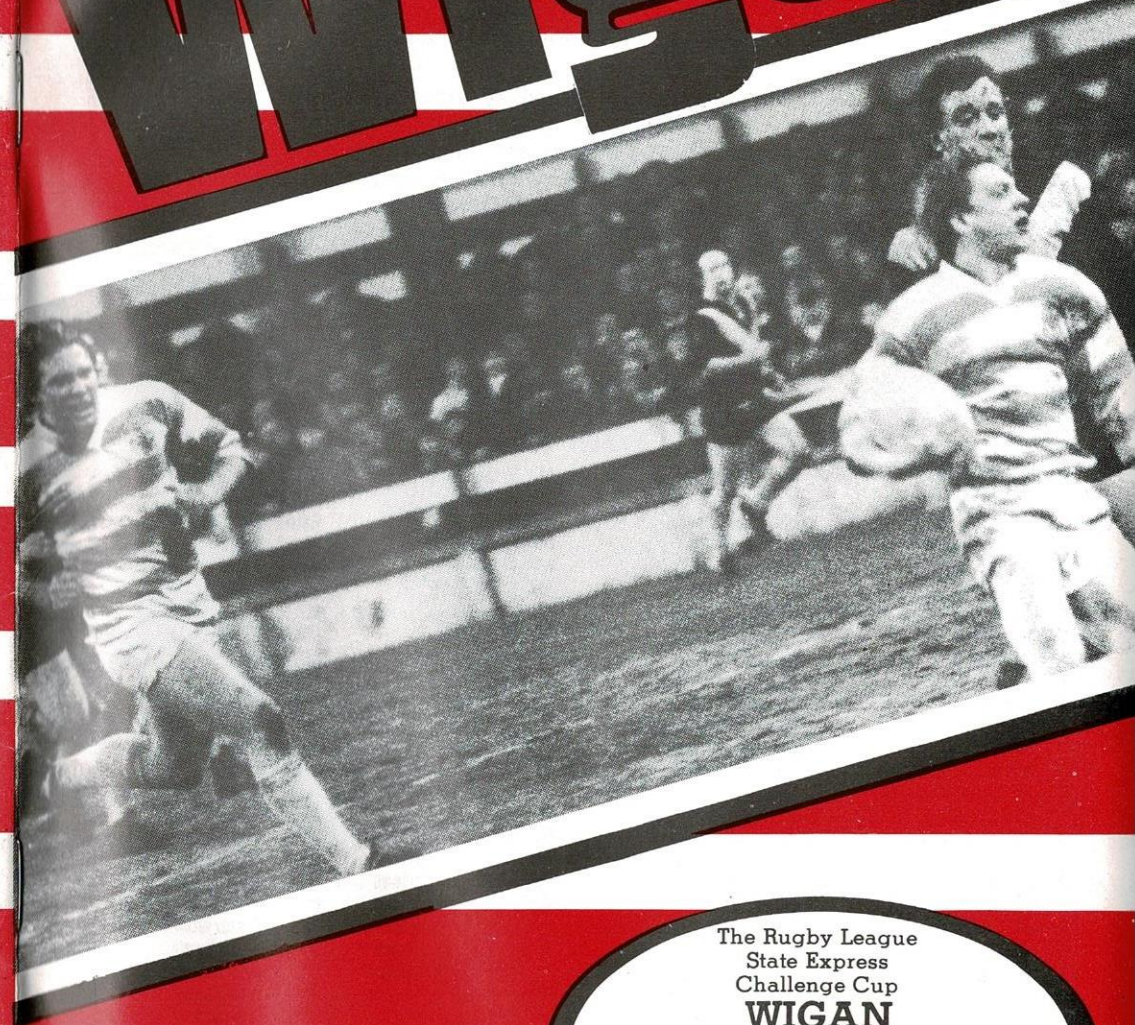

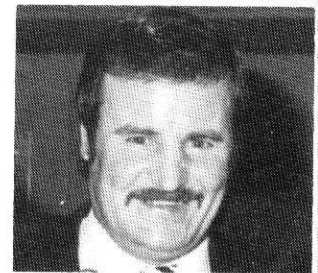
WE ARE becoming too inconsistent.

VIEW FROM THE TERRACES

THERE is absolutely no truth in the rumour that Doug Stand went to Twickenham on Saturday.

This correspondent has not been to a rah-rah game since Orrell's dour encounter with Coventry last year, and even that fleeting visit led to him being hauled over the coals by the WSPRLOSFPW's disciplinary committee.

The WSPRLOSFPW stands for the Wigan Society for the Preservation and Promotion of Rugby League as the Only Sport Worth Playing and Watching.

It has members all over Wigan, but like Masons, they are hard to spot. You have to know the haunts, the handshakes, the secret passwords.

For instance, you can't just walk into, say, the vault of the Royal Oak or Billy Boston's pub, and ask if anyone is interested in rugby league.

The silence would be deafening, just as if you had walked into a hospital and asked if anyone was interested in getting better.

What you have to do, to identify the members of rugby league's most secret society, is enter the alleged meeting place and ask if anyone is interested in soccer.

Anyone who reacts by falling off his seat, sneezing into his beer or asking for you to be banned, is probably a member of the WSPRLOSFPW. Inquiring about rugby union is likely to have even more startling effect.

Which brings me back to the time I was accused of going over to the gentlemen's game, and brought up before the dreaded disciplinary committee.

I hardly slept a wink the night before - what with worrying about them confiscating my Yorkshire Good Beer Guide and signed photograph of Alex Murphy - but when the black day came it

wasn't too bad.

The committee seemed impressed by my mitigating plea that I had spent much of the time in the bar, and said that after reading newspaper reports of the match, they considered my attendance at the game was sufficient punishment.

This is not to mock Orrell of course. As far as this column is concerned they are the finest exponents of their code in the North of England.

It is just the code that leaves so much to be desired.

There has got to be something wrong with a spectator sport in which players spend half their time kicking the ball out of play.

When they are not kicking the ball out of play, 28 men try to kick each other out of play, while the two oldest, smallest and cleanest shirted players on the park try to outdo each other in the audacity of their drop goals.

A great game for drop goals, rugby union. There are drop goals from one's own half, drop goals from sitting positions, drop goals from impossible situations, and best of all, drop goals from scrums near the opposition's posts.

Rugby league stand-offs have been known to faint with envy at getting clean possession from a scrum 10 yards out, but the rah-rah men just keep sailing over the drop goals.

But it's time to come off the old hobby horse. This column is not just a platform for sniping attacks on other sports.

No, the above tirade was just to let you know that Doug Stand has far more sense than to go all the way down to London just to go to Twickers.

The only reason I happened to be in London at all last weekend was because I heard there was a match on at Craven Cottage...

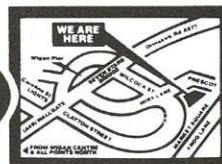

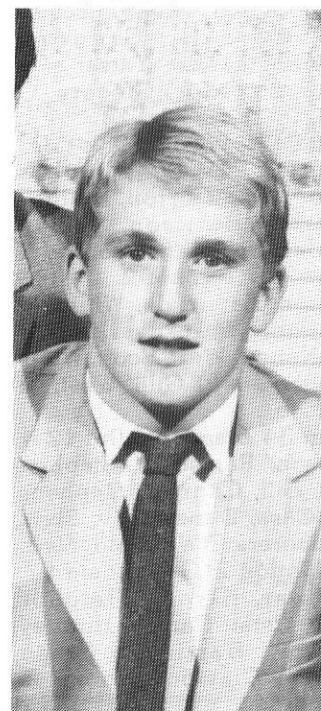

This meant that Wigan played Batley and Halifax played Oldham in the Championship play off semi-finals and true to form Wigan beat Batley by 18 points to 2. The other tie, however, ended in a 3 points-all draw. A replay was held and this time Oldham won by 8 points to 2.

The final proved to be a close run affair with Wigan managing to hold on to a 7 points to 3 interval lead. Dick Ramsdale scored Wigan's try and James Leytham kicked 2 goals. Oldham's points came from a Jardine try.

The 1908-9 season was a very successful one for Wigan apart from

finishing top of the League table and winning the Championship Play off final they also beat Oldham in the Lancashire Cup final, finished top of the Lancashire League and reached the Rugby League Cup semi-finals. Furthermore winger Joe Miller scored 49 tries to finish joint top try scorer in the League with Williams of Halifax. The total was a new R.L. try scoring record.

James Leytham, who kicked 2 goals in the Championship Play off final was the League's 4th top goal scorer with 75 goals, 3rd top try scorer with 39 tries and 2nd top points scorer with 267 points.

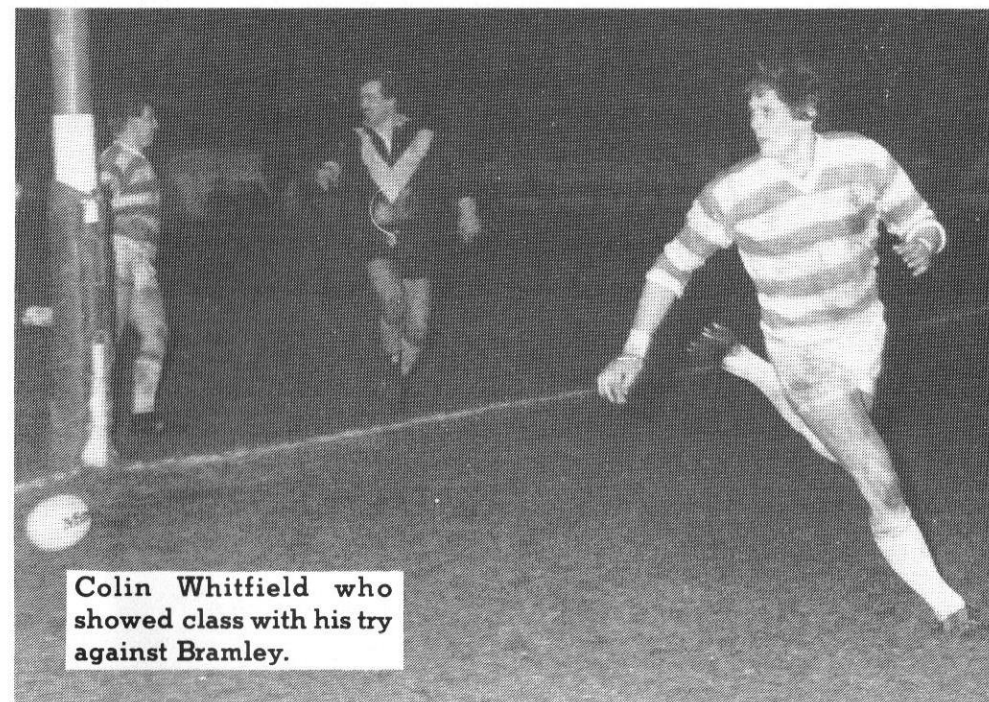

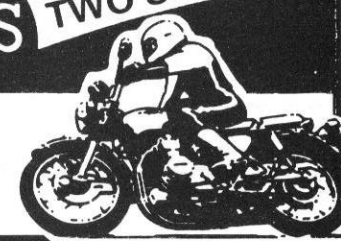

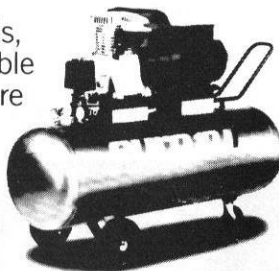

WIGAN R.L.F.C. GREATS

FRED GRIFFITHS

THE Wigan Club has been very lucky throughout its history to be able to field several top class goalkickers. Those that readily spring to mind are the late great Jim Sullivan, Ted Ward and South African Full Back Fred Griffiths.

Fred or 'Punchy', as he was known by the

Wigan fans, joined Wigan on a five year contract in 1957 and he made his first team debut against Widnes at Central Park on December 14th. Wigan won the game by 18 points to 5 and Griffiths kicked three goals. His next game was at home to Rochdale Hornets on January 11th, 1958, when he landed a further five goals. However due to the fine form of Jackie Cunliffe in the Number One shirt this proved to be his last game of the season.

1958-9 then was Griffith's first full season for Wigan and what a season it proved to be for him. In 39 appearances he kicked 176 goals and scored 14 tries to register a total of 394 points. His goals and points totals were both records for the Wigan Club and they have yet to be beaten. Six of the 176 goals came in the 1959 Rugby League Challenge Cup Final in which Wigan beat Hull by 30 points to 13.

Two more Cup Final appearances for Griffiths came in the next two seasons. In 1960 Wigan reached the Championship Play Off final, despite only finishing 4th in the League table, and again he landed 6 goals as the 'Riversiders' easily beat Wakefield Trinity, who had finished 2nd in the table, by 27 points to 3. His second and final Wembley appearance game in 1961 and he scored all 6 of Wigan's points as his team went down to local rivals St. Helens by 12 points to 6.

Griffiths played his final game for Wigan at Hull on November 24th, 1962 and he signed out on a high note by kicking 8 goals and scoring a try as Wigan won by 34 points to nil. In his 161 appearances for the Club he landed 663 goals and crossed for 43 tries to record a total of 1455 points. Four times he topped the century of goals mark in a season; scoring 176 goals in 1958-9, 126 goals in 1959-60, 128 goals in 1960-1 and 174 goals in 1961-2.

Unfortunately Wigan were not able to offer Griffiths a new contract when his original five year contract ran out in late 1962 so the talented Full Back emigrated to Australia. Not surprisingly he proved to be a difficult man to replace.
