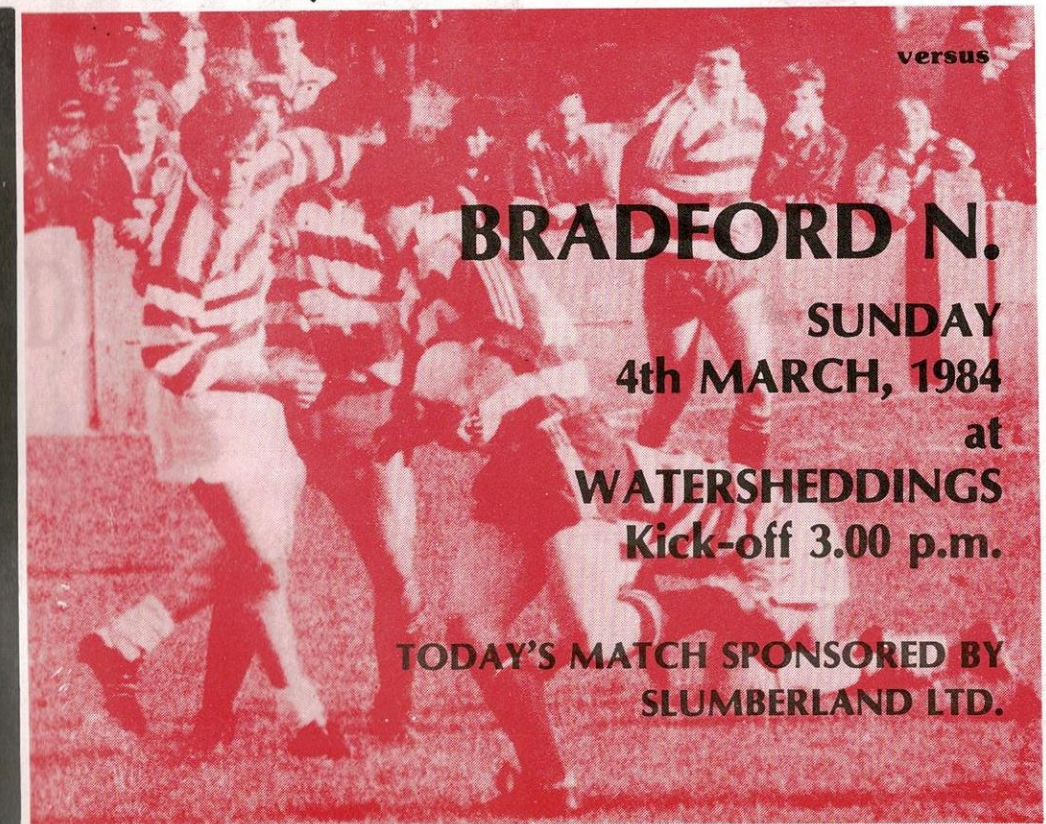

## WATERSHEDDINGS SURVEY

SINCE our last home game several matters of major significance have taken place here at Watersheddings.

We duly beat Second Division side Huyton in the first round of the State Express Challenge Cup to earn a second-round tilt at Wigan last Sunday at Central Park.

Unfortunately, our totally unpredictable form hit rock bottom the following week-end when we lost 42-8 to Whitehaven in Cumbria, thus providing Frank Foster's team with its first win of the season after 20 consecutive First Division defeats.

This led to the resignation the following day of our coach Frank Barrow. Frank was first appointed into a caretaker capacity following the resignation of Peter Smethurst but he had been "upgraded" to senior coach only the week before.

It would be remiss of the club if it did not place on record here its best wishes to Frank for the future and its thanks for the work he did here during his 14-month stay, first as Frank Myler's second in command and then as Peter Smethurst's right hand man.

However, we now look forward to a new era under a man who has coached here previously and did a good job with only moderate talent at his disposal — Dave Cox.

Although he has spent the last few years in Sydney, Dave is very well known in Rugby League circles in this country, and he has had coaching experience both at the top level and with some of the clubs in the lower reaches of the league.

He coached both Castleford and Dewsbury when they were a power in the game and was also put in charge of the Other Nationalities side.

He has also taken charge of such clubs as Batley and Huyton, so Dave certainly knows what Rugby League is all about at both ends of the ladder.

Incidentally, when he was here last time, he was successful in earning a place on a short-list of three for the job of coaching Great Britain down under in the World Cup, a post that eventually went to David Watkins.

Dave emigrated to New South Wales in 1979 and since that time he has kept a close scrutiny of Australian methods of training, coaching and playing techniques, something we feel he is sure to introduce here at Watersheddings.

In January last year he was appointed coach at Workington Town in succession to Tommy Bishop, but he was in Cumbria for only a few days before he was forced to fly back to Sydney right away because of sudden illness in the family.

While watching and learning from the Aussies, Dave has long cherished an ambition to return to England and put Down Under techniques into operation here, and he was delighted to accept the opportunity to return to a club where he was very happy during his previous stay here.

The probability is that he will not yet have arrived. He may be here on Monday, or shortly afterwards, but when he arrives he will surely get a real Oldham welcome and the best wishes of all supporters.

We now have 11 First Division games left this season and as a result of our poor form in the past few months we still need a few wins to make mathematically certain of staying up.

Having said that we can still reach the top-eight if we can recapture the form and the enthusiasm that was the hallmark of our game last Autumn, so there is still a tremendous amount to play for.

We would probably be safe with three more wins out of the 11 games to play, but it could take six or seven victories to send us shooting into the top eight.

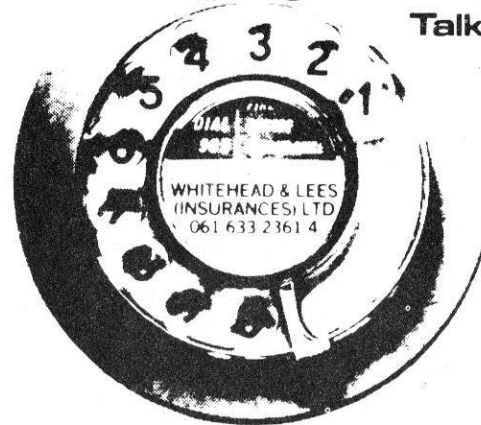
Last season, our first in the top flight, we had a similar sticky patch during January and February but we steadied up, won five league games in successive outings, and finished in eighth place to earn that Premiership game at Hull.

The Premiership can be a lucrative venture and as money is tighter these days than ever before it is important to try and qualify for it.

In doing so, of course, we would automatically pick up sufficient points to guard against relegation and that is most certainly the most important target of all right now.

## HISTORICAL NOTES ON BRADFORD NORTHERN

IN 1926, reporting on the affairs of the Bradford Northern club, the "Yorkshire Sports Post" commented on the decline of the club following its move to Birch Lane. It said that since season 1907-08, their first at that ground, Northern had never returned a percentage above the 50 mark. In those days the league tables were calculated on the basis of match points obtained from matches played. Thus in 1925-26 Northern with 14 wins and 24 defeats in 38 games had a percentage of 36.84 and finished in 23rd position. The club only finished bottom once in that period, 1921-22 when 2 wins and 1 draw from 34 games gave them a 7.35%. The club finished 26th each time in the four intervening seasons.

The first team to play at Birch Lane, which seems to have been the Greenfield Trotting Ground at Dudley Hill, was Gunn; Connell, Mosby, Davison, Craven; Brear, Mitchell; Laidlow, Mann, Walton, Feather, Rees and Turner.

The article told of the "2,000 faithful supporters" who followed the club during that depressing period, the home attendances in 1925-26 averaging 2,872. In these hard times several clubs would welcome such solid support. There was "a big debt hanging over the club, a four figure debt" which caused concern. A skilled artisan's wage was around £2 18s. (£2.90) per week although piece work rates raised this figure by another 11 shillings or so (55p) each week. A four figure debt 60 years ago would be much more astronomical today.

The last game played at Birch Lane took place on April 7, 1934 and the first match at Odsal was played on September 1, 1934. By coincidence the opposition at the opening of both the Birch Lane and Odsal grounds was provided by Huddersfield.

Bradford Northern's first win at Odsal was on November 17, 1934 when Featherstone Rovers were beaten 15-2. This was the forerunner of a period of greater prosperity for the club. New signings George Carmichael and Ted Spillane indicated that Northern were now becoming a much more ambitious club. Later Len Higson, Frank Murray, "Sandy" Orford and Vince Dilorenzo strengthened the side.

A new club house was opened in February 1935 which cost about £2,500. Shortly afterwards a challenge cup-tie was replayed at the Stadium drawing a crowd of 23,000 with record receipts of £1,005.

On July 30, 1936 Ernest Ward signed for the club and made his debut on his 16th birthday on September 5 of that year. Today, of course, clubs cannot sign players before their 16th birthday. It so happened that at the same time that Ernest Ward was signed, Dai Rees (ex-Halifax) was appointed Trainer-Coach, one of the best things to happen at Odsal.

It was a year or two later that Trevor Foster, one of nature's gentlemen, became associated with Northern. After a wonderful playing career he did not return to his native Wales but stayed on in Bradford. Because of this, when Northern closed down in the early 1960s, Trevor started the move to revive the club. He, it was, who called the meeting in the Bay Horse Hotel, Wakefield Road, Bradford, since demolished owing to motorway construction, which was attended by 30 people. A committee of 12 was formed and they decided to hire the St. George's Hall in the city centre for a meeting. This time 1,500 people attended including officials from the Rugby Football League and some club representatives. The club resumed and has been one of the best supported clubs in the game since that wonderful revival started by Trevor Foster.

## BRADFORD BID FOR THE TOP

TODAY we welcome Bradford Northern to Watersheddings when we will be bidding to avenge our narrow defeat at Odsal early on in the season.

Since then Northern, under the watchful eye of Peter Fox, have gone from strength to strength and have been one of the leading teams in the Slalom Lager championship race all season.

They possess a team that is traditionally hard to beat, but they also have players who can produce flair and attacking class on their day, such as Ellery Hanley and Keith Mumby.

Hanley, who is equally at home at centre or stand-off half, is a leading contender for this summer's Australian tour and after the way he gave our team all sorts of problems at Odsal in the second league game of the season, it is not difficult to see why.

Oldham fans also saw Hanley produce a great exhibition of attacking football when the Great Britain under-24 side hammered the French on our Watersheddings ground last Autumn.

Unluckily for Northern, Hanley damaged his shoulder in the Test match against France at Headingley a fortnight ago and when these notes were written it was not known whether he would be fit for today's match.

Full back Mumby is also in the running for the tour — the second of his career.

He only got into the side for the recent international in France because of injuries to Mick Burke and George Fairbairn, but he certainly grasped his big chance with both hands, and also did well in the return Test at Headingley.

Strong under the high ball and a keen tackler, Mumby is also one of Northern's most dangerous attackers, either on the counter or when linking up with his three-quarters.

Another player to look out for in the Northern back-line is young Steve Parrish, brother of Oldham's Mick.

He is a big lad, like Mick, and also plays centre and does the goalkicking — in many ways a replica of big brother, whom he followed into the professional ranks via Morley, his local RU Club.

Steve normally plays at right-centre for Northern, so the chances are that he will not be directly opposed to his brother, but will probably play opposite Des Foy.

In the forwards, Northern also possess some of the best-known pack men in the game, such as Jeff Grayshon, Brian Noble, Graham Idle, Dick Jasiewicz and Alan Rathbone.

Gary Van Bellen is another Northern forward who is well known to supporters of our game on both sides of the Pennines.

Indeed, practically every forward in the full-strength pack at Odsal has honours of some description or another.

Grayshon has represented his country many times at Test level and has also captained Great Britain.

Hooker Noble has captained both Great Britain under-24s and the full Test side this season, and he will probably go to Australia as Trevor Skerrett's second in command.

Van Bellen, a younger brother of the much-travelled Ian Van Bellen, possesses under-24 honours, while Jasiewicz was a travelling reserve to France recently and then found himself elevated to the second-row for the return Test at Leeds.

He is a member of the Great Britain training squad that is preparing for the forthcoming tour, as is hard-tackling loose-forward Alan Rathbone.

Rathbone missed last week-end's cup-tie against Hunslet because of suspension, but his two-match ban was cleared on Thursday night when Northern were due to play Wigan at Odsal.

After our poor run of form recently it was vital that we pick up First Division points in our remaining games, especially those games at home.

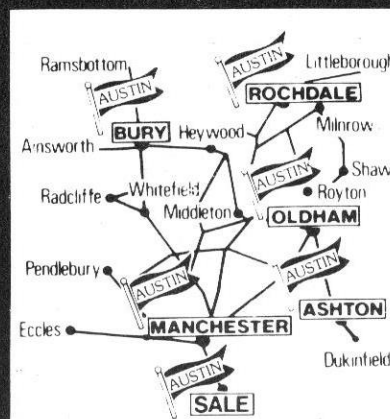
We cannot afford to slip up further, but we will certainly have a difficult task on our plate today against one of the most solid sides in the First Division.
