the fore in today's game.



Hall of fame by lan Clayton

No. 5

A new series which looks at former Featherstone greats

Harold "Buff" Lord-Tennant 1892-1985

THIS week's "Hall of Fame" doubles as a belated obituary for a superb athlete who was one of the first of many local players to go on to the "money clubs".

"Buff" played his first rugby for Purston White Horse and captained their highly successful intermediate team that won the Cooke Shield in 1910. He had previously been a sprint champion who had won many honours. In 1913 "Buff" was snapped up by Hull K.R. for a fee in the region of £100 (very high for the time) and was reported to be the fastest man in the professional league at the time. It was said that the great Albert Rosenfeld would never face "Buff" on the same wing when the Robins played Huddersfield.

In his first season at Craven Park "Buff" was top try scorer with 27. On the outbreak of the First World War Hull K.R. released "Buff" from their staff and there is evidence that he turned out for Featherstone, still a junior side at the time, who had arranged fixtures with senior clubs and even appeared in unofficial war league tables.

Following the war "Buff's" career was sadly curtailed by injury, however he remained fit and went on to lead a very long life. When doing research for the Rovers history book I spoke with "Buff" and found a remarkable old gentleman with a mind as sharp as a tack and memory to match. He even recalled what time train he caught from Baghill to Hull and apparently in 1913 it cost 7/6d return!!

I am indebted to Alan Tennant, himself a former Royers favourite for help with this article and for the loan of the fine old photograph.



Rovers Review



A new series which looks at past encounters between today's opponents and Rovers.

In the league Championship there have been, 25 encounters at Post Office Road. Oldham very slightly, have the edge with 12 wins whilst two games have been drawn. Rovers best win came in 1943/44 with a 35-5 scoreline. Oldham's best was a 30-8 victory in 1958/59. The first ever league clash between the two at Post Office Road resulted in a 3-0 win for "The Roughyeds" back in 1921/22. At the Watersheddings Oldham again hold the the upper hand with 16 wins from 24 league encounters. Oldham scored an emphatic 53-15 win in 1923/24, whilst Featherstone in their best 'away' victory could only manage a 24-22 scoreline in 1968/69. The league encounter of 1949/50 at Oldham resulted in a 15 a piece result, the only ever draw between the two in Lancashire.

In the R.L. Challange Cup "The Colliers" have played "The Roughyeds" on just three occasions. As long ago as 1925 a quarter final tie at The Watersheddings resulted in an easy 26-0 win for the home team. Then in a first round tie over two leas in 1945 also showed the Lancashire men to be superior, winning 18-4 at Featherstone and narrowly 8-7 "on their own midden". Rovers were again put out of the competition in 1963/64 by Oldham to the tune of a 9-7 result. This after Rovers had won in the previous round 60-4 over amateur club Stanningley.

The only other encounter between the two I have in my records was in a competition organised by I.T.V. in 1955/56. Oldham won
