

RULES FOR SEVENS COMPETITIONS

Games will be played under the laws of the Rugby Football League, except:-

- (1) At a kick-off, following a score—the ball shall NOT be required to travel 10 yards forward.
- (2) Each side will consist of seven players selected from a team of eight players and any of the selected seven players may be substituted by the eighth player at any time during the match-providing the substitution is signalled by the referee.
- The duration of each game shall be seven and a half minutes each way with one minute interval at half time. If, at the end of the game the scores are equal, the teams shall change over and continue to play until one side scores, such side being the winner, ends being changed every seven and a half minutes if necessary. In extra time there will be no interval.

- (4) The final tie will be played for ten minutes each way with an interval of one minute at half
- An independent time keeper will check all times and allow for injury or any other stoppage when so signalled by the Referee. A klaxon indicates the end of each session of play except that if a try has been scored, the scoring side shall be allowed to attempt the conversion.
- (6) The three tackle rule shall apply.


