form in their last few games. The last game played, when they won 41-13 against a Wakefield 'A' team which included six players who had played in First Division rugby this season, produced the best display of open rugby shown by a Hunslet team for a long time. Our Colts team finished in fifth spot in their league table, and centre Chris "Billy" Bowden set up a new club record at Colts level with 28 tries to add to the 5 he scored in the 'A' team.

Looking to the future, you, the supporters, again deserve a medal for patience and endurance, as we end yet another season without a ground of our own. Difficulties experienced in fitting in our fixtures have made us look towards a ground with floodlights for next season's games, especially if the number of fixtures increase if Charlton Athletic's application to join is accepted. An announcment from the directors as to where we will be playing next season is expected at any time. At present negotiations are at a delicate stage and it would be wrong to pass any comment in this editorial except to say that some clubs are more helpful than others.



The four teams due to join the Second Division from the First Division next season (unless the formula is altered) are Whitehaven, York, Fulham and Wakefield Trinity.


So far three teams are assured of promotion: Oldham, Carlisle and Workington Town, with Halifax favourites for the fourth spot.



THE LION RAMPANT AND THE RISE OF THE PHOENIX (A Season-by-Season Review of Hunslet's History)

No. 15 1897 - 98

The Northern Union committee amended the scoring for this season, all goals counting as 2 points and tries 3 points. Hunslet had a very good season, playing 30 winning 22, drawing 4 and losing 4, and in the process scored 327 points against 117. This was in the Yorkshire League, and Hunslet tied for 1st place with Bradford Park Avenue. Therefore, there was a play-off at Leeds to decide the champions, which saw Hunslet losing at half time by 2-0. In the second half there was a slight controversy as to which side was entitled to a punt; the touch judge ruled in Hunslet's favour. Gillings took the kick and from the ensuing scramble Ramage dribbled the ball through, picked up and scored near enough the posts to make Albert Goldthorpe's kick a mere formality. Hunslet thus won by 5 pts. to 2 and the team was:— J. Mitchell; J. W. Wright, A. Goldthorpe, W. Goldthorpe, W. Hannah; H. Robinson, T. Gillings; E. Kaye, O. Walsh, J. Deacon, H. Barraclough, T. C. Young, J. Bowley, T. Leach and J. Ramage.

Hunslet's highest win of the season was at Parkside against Liversedge by 41-0 (Albert scoring 6 goals and 1 try), and the biggest defeat was 7-13 at Morecambe in a friendly.

In the first round of the cup Hunsletwere drawn at home to Lancaster and were victorious by 8-3 but in the second round away at Widnes they lost 7-8

A. Goldthorpe was top scorer for the season with 77 goals and 1 try, 157 pts. Hannah was next with 14 tries, Wright 13, W. Goldthorpe 11, Robinson, Gillings, Ramage and Rubrey 5 each.

New players signed were A. Jowett (ex Durham and Westmoreland county), T. C. Young (of Workington and Cumberland) and J. Ramage (from Galashiels).

All in all, Hunslet played 40 games including friendlies and only lost 7; so it was their most successful season to date.

'Ahr Alberts' 66 goals (the 77 includes friendlies which are not included in official records), was a record for the Northern Union easily beating the previous best, of 35 by G. E. Lorimer of Manningham in 1895/96. It was also a season's points record of 135.

Hannah and Young, both played for Cumberland against Yorkshire at PARKSIDE on the 5th February 1898.

Deacon played in two Yorkshire trials.
