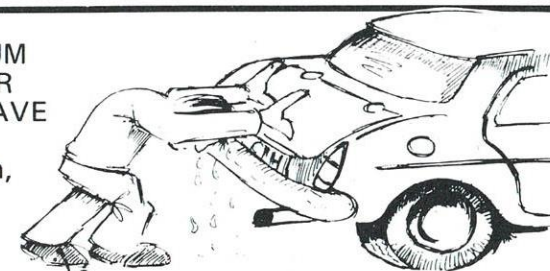

This was the match we all hoped would move us off that 10 point figure which we have had since November 4th - our last league win. Last Sunday's game was, in fact, our first league game at 'Hilton Park' since Boxing Day and it was unfortunate that we had to record yet another defeat for our faithful and patient spectators. :-

It was a game we could have won and for me we were the better team. I thought we created more play than Featherstone and I also thought our tackling and general performance was much better than of late and, in my view, better than Featherstone also.

-- and Des Drummond was told another ten days rest was essential and Derek Pyke picked up a dislocated elbow in the reserves at Widnes.

On top of those injuries Eddie Hunter is not playing because of unavoidable work commitments and Graham Worgan and Mark Thomas are both sidelined again with knee and shoulder injuries respectively.

Every Club gets its share of injuries, some long terms - some not - some serious - some not so serious but we have had someone else's share as well, I'm sure.

OLDHAM

Frank Myler's Oldham side have slipped a bit in recent weeks and after looking like Championship contenders at Christmas now seem like having to settle for a Top Eight spot after suffering one or two unexpected defeats.

There last defeat was not altogether unexpected but was their biggest defeat of the season at the Boulevard the graveyard of so many sides including ourselves.

Oldham had to go to Hull with a greatly depleted team. Des Foy and Andy Goodway were on International duty, Chris Phelan is out injured but also under suspension following his dismissal against St. Helens in the televised league game recently. Mick Worrall has been absent with a groin strain picked up in the Challenge Cup defeat against Castleford at Boundary Park and Green Vigo has not played since the cup tie either following severe concussion.

You could say that Oldham are 'Taylor' made for success having no less than three Taylor's in their side. Alan Taylor at full back is ex Wigan and Widnes having been

born close to the Naughton Park ground. Alan recently returned from the Bahamas where he has been teaching and was also recently married.

Mick Taylor is Huddersfield born and is a strong running wingman with a good future ahead of him, while the third Taylor is the Paramatta full back Paul who is playing at stand off for Frank Myler.

Paul Taylor's strongest position is scrum half but cannot win that place at Paramatta because of the presence of Peter Sterling but Paul has settled in well at Oldham and is obviously a fine utility player.

The Oldham three quarters have quite a bit of strength between them despite the absence of Green Vigo. Ian Birkby the ex Castleford lad who sank us with a last minute try at Watersheddings last season is holding down the right wing spot with the experienced Mick Parrish and Des Foy in the centres.

In the absence of Des Foy last Sunday brother Martin turned out for his first full game since

joining Oldham on loan from Wigan. Martin we are told had a very useful game.

Ray Ashton and Paddy Kirwan have 'argued' for the scrum half position for some time. The untimely injury to Ray Ashton in the early part of the season let in Paddy for an extended run but Ray has now won back the place and is again forming an excellent half back partnership with Aussie Paul Taylor.

In the pack coach Myler has a great deal of experience he can call upon, the front row at Hull at the weekend for instance was Wally Jones, Alan McCurrie and Mick Morgan - you can't argue with the experience there can you.

Colin Hawkyard in the second row has had only limited chances at Oldham during his eight years there but has done a good job for his Club and had deserved his chance.

Terry Flanagan at loose forward

is yet another Oldham International but recently became unsettled and asked for a move. This ex Saddleworth youth star has great talents, so too has out of favour forward Alan Platt who refused to return to Oldham after a loan spell at Wigan. Common-sense would seem to have prevailed and Platt returned to Oldham in time to take his place in the second row at the Boulevard. When fully fit Platt can be a valuable asset to any side and it was Platt who was instrumental in our downfall at Oldham earlier in the season.

Oldham will be hoping that Des Foy came through the International unscathed and they will also be hoping that Great Britain skipper Andy Goodway has recovered from the bout of flu which made him a non-starter in France and so weakened Great Britain's chances of success.

Down Memory Lane

September 30th, 1963 (Lancs Cup Semi-Final)

A powerful display of tough and rugged rugby saw Leigh through to their first Lancashire Cup final for eight years as they defeated Oldham 10-0 under the Hilton Park floodlights.

Leigh, top of the Second Division at the time, scored their eighth straight win to earn a place in the final against St. Helens at Station Road.

The match was a grim, dour struggle right from the start with most attempts to open play out being cancelled out by the efficient tackling of the cover defences.

So tight were the defences that it was no surprise that the first half scoring was limited to a penalty goal by Leigh full-back Colin Tyrer. But in the second half the Leigh forwards began to find the gaps and finally they were rewarded with a couple of tries.

These tries were greeted with amazing scenes of enthusiasm as hundreds of excited spectators rushed onto the ground from all directions to congratulate the scorers, Leadbetter and Large.

Leadbetter's try was rather fortunate. A kick ahead by Collins was collected by Oldham skipper Dyson but he lost the ball in Leadbetter's crash tackle and the Leigh winger got the vital touch over the line. Tyrer added two extra points with a great kick from the touchline.

Just before the end Leigh delighted the 18,000 crowd with another score. In a flowing movement Entwistle, Rhodes, Collins, Entwistle again and finally Graineley all handled to get Large in at the corner.

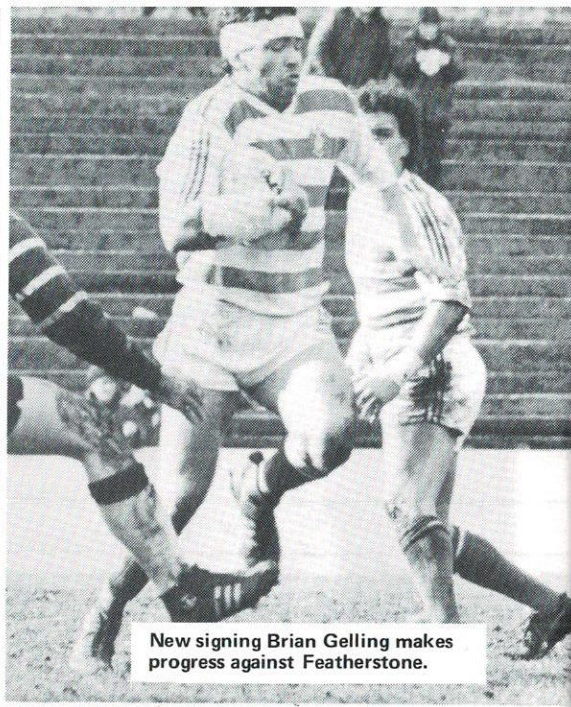
