

TODAY'S VISITORS

A warm welcome is extended today to the Players, Officials and Supporters of our newly promoted opponents from Oldham. They are no strangers to the first division, having been promoted from the second on no fewer than three times since 1974. However, they have also been relegated the same number of times. This season, Oldham have had a splendid start to their league campaign, with victories against such as Featherstone and Workington and a creditable draw against Wigan and at the time of writing they held 4th place in the first division, just one place below ourselves. Their improved performances have lead to an increase in attendances at the Watersheddings.

Frank Myler has moulded together a side with tremendous potential, for it includes many youngsters, especially in the backs. Mick Parrish was a signing from Hunslet and since his arrival at Oldham has excelled in his kicking as well as his general play. He is currently well placed in the Top Ten goal Scorers of this season. Winger Ashley McEwan was a signing from New Zealand at the beginning of last season, and he was one of the first of the new influx of players that have been streaming over from that country in the last two years. Phil Ward is currently on the transfer list at £8,000 along with another eighteen players at Oldham. and the value of talent on offer is over £200,000, giving some idea of the strength in depth that Oldham can draw from. The other winger is former Widnes star Dennis O'Neill, who found his first team chances at Naughton Park limited due to such players as Stuart Wright and Eric Hughes. Whilst the half back partnership of Alan Taylor and Paddy Kirwan is probably one of the most exciting in the division. Alan is a former Swinton player who moved to Oldham in an exchange deal and Paddy Kirwan is a former Colts International as is Ray Ashton who also comes into contention for a half back place.

In the forwards, Oldham have packmen of tremendous experience combined with some younger players of immense talent. Props Brian Hogan and Adrian Alexander combine the above mentioned qualities. Brian is another former Widnes player who needs no introduction to Cas supporters, for on his last visit to Wheldon Road, he was sent off for a foul on Malcolm Reilly and subsequently served a 12 match suspension for the offence. Adrian was a signing from Southern Rugby Union, as was Bob Mordell who also played for England in the 15 a side game, however, Bob is likely to be out of action tonight after pulling a hamstring. Also Oldham are blessed to have Gary Owen, who was recently selected for the Welsh side to meet the touring Aussies at Cardiff, but he is another who has had to withdraw from the squad due to injury. Hooker Alan McCurrie is another who will need no introduction, for he played for Wakefield Trinity for three years with whom he played at Wheldon Road on occasions. Second row forward Alan Platt and Andrew Goodway are two of the young starlets for Oldham. Alan Platt was an Under 19 international of some repute, whilst Andrew Goodway is a local lad, his parents live in Airedale, so Andrew will be no stranger to Wheldon Road, and if chosen to play will be all out to put one over on his own town club. Perhaps the biggest sensation to hit Oldham for many a year is loose forward Terry Flanagan who shot to prominence, and within a few ganes had earned the club captaincy. Further honours came his way, with an Under 24 Cap for Great Britain in their match against the Touring Kiwis at Craven Cottage, Terry is definitely one for the future.



Beardmore opened the scoring with a neatly taken penalty, but the Wires hit back with a barnstorming try from second row man Bob Eccles. The first half Castleford try had an element of luck about it, as Hesford seemed to have covered in defence only to let the ball slip through his hands, this left Barry Johnson clear to control the ball with his feet before diving over for the try. Robert Beardmore obliged with a goal. If Johnson's try was lucky, then so was the Warrington penalty that ended the first half scoring, for Hesford's kick seemed to be sailing wide, only to hit a post and fall over the bar.

In the second half, Cas opened the scoring with a Kevin Ward try following a planned move involving Barry Johnson, Rob Beardmore adding the goal points. Another Cas penalty increased the lead to 14-5 and Cas seemed to be sailing. But Bob Eccles found another gap and set off on his run; he found John Bevan in support and the Welsh captain made no mistake with the touchdown, Hesford added the goal points to reduce the arrears to 4 points. John Joyner was then carried off with what appeared to be an ankle injury to join Kevin Beardmore who had left the field earlier with severe concussion, Ian Orum and Paul Spedding respectively provided the replacements.

The Wires then had a final fling at the Cas line, this 15 minute spell saw them gain 75% of the scrum possession, only to be met with an unbeatable home defence, although at times the visitors seemed certain to score. The final hooter was greeted with a mixture of joy and relief by the home supporters and as a result of the game, we climbed into third position in the league.

Last Sunday at Craven Park, Cas received a boost when they took an early lead through a try from Kevin Ward, following an inside pass from Barry Johnson and a goal from Rob Beardmore, however, this was pegged back with a Barrow try and conversion, before Rob Beardmore once again restored our lead with a penalty goal for offside, but before the break

Barrow hit back with a try and conversion and a penalty goal to take them into half time leading by 12 - 5.


Before Cas had settled down in the second half, Barrow had increased their lead by another ten points, with another two tries and two goals, to make the score 22-5. Cas, who were being heavily beaten in the scrums, then hit back with fifteen points without reply, with tries from Orum, Birkby and Hyde with Rob Beardmore complementing with three goals to make the score 22-20 with only ten minutes to play, and despite desperate Castleford attacking, the home side ran out winners by ten clear points.

Despite last Sunday's result, Cas are still in the top four, with everything to play for, and a win today would consolidate that position.

THE 'A' TEAM

Following their easy win at Post Office Road to continue their unbeaten run, the reserves came up against Keighley, who were beaten themselves on the day they came to Wheldon Road. However, if Keighley thought they had a chance of pulling off a shock, their hopes were dashed in the first twenty minutes, as Cas went into a 12-0 lead, through tries from England and Kellett, with three goals from lan Birkby. There then followed a period of handling mistakes before Geoff Morris sailed over in the corner to round off a spell of intense pressure, the ball going from one side of the field to the other. Geoff, unfortunately left the field almost immediately after scoring, but lan Birkby added the conversion to leave the visitors trailing 17-0 at the break.

In the first attack of the second half, Alan Hardy held the ball for what seemed ages before parting to Neil Kellett who's perfectly timed run was unstoppable, Birkby again made no mistake with the kick. George Ballantyne was the next to get in on the act as he held off two defenders

to cross for his 6th try of the season. Birkby goaled and Cas were 27 - 0 ahead.

Mark Roache was next to join in the romp, stepping inside three men to cross sufficiently near to the posts to allow lan Birkby to keep up his record of goalkicking successes. Keith England then scored his second with Birkby tagging on his eighth goal. From the kick off, David Rookley gathered and passed inside to Steve Gill who burst through the first tackle attempt and found himself in the clear, he rounded the next defender to come up against the full back, whom he successfully shrugged off to score near the corner flag. Ian Birkby found the distance too great, much to the dismay of the supporters present; Then Keith England scored his third try against a now well beaten Keighley side. Ian Birkby made amends for his previous miss by converting the try, and as supporters were discussing the possibilities of Cas scoring 50 points the referee blew his whistle to end the speculation and Keighley's misery, with Cas just five points short of that half century.
