





OUR VISITORS

Today we extend a greeting to Red Rose opposition with the visit of Oldham. Rugby League is said to be a young man's game nowadays and if this is totally true then Oldham should do well for they have one of the youngest first team squads in the game.

Frank Myler had to relinquish the club's coaching position when he stepped up to concentrate on the job for the International side, he was quickly succeeded as club coach by Peter Smethurst who had six playing years with Oldham in the 60's as a centre and second row forward.

Oldham suffered a £70,000 financial loss in winning the Second Division title in the season before last, and nearly another £30,000 when they consolidated their position in the First Division by finishing 8th.

A trio of leading players have been sold to newcomers Kent Invicta. Middlesex based and London employed forward **Bob Mordell**, a former England R.U. player, had been listed at his own request at £15,000. Oldham accepted Invicta's bid, and also let them have another London based forward, former Harlequin **Adrian Alexander**. They have been joined by scrum half **Gary Bishop**, son of the Great Britain former Test star, who moved to Kent Invicta in a £7,000 deal in mid August. Before these moves Oldham had more players offered for transfer than any other club, totalling almost £200,000 worth of talent at Oldham's valuations.

At the Watershedddings they eagerly await the arrival of **Nick Wright**, the 29 year old goalkicking full back who came into the New Zealand side for the Second Test against Australia recently and gave a match winning show. He will not be available for the club however until after the Maoris tour of England, and could well be playing for the tourists on Craven Park in a few days. Meanwhile **Steve Littler**, a fine prospect has graduated to the No. 1 jersey via the Colts and 'A' teams.

Oldham were hoping to sign two more New Zealanders. Centre **Alan Sinclair** arrived ten days ago but prop **Craig Coyle** who was expected to accompany him, apparently had come over earlier and had been training with Kent Invicta.

Recent signing at the end of July is 28 year old **Jim Hornby**, a former Great Britain Under 24 and Lancashire County winger, surprisingly given a free transfer by Wigan after nine years with the Club. He was a product of Wigan Colts and been a first team regular for a number of years.

Currently earning good reports is one of last season's 'finds', 20 year old local off half **Chris Willis** from Saddleworth Juniors, after a spell as an apprentice professional with Oldham Athletic F.C. A former captain of England Schools, he was in the same England Schoolboys side as **Des Foy**. This 20 year old centre started his professional career with Widnes, then moved to his home town club a year ago. He is the brother of the Wigan player.

Another exciting discovery late IAst season from a Huddersfield amatuer side was strong running winger **Mike Taylor** who impressed in a handful of first team games.

Mick Parrish is one of the biggest inside backs in England, weighing in at 6' 4" and 15st. 8lbs. An £18,500 capture from Hunslet nearly three years ago Parrish played and scored in every one of Oldham's matches during the 1981/82 season, the only player to achieve this feat that season and indeed the only player in history to record such an achievement with two clubs - he had done it with Hunslet in 1978/79.

Oldham's representzation with the Great Britain training squad is now five, four of them in the pack. Odd one out is lively scrum half **Ray Ashton**, a 21 year old Widnes St. Marie's Amateur League product who has amateur international youth, Great Britain Colts and was a shadow choice for the full Great Britain side after earning Under 24 honours last season. He has already played over 100 games for Oldham and was leading try scorer in 1981/82 with 26

Wally Jones, also with Great Britain Under 24 honours, is a former Latchford Albion prop who had been on loan to Blackpool, was not retained, and cost a mere £2,000 from Rochdale last October. Prop or second row Andy Goodway a 22 year old Castleford born player signed in 1979, quickly progressed to full international status with a try-scoring display for Great Britain against France, after doing well in Britain's Under 24's last season. The brother of the Warrington player, Mick Warrall, also 22 and signed in August 1979 is similarlya former Great Britain Colt and Under 24 player and 'shadow' choice for Great Britain last season. He is a reliable stand-in when a goalkicker is needed. Last of the quintet is 23 year old loose forward Terry Flanagan, another product of the prolific Saddleworth 'nursery', a former captain of Great Britain Under 24's and last season a full Test player. He is the brother of Kevin, the former Oldham and Rochdale player, and son of Bill Flanagan the former Belle Vue Rangers hooker.

Experience in the Oldham backs is provided by **Green Vigo**, the South African born former Wigan winger, signed from Swinton a year last August in an exchange deal involving centre Clive Hunter. Valued at £25,000, **Ashley McEwan** is the New Zealand centre who joined Oldham after trials with

Rovers and a spell with Blackpool Borough.

In the pack the evergreen **Mick Morgan** joined them in a £4,000 deal last February. The former Wakefield, York and Featherstone forward had just given up the Caslisle player-coach job. A great character on and off the field, Mick is the lively auctioneer of the Rugby League Road Show. Captain **Alan McCurrie** signed from Wakefield in October, 1981 in an exchange deal also involving Billy Harris, and previously with Whitehaven, is a hooker with several try hat tricks to testify to his lively play in the loose and many appearances for Cumbria to his credit.

Paddy Kirwan is a Colts International and Lancashire County player and though perhaps overshadowed by Ashton at scrum half is almost the regular back substitute. Paul Lowndes is a youngster on the verge of first team football. He has played for Lancashire and Great Britain Colts, and Alan Platt, listed at £45,000 is a second row man and a powerful kicker who hails

from the Leigh district.

One of the most enthusiastic players to take to the field is **Tom Naidole**, who had a brief spell with Wigan and is the son of a former Huddersfield

iiian player.

Leading forward **Mick Coombes**, a product of the Colts, a 15st. six footer is out with a dislocated shoulder, and another sidelined with a similar injury is **Colin Hawkyard** who started as a forward but moved back to earn a regular centre berth.

CENTENARY SUCCESS

Those who had witnessed the Yorkshire cuptie at Odsal, a repeat of last year's tie and the third year in succession that Bradford have deposed us from the County Cup competion, came away satisfied we had gone very close to winning. Indeed had we not been at a numerical disadvantage for threequarters of the game we would surely have gained our very first ever cup success at Odsal. The merit of this becomes even more apparent as we observe that Northern soon became the only First Division side with a hundred percent league record.

The improved form we showed at Odsal was carried over to the following week and the visit of Widnes to Craven Park. Here was a match we were especially keen to win; not only because of our regular closeness of the scores between the two sides in recent season and hence the added rivalry, but also because this game represented the closest match date to the Club's

formation one hundred years earlier.

Few would have given much for our chances of a Centenary success, however, when the composition of our side became known. In addition to the injuries already sustained at club level, both George Fairbairn and Dave Watkinson had to withdraw following knocks sustained in a Great Britain

squad practice game during midweek.

Our side, however, responded quite splendidly to the challenge. Paul Harkin in particular buzzed around very effectively to keep things moving. and Roy Holdstock had a tremendous game in the forwards. Whilst his display rightly earned him the man-of-the-match award it must also have left him contemplating one or two incidents which produced only a penalty yet looked no less severe than "that elbow" which has earned him his suspended suspension. Steve Hartley's name can also be added to the list of leading off halves who have fallen victim to off-the-ball attention from the same opponent this year.


But these were isolated incidents, which cost Widnes dear in penalty goals successfully taken by John Lydiat, whilst the only try of the game came whilst Eric Hughes was pondering indiscretions from the touchline. It was not a "dirty game", but it was certainly a hard one, well worthy of meetings between our two sides. A thriller which, despite the new rules (and there were only three occasions when possession was handed over at the expiry of six tackles) was not unlike the style of many games last season. At the end our players meritted the standing ovation they received, a satisfactory conclusion to a Centenary occasion.

A fine but blustery afternoon saw Warrington at strength against Rovers, still lacking half a dozen of our leading players. Our only change from our Widnes victory however was on the substitutes bench, and yet the performance of the side was unrecognisable from that seven days earlier.

The bounce of the ball seemed to go Warrington's way, but this should not be advanced as an excuse for our defeat. We are still searching for our first away win of the season, and will not achieve it on this form as we missed tackles, fumbled our handling, and generally showed a lack of backing up.

We could and should have won this one; instead we cannot disguise that we were well beaten. Chris Burton was outstanding in a pack which otherwise lacked fire and running power, and leadership when Len Casey had to be withdrawn at the interval.

Solitary bright spot for us was Steve Hartley's try, the best of the match. It was one of his old style scores when he took a pass from Holdstock and went 50 yards, rounding the full back with ease.

RESERVES SUFFER SET BACK

The season is scarcely underway, ground conditions are as suitable as they will ever be, clubs have reviewed their playing strengths during the summer, yet already we are suffering the course of postponed 'A' team matches. It is a blot on the game that occurs every season and a shame that the league permit it. Either the 'A' team league system should be completely revised and reorganised or strong action should be taken against clubs who fail to fulfill a fixture.

It is unfair to members who have purchased season passes, it is a blow to those young players who are hoping to establish themselves, to the experienced men seeking a fitness test after injury, and to clubs who see the 'A' team as the ideal bridge between junior and first team football. It is difficult to motivate players when they realise that after two or three training sessions each week there is no game at the end of it. .

Against Hunslet at Dewsbury our young side was trailing 8-2 ten minutes before the interval and already a man short following the dismissal after 15 minutes of Paul Proctor. Yet at halftime we went in leading 10-8, and played so well in the second half when our extra speed and fitness paid dividends that we scored a further 40 points without reply.

Kevin Watson had a tremendous game, Dave Laws picking up well off him to have a good second half. Both he and Andy Kelly had hat-tricks of tries, and Graham Douglas coming on as a second half substitute scored a great try with a 30 yard charge.

Regrettably continuation of this form was interrupted when Dewsbury called off their visit to Craven Park eight days ago, unable to raise a team.

COLOUR CARDS

Following an incident at the Widnes match, we are asked to clarify the use of colour cards by the referee. Whilst each club should appoint its own timekeepers, the touch judge remains the only official timekeeper and no player will be allowed to rejoin a game until permitted to do so by the appropriate touch judge.

Though the Laws of the game give the referee the option to allow a five or ten minute temporary dismissal, the shorter period will rarely be exercised. The ten minute penalty will be indicated by the displayof a red card. The five minute penalty will be indicated by the display of a yellow card.

For disciplinary purposes a tariff system willapply. A ten minute penalty means a 2 point tariff, and a five minute penalty incurs a 1 point tariff. Six points accumulated in the same season or calendar year means that the offender is liable to an automatic one match suspension at the appropriate meeting of the Rugby League Disciplinary Committee.

Signall for full dismissal remains the same - the referee pointing the way to

the dressing room.
