





Today's Visitors

Today we welcome our visitors from over the Pennines, Oldham. After a disatrous start to the season, the Roughyheds have found some good form with high scoring victories over Salford, Warrington and Castleford, they earned an excellent point away to League leaders Widnes last Sunday and are unbeaten in their last five outings.

Oldham always play well at Odsal and have in fact won on four of their last six visits, Northern's victories being by 14—8 in August 1983 and 21—10 in September 1980. Oldham completed a League double over us last season with wins by 23—14 here a year ago and 16—14 at the Watersheddings in a re-arranged night match in January.

Their last trophy win was the Second Division Rose Bowl Championship Trophy in 1981-82, since their promotion they have proved to be capable of brilliant rugby, but lack of consistency has prevented them from joining the elite in the First Division's top four, they finished fifth last season four points behind fourth placed Leeds.

They are sure to bring their usual strong following today and under the guiding hand of former British tour supremo Frank Myler, their skilful team seem set, yet again, to prove a handful for our lads as we seek to climb the table.

Their staff is as follows:

FRANK MYLER, Coach

A truly great British middle back of the post-war era making 24 appearances for Britain, being the only man to appear in both the 1960 and 1970 World Cups, he toured in 1966 and in 1970. As tour captain he became the last British skipper to bring home the Ashes. He won the Harry Sunderland Trophy with St. Helens in the 1970 Championship Final joining Saints from home town Widnes with whom he starred for 11 seasons, including scoring a try in the 1964 Wembley win. His 34 tries for the Chemics in 1958-59 still stands as a club record.

He was coach of Widnes when they won their solitary championship in 1977-78, an achievement that won him the Trumanns Coach of the Year award. He has also coached Rochdale and Swinton before joining Oldham, and was of course, Great Britain tour coach in 1984.

BRIAN GARTLAND, Coach

St. Helens born coach who has spent most of his career in the Oldham area coaching the Oldham Colts and Reserve grade sides in recent seasons before stepping up to First Team duties in the middle of the

1983-84 season, doing an excellent job for the club in a crisis period which saw the resignations in quick succession of former coaches Dave Cox and Frankie Barrow.

DAVID TOPLISS, Stand Off (Captain)

Aged 35, height 5 ft. 8 ins., weight 11 st. 2 lb. A former Normanton Junior who served Wakefield Trinity brilliantly for 13 seasons, winning the Lance Todd Trophy in the 1979 Wembley defeat. Played for Penrith Panthers in the mid-seventies and joined Hull F.C. in 1981, captaining the Airlie Birds to six major finals, his finest hour being the 1982 Challenge Cup replay with Widnes at Elland Road, scoring two tries of outstanding courage and importance. His brilliance gained him only four caps making his debut versus the 1973 Aussies at Wembley and his last as captain in the Final Test at Headingley in 1982. Was a replacement tourist in 1979 and has scored over 200 tries in a great career. Joined Oldham this summer.

DAVID LIDDIARD, Full Back

Age 24. An Australian in his first season in England has earned rave reviews for his attacking play from

full back berth. Signed from Parramatta Eels but will return to play for the Penrith Panthers at the end of the British season.

HUSSEIN M'BARKI, Winger

Age 29. Was brought to England by Fulham in 1981 for £25,000 from the French club Cahors, traded under the name of Des Smith for a while at Craven Cottage and became one of only seven players to score a try against the 1982 Australians in Fulham's tour match. Joined the exodus to Warrington last season before joining Oldham. The first and only Moroccan player in British Rugby League.

DES FOY, Middle Back

Age 21. Boy wonder who signed for Widnes in July 1980 for a then record £17,000 contract from Saddleworth Rangers after playing for England Schoolboys. Made only 18 appearances for the Chemics before transferring to Oldham in January 1983, Scored a try on his Test debut in Avignon in January 1984 and went on the 1984 tour playing at stand off opposite the great Wally Lewis in the first Test at Sydney Cricket Ground, his only Test appearance on tour.

MICK PARRISH, Centre

Age 27. Signed from Hunslet for £20,000 in September 1980 whom he had joined from Morley R.U.F.C. Is the only man in the history of the game to play and score in every match in a season for two different clubs, Hunslet in 1979-80 and Oldham in 1981-82. The elder brother of our Steve.

MICK TAYLOR, Winger

This is Mick's second season at the Watersheddings being signed from Huddersfield Amateur club Britannia Works (now Paddock).

RAY ASHTON, Scrum Half

Age 25. Widnes born half back signing for Oldham in 1978, went on tour in 1984 as third choice number seven to Holding and Gregory, injuries ruining his tour, playing in only four matches.

WALLY JONES, Open Prop

Signed from Rochdale H., the rugged prop was Oldham's Player of the Year in 1983-84 and was at one point in Frank Myler's pre 1984 tour Great Britain training squad.

IAN SANDERSON, Hooker

Age 20. The Leigh born player has come through the ranks at Oldham, given his chance he has retained his place on merit, playing well.

MICK MORGAN, Blind Side Prop

Ageless trouper who is taking a Rugby League approved benefit this season celebrating 20 years as a pro. A star for Yorkshire in the War of the Roses match this season Mick has found fame as an auctioneer with the Rugby League Roadshow.

TERRY FLANAGAN, Second Row

Age 24. Signed from Saddleworth in 1979, was club captain at only 19, captaining the side to the Second Division title. Was Britain's lock v France in the 1983 Tests and went on tour as a late replacement for Arkwright playing in two Tests in 1984.

DAVID HOBBS, Second Row

A club record £40,000 signing from Featherstone who has one of the few 84 tour successes. Seems unfortunate to be out of this season's Test squad, won the Lance Todd Trophy at Wembley in 1983.

GARY WARNECKE, Loose Forward

Signed from Wests, Sydney, and scored the try that earned a valuable draw at Naughton Park last Sunday, Can also play centre.

MAL GRAHAM, Second Row

Injured today, Mal found fame with Hunslet last season being outstanding in the side relegated to Division Two. A Newcastle, N.S.W. player.

PADDY KIRWAN, Half Back

Signed with Ashton and Flanagan in 1979 from Oldham Colts, creative player, graduate of Manchester University, also played for Saddleworth.


MICK WORRALL, Forward

Age 23. Warrington born former Colt, went on tour in 1984 playing in two Tests versus Australia. Guested for Brisbane Norths this summer but has suffered a knee injury in his first match back, that will probably keep him out today.

DAVID FINCH, Forward

Age 27. On loan from Castleford for whom he kicked two goals against Northern in the 1981-82 Yorkshire Cup Final.

ALLIANCE LEAGUE FIXTURES CASTLEFORD "A" 20 v BRADFORD NORTHERN "A" 16

Northern lost ground in the Alliance League leadership by letting a game slip away from them against Castleford. Northern at one stage led 16—10, but they allowed the home side to hit back to win 20—16.

Our new Australian forward signing Ash Lumby made his debut and celebrated with a try. The other Northern try scorers were Steve Pullen and John Hamer with Martin Potts landing two goals.

Incidentally I noticed that Ash has soon acquired our English eating habits when I saw him tucking into a bag of chips and a fist full of beefburgers from the vendor behind the stand at the Great Britain Under-21 v New Zealand game.

BRADFORD NORTHERN "A" 16 v WIGAN "A" 16

This Alliance League fixture was one of the two inter-county games that our "A" Team are involved with this season. As the score suggests this was a closely contested game, and was a game of two halves with Northern finishing in front at half-time.

Steve Pullen put Northern 2-0 in front with a good goal in the first quarter hour of the game. The visitors were so intent on letting Northern know they hadn't come over the Pennines for nothing and their experience earned the referee's displeasure on more than one occasion. They were being well lead by two players with plenty of First Team experience, front rower Danny Campbell and scrum half Jimmy Fairhurst, who were responsible for Wigan taking the lead at 6-2.

The game continued to be competative and flowed end to end and Heath Godfrey leveled the score with a well taken try and Steve Pullen extended it for Northern to lead 8-6.

Once again Wigan got on the wrong side of the referee and their back chat enabled Northern to enter their 25. From a play the ball situation lan Sheldon eagerly back after his suspension caught the Wigan defence on the wrong foot to score near enough to the posts for Steve Pullen to kick his third goal and take Northern in at half-time leading 14-6 in attack Wigan had looked the more enterprising but Northern cancelled this out with some stout defensive work.

In the second period Wigan monopolised the scrums and early on reduced the lead to 14—12 with a try that all Rugby League followers love to see. The ball coming from the pack at the loose forwards feet, thus obscuring the scrum half from the opposition who made yards before handing on to his stand off who continued the advance and put his centre in under the posts.

For the rest of the half the game was even and Northern with the aid of another Steve Pullen goal put Northern further in front at 16—12 after Wigan had been penalised and taken back another 10 yards and their scrum half banished to the sin bin. For the last quarter Northern saw little of the ball and the referee was adding to the frustration by turning his attention to Northern. The decision went against us and of course right under the sticks which allowed the visitors to draw level at 16-16, and we all left disappointed at not seeing a Northern victory when they are going so well in the Alliance League.

The next Alliance home fixture at Horsfall Playing Fields is scheduled for Saturday, 9th November against Hull Kingston Rovers, kick-off 3.00 p.m.





CLIVE SULLIVAN, M.B.E.

A tribute to the former Great Britain captain who died last month from cancer at the age of 42.

It is only fitting that we were at Bradford Northern should pay our own tribute to the memory of Clive Sullivan. As his long and illustrious career began and ended here at Odsal.

Born and bred in Cardiff, Clive was playing Rugby Union in the army when Northern invited him for a trial in 1961. He travelled north knowing nothing of Rugby League except that it was the game

his fellow Welsh countryman Billy Boston played.

Northern rejected Clive after his solitary reserve trial match, but fate was to step in as the dejected winger waited at the bus stop outside the stadium. Also waiting at the bust stop was Jim Harker who had been one of the touch judges that day, Jim offered to fix Clive up with a trial with his

harker who had been one of the touch judges that day, Jim offered to fix Clive up with a trial with his hometown club of Hull, Clive accepted the offer, arriving at the Boulevard a week later expecting another reserve outing. Instead he found himself on First Team duty versus Bramley, on Hull's other wing was their South African signing Wilf Rosenberg, also making his debut, but it was Sully, playing as A. N. Other who stole the glory. Eighty minutes and a try hat-trick later he was signed on immediately by Hull, the start of a 24 year association with Humberside rugby. The rest is history, despite several major operations to cure a serious thigh muscle injury and a car crash that nearly killed him, Clive's career was a great one. He gained his first Great Britain cap versus France in Carcassone in 1967, his long range try earning him the tag "la Rapide" from the French crowd. He played for Britain down under in the 1968 World Cup being acclaimed as the world's number one winger by the Australian Rugby League press. He also toured with Britain in 1970 — the last Ashes winning side — and with Wales for the 1975 World Cup. He served Hull F.C. for 13 seasons before his switch across the river to Kingston Rovers in 1974, his record of 250 tries for Hull and 118 for Rovers being likely to stand for all time.

He won Challenge Cup Winners medals with Rovers at Wembley in 1980, in the emotion charged all Humberside Final and with Hull F.C. in the unforgettable Elland Road replay with Widnes in 1982, being recalled for the replay at the age of 39.

Clive made 17 full appearances for Britain, including eight as skipper, being captain of the 1972 World Cup winning squad in France. He also made 10 appearances for Wales. Clive was a former coach to Hull F.C. and also a former Hull Schools liaison officer, he appeared on "This is Your Life" in 1972, being the only Rugby League player to receive such an honour, his 1974 M.B.E. was just reward for his services to the game and his adopted city of Kingston-upon-Hull.

Sully played one season for Oldham in 1980-81 and had a brief spell as player/coach at Doncaster, but was fated to wear the famous black and white Hull jersey again, offering his services to the club at the end of last season and in fact making his last ever senior appearance as back substitute here as recently as 23rd April.

Tens of thousands of Rugby League supporters will hold cherished memories of Clive Sullivan, M.B.E., a gentleman and sportsman without peer, the outstanding one being his televised 100 yard solo try against Australia at Lyon that won the 1972 World Cup for Britain.

The sight of the proud and elegant British captain running straight down the touchline for that marvellous try is etched indelibly in the memories of all who were privileged to see it.

It remains a memory that British Rugby League supporters will never forget.

I know I never will.
