

We can now officially welcome the Moroccan flyer Hussein M'Barki to Wilderspool. He has been waiting in the wings, watching 'A' Team games for a couple of weeks without being able to get back into action due to a Rugby League ban on his Registration. Also joining the club on Friday of last week were Full back Steve Diamond ex Wakefield and Dave Allen a sturdily built centre. Both players have been in limbo since last season's end with the folding of the Fulham Club and had to wait until Thursday of last week before, after court proceedings, the League accepted that they were free agents. It will take a few games for them to get back into their stride but all were prominent members of the Fulham side in happier days. Also joining

the Club is the powerhouse prop Glyn Shaw who until breaking his leg last season was first choice number eight at Central Park after years of distinguished service at Naughton Park. Pat Poasa wil be returning to N.Z. at the end of January and Glyn will, hopefully, provide us with the necessary cover, in addition to young Mark Gleave, now back in training also after a broken leg.

On Wednesday 28th November kick off 7.30 p.m. Wilderspool is the venue for the Greenall Whitley Warrington Amateur League Cup Final, On Friday 30th November Wizards are scheduled to meet Halifax 'A' at Wilderspool at 7.30 p.m. but it seems likely that the Shield Final will take place at Swinton on Saturday 1st December, Kick-off 3 p.m. Mick Peers and Tony Barrow tossed a coin after the Semi with Salford and Mick's "Heads" call won a home venue for Swinton. Wizards also meet Oldham 'A' at Wilderspool at 7.30 p.m. on Tuesday 11th December in a re-arranged game. Wire's early lamented departure from the John Player Trophy gives us a blank week next Sunday, followed by another storming game on 9th December at Wilderspool when our visitors are high riding Wigan.

You signed four players last week, how do you see them fitting in at Wilderspool? Glyn Shaw was a one off job. Pat Poasa will have to return to New Zealand in January. David Chisnall and Tony Cooke are no longer on the playing staff and we do not have a pack leader. Shaw is a proven leader, I don't need to worry about his capabilities, it is iust a matter of time in moulding the pack around him. He is not a young player but his experience will hopefully rub off on the others. Mark Gleave was looking useful but he will need time to get over a broken leg. I have been compelled to use players out of position and that affects the overall balance. As for Hussein M'Barki, Steve Diamond and Dave Allen, when the Fulham Club folded they had no club to go to. They readily accepted training facilities at Warrington and were quite happy to train under my guidance until the League sorted out the Registration problem. It was allowed to go on too long and in the end some of the players had to force the issue themselves. Now a decision has been made it is water under the bridge. They have been happy to accept terms at Wilderspool and I am happy to have them. Like Shaw they have proven track records but they have not played in a match since May, at the end of last season. Diamond and M'Marki played against Halifax, Allen is in training and will have a run or two in the 'A' Team.

How are the other injured players coming on?

This has been the problem, I cannot wait forever in the hope that Steve Hesford and John Bevan will suddenly appear and be match fit. I have tried most of the options available to me with the players who were available. I have even, against my better judgement turned out myself to find a temporary answer to the half back problem which has been made worse by Paul Cullen's absence through an injury difficult to put right. The lad is in pain, there is no question of him playing yet. Gleave is in training and Ronnie Duane has had a couple of 'A' team games. It is not easy to regain the confidence overnight after a broken leg. Ronnie don't forget is an International and a good one.


I thought you had thrown Diamond and M'Barki in at the deep end against Halifax?

In the last four games we have conceded an average of thirty points a game. If I had taken no action, I would have been wrong. Playing two players who hadn't had a match in six months has got to be a gamble. I took the gamble and it did not come off. That does not make Hussein or Steve lesser players in my eyes. The decision was mine, if it had come off I would have been praised, it didn't so I accept the flack. What I do not expect is the small minority of loudmouths who abuse players who have given years of excellent service to the Club, because of the outcome of one game. Having played Rugby for many years that is something I have never experienced before. Some of those people who call themselves 'Supporters' were in the Club Bar. Sportsmen are people who are capable of taking the rough with the smooth. One thing is certain – None of our players went on the field with the intention of not figuring in the draw for Round Two of the John Player Trophy. We will get it right because we've got to get it right and want to get it right.

Vince Gribben's six tries for Whitehaven in their John Player Trophy rout of Doncaster is a record and shoots the player to second in the League Try Scorer's list.









Last season's drawn game was a thriller from start to finish and with Oldham pushing Saints for top spot in Division One, Wire will need to regain their very best form to be in contention today.

Coached by Frank Myler who had the unenviable task of taking out the recent Aussie Tour Party, our visitors are capable of turning in fine performances against all the top sides and this season have lost only three league games, one being at home to Wires a few weeks ago, when Paul Ford scored that dramatic last minute try, converted by Bob Eccles.

Myler had no hesitation in nominating five of his own Oldham team for inclusion in the Tour Party, they being centre Des Foy a useful signing from Widnes whose searing pace has brought into prominence, Ray Ashton a classy, creative scrum half perhaps unlucky to be overshadowed by Gregory and Holding, Andy Goodway who has managed to overcome a bad boy image to become the best G.B. forward on tour, Mick Worrall, fast moving second row or loose forward who escaped the Wilderspool net and Terry Flanaghan who made the party on the suspension of H.K.R.'s Len

Casey at the 11th hour. Flanaghan can double as hooker with his customary loose forward spot. These are not the only stars, Oldham have a top class goal kicking centre in Mick Parrish who is at present on a 28 games continuous scoring run and is one short of his fifty goals for the season. Green Vigo and Jimmy Hörnby are both seasoned, pacey wingers whilst Paddy Kirwan often catches the eye when turning out in either half back position. Pack leader cum Auctioneer (he'll sell you your own braces) Mick Morgan and hooker ex Wakefield player Alan McCurrie are the play-makers up front whilst Alan Lowndes, Colin Hawkyard and Alan Platt are the runners in the back three who have to compete for places with Worrall, Flanaghan and Goodway. Watersheddings has not been immune from the Aussie influence either and coach Myler will have run the rule over Parramatta stars Paul Taylor and Chris Phelan before accepting them as part of a very useful squad of players who are bringing bigger crowds to their ground.

With the improvement in recent years now being consolidated by the coach's expertise, Oldham will be looking this season to be amongst the honours. A handy League position and last week's win at York will give them the encouragement needed to make progress in the Slalom Lager League Competition and John Player Trophy competitions. # Player Profile

## ROGER O'MAHONEY



Rochdale born Roger joined Oldham from Spotland Rangers but throughout his early career at Watersheddings he struggled to gain first team recognition. Gradually the name O'Mahoney began to appear with greater regularity and in 1976/7 he was selected for the Lancashire County Shadow Squad. Gaining such honours was difficult with Oldham at that time being one of the Leagues 'YO-YO' Teams, good enough to attain promotion but unable to consolidate in the First Division, Roger was a member of the Oldham team which defeated Wire 13-11 in a first round Floodlit Trophy game at Watersheddings back in 1977. He was also a member of the Oldham side of 1981 which not only won promotion but took the Second Division title for good measure. At the start of the 82/3 season Roger was not figuring in the Oldham line up and Wire were in desperate hooker trouble through injuries. Kevin Ashcroft asked Roger to come along to training and after one quick look said, "He'll do for me". Kevin quickly arranged the loan and Roger has been an almost permanent fixture at No. 9 since. He made his debut in the 43-5 trouncing of Huyton in the Lancashire Cup First Round and was a complete Wire player in time for the Oldham league game at Watersheddings. Despite a battling game in which he scored a try. Roger was on the losing side by 12-22. Revenge was sweet when four days later Wire defeated Oldham 16-14 in the Lancs. Cup Second Round this time at Wilderspool. Roger went on to play a significant part in Wires semi final win over Fulham but was unlucky to receive a nasty leg injury at Hull which forced him to miss the final victory over St. Helens at Central Park. After his first season at the Club Roger had made 27 appearances scoring the one try.

Rather than a memorable moment, Roger gave the Wires faithful a memorable season. In 1983/4 his performances made him a favourite at Wilderspool and earned him the Warrington Player of the Year award. He topped the appearances list with 37 (one try scored) and achieved a remarkable level of consistency.

Wire were well in the running for the League Championship towards the end of season but as other players wilted as the injuries built up Roger was going in stronger than ever showing powers of endurance which were an example to younger players in the side. His personal pleasure when Wire brought off an unexpected 14-11 win over his old side at Watersheddings will stay with my Rugby League memories forever.

Mal Meninga making his debut on 7th October has now scored nine tries in nine matches despite a thigh injury which caused his substitution last week.
