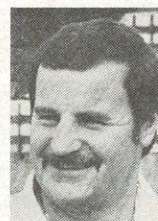

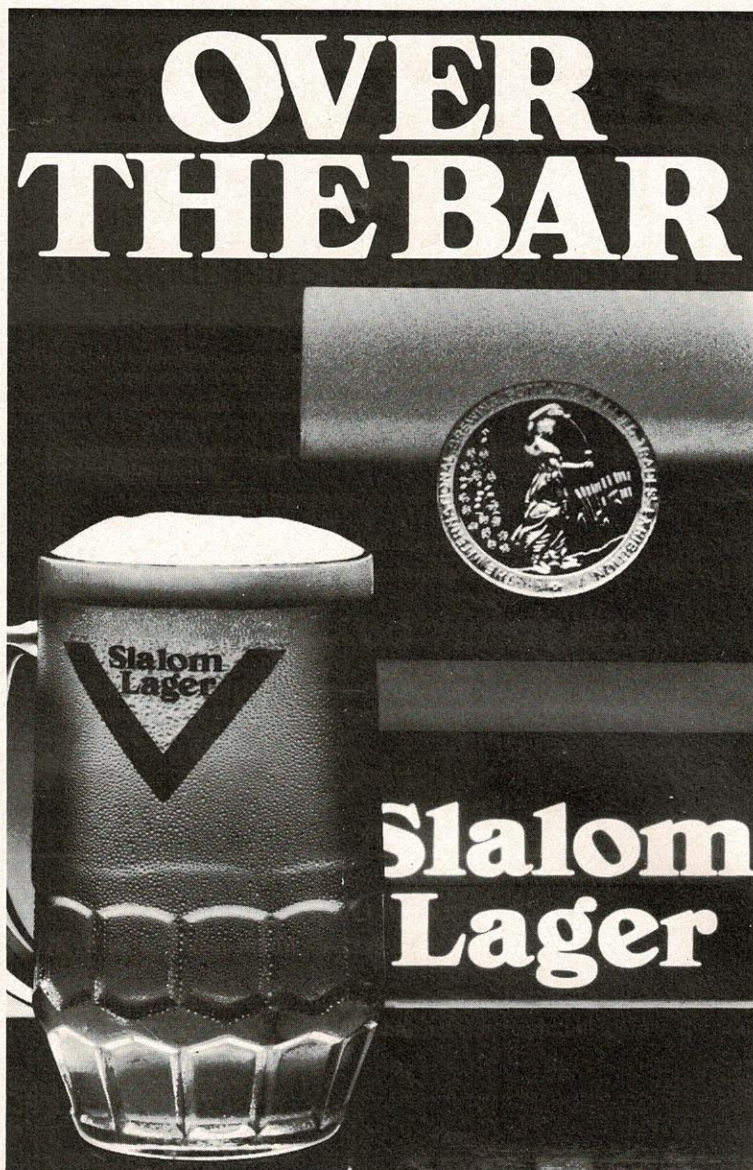

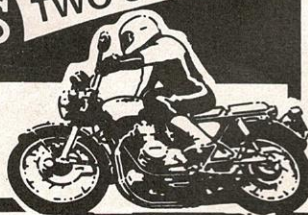

The Wigan Summer Sevens traditionally signals the opening of the new season at Central Park and today Wigan fans will be hoping that their team can recapture the trophy they won for three successive years before losing to eventual winners Wakefield in last year's semi-final.

A Wigan victory in this exciting competition today would really please new Wigan coach Alex Murphy, as this will be the first time Wigan go into action under his leadership.

Yet when all is said and done the Wigan Sevens are meant to be an enjoyable afternoon of fast, open rugby on a relaxed occasion as the lads from eight different clubs taste their first serious workout of the season. Everyone wants to win the trophy, but results are secondary to enjoyment to spectators today.

As our neighbours from Leigh are not with us, Wigan fans will give a big welcome to newcomers Oldham, who gained promotion to the First Division last season after becoming Second Division champions deservedly. Widnes, too have rejoined the competition in place of Workington and, of course, everyone knows the pace and power of the Widnes speed merchants.

Naturally Wakefield will be all out to retain the trophy in front of their former coach Bill Ashurst, who has now joined Alex Murphy as assistant coach at Central Park. But all these clubs face fierce competition from the others. Leeds, last year's runners-up, Salford, Swinton and St. Helens all have runners who can take them to the final and the trophy, so let us hope that the entertainment today reaches its usual standard in this event.

Meanwhile Murphy's arrival has certainly brought an unprecedented surge of enthusiasm among Central Park supporters and season tickets were selling like hot cakes at last Sunday's open day here.

The feeling is that this season could turn out to be Wigan's best for many years and while Alex himself has not promised any miracles, that new-found enthusiasm, coupled with Alex's know-how and the talent of the team, can be a combination for real success.

RULES FOR SEVENS COMPETITIONS

Games will be played under the laws of the Rugby Football League, except:—

- (1) At a kick-off, following a score—the ball shall **NOT** be required to travel 10 yards forward.
- (2) Each side will consist of seven players selected from a team of eight players and any of the selected seven players may be substituted by the eighth player **at any time** during the match—providing the substitution is signalled by the referee.
- (3) The duration of each game shall be seven and a half minutes each way with one minute interval at half time. If, at the end of the game the scores are equal, the teams shall change over and continue to play until one side scores, such side being the winner, ends being changed every seven and a half minutes if necessary.
In extra time there will be no interval.

- (4) The final tie will be played for ten minutes each way with an interval of one minute at half time.
- (5) An independent time keeper will check all times and allow for injury or any other stoppage when so signalled by the Referee. A klaxon indicates the end of each session of play except that if a try has been scored, the scoring side shall be allowed to attempt the conversion.
- (6) The three tackle rule shall apply.

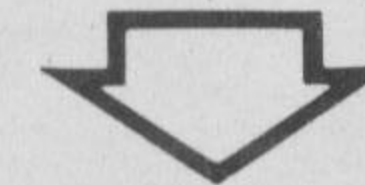
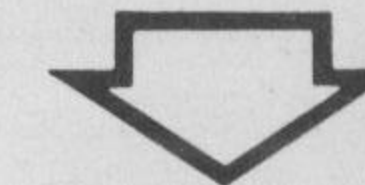
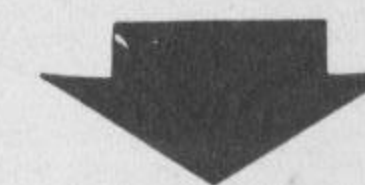
