





# HISTORICAL NOTES ON FEATHERSTONE R.

THE "Sporting Chronicle" of October 12, 1950 reported "that Featherstone Rovers 39-8 win over Keighley brought out many record books in the little mining town, and they showed this was the Rovers' highest score since the newly-formed Newcastle club was defeated on the first day of the 1936-37 season. Featherstone then scored eight goals and nine tries, (43 points) to four goals and four tries (20 points), and as this was their biggest score in first-class football, there is little doubt that the margin of 31 points against Keighley is a club record".

"Ralph Hamer with a hat trick of tries was the outstanding man against Newcastle, who had two ex-Featherstone men, secretary G.A. Appleyard and trainer Jimmy Williams looking after them. The eight goals which Brogden scored 14 years ago were equalled on Saturday by Fred Miller, who is now within 24 of the club record of 57 goals established by Bert Lockwood in 1934-35".

The "Yorkshire Evening Post" football edition (which Yorkshire readers will remember being printed on yellow paper) of August 11, 1956 recorded that "It is in coaching and training, not in new players that Featherstone Rovers pin their hopes for 1956-57. The Batten brothers, Eric and Bob, have given way as coaches to Bill Hudson, now an Ackworth licensee, who made his name with Batley and Wigan and ex-Bradford Northern scrum half Donald Ward respectively. The departure of Eric Batten who turned down the post of trainer to both teams, ends an association during which Featherstone had five outstandingly successful seasons, including a Wembley final, a cup semi-final and a narrowlyfailing bid for a place in the League championship play-offs".

At times efforts were made to get the Rovers to do a "Wigan Highfield" with both Newcastle-on-Tyne and Doncaster being suggested venues for the club. The club resisted all blandishments and 1982-83 showed what a wise decision it was to remain at Post Office Road.

One of my fellow statisticians and an associate in the Rugby League Record Keepers Club sent me some information about the origins of the Rovers in a letter sent some fifteen years ago. Featherstone, Featherstone Rovers and Purston White Horse were in membership of the Dewsbury, Wakefield and District Rugby League and the three neighbouring teams all met in that competition, Rovers were founded in 1908, Purston White Horse in 1909 and Featherstone in 1911. (There had been Featherstone teams many years before that, of course.) In July 1912 Rovers and Featherstone amalgamated and White Horse disbanded after the 1912-13 season. Rovers and Purston were also members of the Yorkshire Rugby Combination which in the main was composed of the "A" teams of senior clubs.

The "Oldham Evening Chronicle" of May 2, 1914 gave the Northern Union Combination final table which revealed that the Rovers had played 15 games, won six, lost seven and drawn two with a scoring record of 194 points against 65, to finish with a percentage of 46.66. Oldham "A" that season played 36, won 24, lost 9 and drew 3, scoring 613 to 260, to finish third in the table with 70.82%. The Northern Combination encompassed both the Lancashire and Yorkshire Combinations.

In 1912-13 Rovers were fifth in the Northern Rugby Combination, having played 18 of which 12 were won, 5 lost and 1 drawn which gave a percentage of points obtained out of points possible of 69.04. Purston White Horse played 21, won 8, lost 9 and drew 4, with a 47.06%. Oldham "A" was third in that season, playing 34, winning 26, losing 7 and drawing one, finishing with 77.09%.

In 1919-20 Rovers were second in the Northern Rugby Combination, winning 13 and losing 3 of their 16 games, their 81.25% only being surpassed by Wigan "A"s 88.88%. Wigan won the play-off for medals by a try to nil at Central Park.

In 1920-21 Rovers were fifth with 12 wins, 5 defeats and one draw in 18 games, having 69.44% successes. That was their last season in the junior ranks and they entered the Northern League in 1921-22.

## **NEW-LOOK ROVERS**

FEATHERSTONE come to Watersheddings today with a much stronger look than the side we beat at Post Office Road earlier in the season.

They have done some shrewd team strengthening over the past few weeks to take to Post Office Road such players as David Barends, the strong-running ex-Bradford wing, Charlie Stone, the ex-Rovers stalwart from Hull who has merely returned "home", and Geoff Clarkson, the much-travelled second-row man from Leigh on a free transfer.

The Rovers were badly handicapped by injury when we played them on their own ground and Peter Smith, one of their Wembley heroes and generally accepted as one of the best and fairest forwards in the game, is still sidelined by back trouble. The latest news is encouraging, however, and all League fans wish Peter a speedy return to action after his long lay-off.

At St. Helens in the quarter-final of the John Player Special Trophy, full back Nigel Barker broke his jaw, so he will certainly be out of the team today and his full back spot may go to former Keighley and Carlisle utility man Joe Bardgett, who seems equally at home anywhere in the back division.

Barends will probably figure on the right-wing with Steve Queen and John Gilbert in

the centre and either Robert Marsh or Tony Chapman on the left-wing.

At half-back Rovers may field one of the youngest pairs in the game. Wigan have the youngest in 17-year-olds Shaun Edwards and Keith Fielding, but the Rovers pair are both 18 — Alan Banks and Deryck Fox. Banks is the younger brother of Hull's Barry Banks and he played an important role in the Rovers fairytale triumph at Wembley against Hull last May.

Fox was signed after the BARLA under-19 tour to New Zealand last summer and is

regarded as one of the finest young prospects in the game today.

Charlie Stone strengthens a front-row which can boast Gary Siddall and hooker

Bob Spurr, who spent most of his career with neighbours Castleford.

Who will forget David Hobbs' two tries at Wembley which won him the Lance Todd

Trophy voted upon by members of the Rugby League Writers' Association?

Hobbs is due to pack down in his usual second-row spot today, possibly partnered by Steve Hankins or Geoff Clarkson who, you may recall, had a spell here at Watersheddings some years ago.

Finally, we come to loose-forward and Terry Hudson. Hudson had a great game as

scrum-half at Wembley.

It is perhaps significant, as we approach the turn of the year and thoughts turn to the Challenge Cup draw in January, that Rovers are again reaching something like their best

form after an indifferent start to the season.

They will certainly be tough opponents today as proven by recent results. They repeated their victory over Hull in the second round of the Player's Trophy and only went down 16-12 to St. Helens at Knowsley Road in the quarter-final. Each team scored two tries, but Saints won on goalkicks. That is a measure of the task that confronts Oldham today.




