



Today brings Wigan's last home league game of the season and they could not wish for better opponents than the successful Oldham team, whose record this season has been really impressive following their promotion to the First Division.

Personally I believe that Wigan have only an outside chance of the championship itself, in view of the two tough league games they yet face at Featherstone where they have not won since 1970—and against Widnes away.

But the Premiership will certainly see Wigan figuring prominently in the final stages, unless things go drastically wrong for the team.

Today, much interest among Wigan fans will be centred around the return of Oldham winger Green Vigo to his old Central Park stamping ground, where he once equalled the Wigan individual try scoring record for one game by scoring seven tries.

After leaving Wigan a few seasons ago, Green seemed to have mixed fortunes. 



Brian Batty on Rugby League

An epidemic of head injuries is alarming club officials and coaches—to say nothing of players—throughout the game. This unpalatable feature of the code has been on the increase for some time and has to be stamped out as quickly as possible.

Perhaps there is more to it than mere coincidence that the spate of jaw, cheekbone and facial injuries has come with the introduction of the sinbin.

Certainly this new system has done nothing for the discipline in the game . . . rather the opposite on the evidence offered from match to match.

To single out a list of those injured or subjected to the high tackling would take up too much space but there has to be a clampdown. When the Australians began their tour, manager Frank Farrington outlined how in Sydney they had gone to great lengths to erase the high and late tackling in cleaning up the game.

A few people scoffed at this talk but Farrington was genuine yet in this country we seem to be getting left behind in this business. I believe we have to act now and at the same time decide once and for all whether the sinbin system is doing more harm than good. And while we are sounding the alarm bells let's hope the League do not go ahead with this crazy idea of stopping the clock after a try has been scored while the goal kick is taken.

Already the game is being held up to ridicule in Australia after introducing this system at the start of their new season. Some games are running 20 minutes late and causing chaos and anger to all concerned.

How on earth television is going to cope when a high scoring game can hit their programmes goodness knows. The whole scene is going to rebound on the schedules of press and radio and surely we've enough problems that need sorting out without adding to them.



The first time Wigan won the Challenge Cup was in 1924, 30 years after the inception of the competition and they defeated our visitors of today from Oldham at Rochdale.

That is the second time of late that I have mentioned Rochdale as a neutral venue for important games. Swinton's modern ground wasn't built in those days, so I suppose Rochdale was most suitable.

It is difficult to imagine, but more so when one realises that there was a crowd of over 41,000 to see that famous game. More in fact than saw the first final at Wembley five years later. There was trouble controlling the crowd and

they broke through the rails along the touch line. The old rugby tale tellers used to tell us about the Van Heerden try. The story goes that as he made his way down the touch line a policeman on horse-back was actually in the field of play as he tried to control the crowd. By all accounts South African Van Heerden was something special and he ran under "th'orses bally" to score that try.

That was the first of four consecutive finals for Oldham, two of which they won and two they lost. It seems strange that a Club with a background like that and a side like they had in the 50's have never had a game at Wembley.

There will be plenty of readers today old enough to remember what the Wigan team of 1958 did to Oldham. A full house of 22,500 saw Wigan win a third round tie, with an 8–0 score to overcome Oldham and the blizzard that raged round the ground for most of the game. That win was exaggerated by the fact that Oldham had beaten Wigan 14 times in a row. One of them being as fine an exhibition of rugby, 'Australians and all' as ever was seen on Central Park, they beat Wigan 48 points to 23.

So far I have written about before and after my days as a player. The Oldham of my time were trying hard to recapture the glory days. I do remember some hard Lancashire Cup games there. There always seemed to be a flare up between their full back Billy Griffiths and Gordon Ratcliffe. It was a case of the irresistable force meeting an immovable object.

Getting off the ground at Oldham was a problem as one had to go through the crowd. We had to hide Ken Gee under the stands after one game. The police smuggled him out and a taxi joined him with us at Heaton Park Hotel.

That, despite the fact that Ken and I had played a match for Oldham as guests during the war. I don't think we played that bad.
