# THE WIN THAT NEVER WAS

The last minute try scored by Oldham substitute back Ian Birkby in the replayed Oldham v Leigh match at Watersheddings last Sunday week robbed us of two very valuable league points.

The points, of course, had been originally 'won' on Sunday January 8th this year when Leyland Referee John Mean decided to take stern action following a brawl and abandoned the match. It is history now but the fact remains that Leigh had a convincing lead and were obvious winners.

The replay, played in typical Watersheddings conditions — snow — was a different story. Only a few points separated the teams throughout, Alan McCurrie dropped an early goal which was more than cancelled out by a superb Des Drummond try and a John Woods conversion.

From that moment we always seemed to have the upper hand and at half time when we had kept Oldham's tally to that solitary drop goal from McCurrie it seemed a formality that the two points we won in January but which were later taken away were ours once more.

Oldham had to play the second half up the notorious Watersheddings slope against driving wind, rain and sleet and a freak snowstorm but they weathered it well and scored two tries and a conversion against a couple of Woods penalties.

Oldham admit that they were a shade lucky first of all to get another bite of the cherry and secondly to see Birkby's kick through bounce kindly and catch our defenders in two minds on whether to drop on the loose ball or to kick it out of the ground. As it was the ball 'stuck' in the mud over the try line and Birkby followed through to grab the try and the two points.

Both Clubs have had a very indifferent season with some brilliant early results but some very disappointing defeats as well.

On the credit side Oldham have taken scalps such as Castleford and Hull but allowed Whitehaven to play them off the park. We have performed quite brilliant at grounds like Wigan and Featherstone but have seen relegation bound sides like Wakefield and Salford come here and run us ever so close.

Recent lapses have placed both Clubs in the bottom half of the table. The difference between a Top 8 place and a relegation place is, of course, only four league places, so if you manage to avoid relegation you should be reasonably close to a play off spot. Our chance may have gone with the Oldham defeat last Sunday although it appears we are safe from the dreaded relegation but Oldham perhaps still fancy their chances despite their set back at Central Park last Wednesday.

Oldham will come here tonight determined to record a double victory having already picked up two valuable points from us in the replayed league encounter ten days ago.

It will not be easy for them because our lads are determined also to collect the points and will be particularly keen in view of the unfortunate circumstances surrounding the first match.

Oldham had had their problems this season but none more than on the coaching front where, on the resignation of Peter Smethurst they appointed Peter's assistant — like Smethurst another ex Leigh star — Frank Barrow.

Frank did not last long however and following a crushing defeat at bottom Club Whitehaven he resigned.

Oldham then appointed Dave Cox as coach and Cox was expected to fly in from Australia three weeks ago. However, due to a personal problem Cox was not able to take up the position and the job was taken on by original 'third' in command Brian Gartland.

Brian's first game in charge was a great boost for him and the Club-a fine win against Bradford Northern where the Parrish Brothers stole the show, Mick getting five goals for Oldham whilst his brother Steve notched all Northern's points with two penalty goals.

His second game was the game against Leigh at Watersheddings — the now infamous replayed match — and again he recorded a victory, this time by 13 points to 10.

At Wigan last Wednesday saw his first defeat with Cup Semi Finalists Wigan gaining revenge for their defeat at Oldham earlier in the season.

Like most Clubs, Oldham have had their fair share of injuries and I think it fair to say that the injury to scrum half Ray Ashton was perhaps the most contributing factor to Oldham's slump in form around Christmas time. Ray of course is now back in action and is reproducing the excellent form he showed prior to his injury.

Ray is just one of a number of crucial members of the Oldham side but their success in the early part of the season was down to excellent team work and the will to win.

Individuals did play a key part and as well as Ray Ashton, players like Flanagan, Andy Goodway, Mick Worrall and Des Foy performed admirably to earn themselves places in the Great Britain squad.

At full back Oldham have been playing Leigh born Steve Littler for most of the season but just recently he lost his place to Kiwi Nick Wright. Mick Parrish too was tried at full back but Mick would be the first to admit that full back is not his favourite position.

Wingmen Jimmy Hornby the ex Wigan favourite who left Central Park just before he was due to a well earned Testimonial has done a great job for Oldham, so too has Oldham's other wing star Colin Hawkyard.

Parrish and Des Foy have more or less commanded the centre positions this season while in Ray Ashton's absence young Chris Willis has been forming an attractive half back partnership with Paddy Kirwan.

The forwards have been the backbone of Oldham's success and in Wally Jones they have a real work horse who has to be one of the bargain buys of all time — a £2,000 snip from Rochdale Hornets — Alan McCurrie has done an excellent job for Oldham since his transfer to them from Wakefield Trinity and so too has prop forward Mick Morgan who joined Oldham from Carlisle in a very shrewd move indeed by the Oldham Committee.

### HERDMAN - TABERN IN LOAN SWOP DEAL

As all Supporters know our hooker Ray Tabern has joined London Club Fulham on loan until the end of the season. Fulham's giant forward Martin Herdman comes to Hilton Park in exchange.

Most Supporters will have been pleased with Herdman's debut at Watersheddings ten days ago and he is expected to make his home debut this evening.

Ray Tabern made his first appearance for Fulham in last Sunday's game at Central Park.

Both players will be anxious to impress in a hope that their moves will be made permanent when decision time comes later next month.





## SEMI-FINALS

YORK became only the second Division Two club to reach the Rugby League Challenge Cup Semi-Finals since the re-introduction of two Divisions in 1973 when they beat Castleford 14-12. In 1980, Halifax were beaten in the Semi-Finals by Hull K.R. In another era. Oldham, who finished as Division Two Champions in 1964, reached the Semi-Finals when they were beaten by Hull K.R. after two replays.

This is only the second time in YORK's 82-year-history as a senior club that they have reached the Semi-Finals. The last time was back in 1931 when they beat Warrington 15-5 at Headingley, before losing 22-8 to Halifax at Wembley.

In contrast, WIDNES are appearing in their 8th Semi-Final in the last ten seasons, having gone on to Wembley six times in this period.

The aggregate crowd of 52,814 for the four Third Round ties was the best since there were 55,274 in 1980.

## AMATEUR RUGBY LEAGUE by TREVOR

With stand-off Winston Sarsfield dictating play, exciting centres, Wayne Lee, and Sean Unsworth always looked dangerous, whilst scrum-half, David Rothwell was the unluckiest player of the day, twice being tackled on his back over the Leeds line unable to ground the ball. Sarsfield landed five goals from seven attempts to complete Leigh's scoring, but all-in-all it was an excellent performance from the young Leigh lads.

Congratulations to Leigh East Under 19's who, following good wins over Hensingham and Folly Lane, have reached the semi-finals of the BARLA Whitbread Youth Trophy. Unfortunately the draw has not been kind to them, and they must now travel to Cumbria to

take on the County Youth Cup winners, Kells.

Leigh Miners Under 19's also have an excellent chance of reaching the Youth Cup semifinals. After a tremendous away victory over Yorkshire County Cup winners Redhill of Castleford, the Miners again travelled to Widnes to take on the Tigers. A ten points draw means a replay at Twist Lane on April 8th, kick off 2.30 p.m., and for the winners, a visit to Wigan St. Pat's the semi-final draw.

In the BARLA Whitbread Trophy Open-age Competition, the draw has again been unfavourable to our local side. The Trophy holders, Leigh Miners, have had two tough ties against Milford of Leeds and Mayfield of Rochdale in the last two rounds, and now they must

Nearer to home, Culcheth Eagles won their last League fixture, the local derby against the Boars Head, by 19-14 pts., and that now ties them level at the top of division six on points with Bold Colliery, who have also completed their fixtures. Now the Championship will be decided on a play-off, details of where and when will be published in the local press. Well done Culcheth Eagles, it's a tremendous achievement in their first season.

Last week, the N.W. Counties Junior Leagues took on Humberside, and Leigh were not

without their representatives at all levels.

At Under 13's, the N.W. Counties ran up a mammoth ninety points without reply, with Leigh Rangers, Dean having a tremendous game. At Under 14's level, the scoreline was only slightly less emphatic, the N.W. Counties winning by fifty points to nil. Here, the Betts brothers and young Maxwell from the Rangers, plus Juniors Sykes, were all mentioned in despatches.

The Under 15's had a tougher time of it winning 28-14 pts, with Leigh representatives

being Birkhill, Mulqueeny and Ali, all from Leigh Rangers.

They were all tremendous performances, and its good to see representational honours at this level. In the near future, matches will take place, again against Hull, at Under 11's and Under 12's level, and already Juniors, Tanham, Magenty, Riding and Hudspith are included in these teams.
