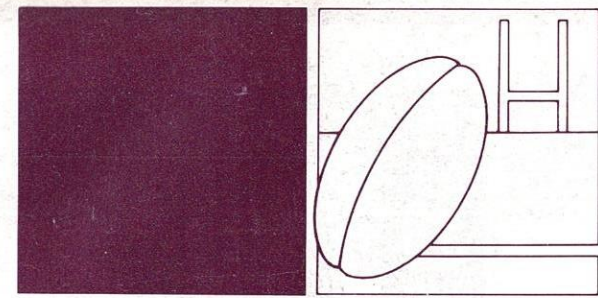

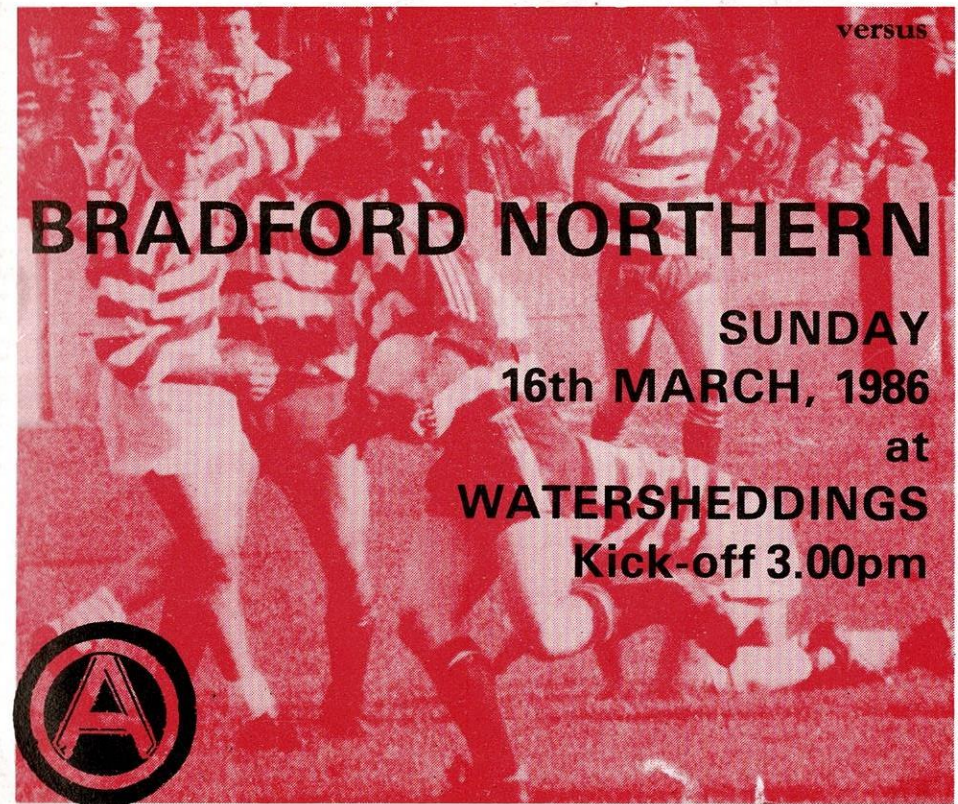

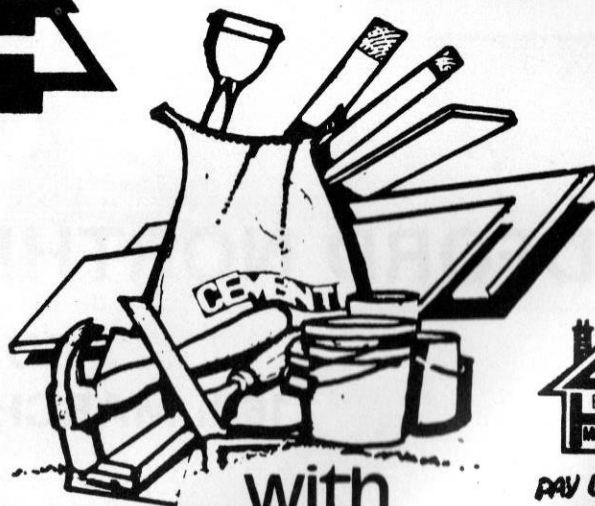

WATERSHEDDINGS SURVEY

IT is a big day today for the Oldham club, with our first appearance in the third round of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup since we lost 6-5 to St Helens here at Watersheddings in 1981.

We earned the right to meet Bradford Northern today with that memorable 13-6 win over Warrington last Sunday and congratulations are in order for all concerned.

It was essentially a team victory that put Warrington on the slide, but special mention must be made of the forwards, who produced a marvellous performance to boss the Wires' six.

We scored tries either side of half-time through Mick Worrall and Des Foy, the former a solo effort and the latter a brilliant team try which Des finished off in fine fashion after slick handling by Ray Ashton, Mal Graham and Ian Sanderson.

Worrall improved both tries and an early drop goal by Ashton completed our scoring. It was certainly a case of lucky 13 this time.

Unfortunately, we suffered an injury only a few minutes from time which puts skipper Mal Graham out of the action today. Mal suffered a severe ear injury which required specialist attention in Highfield Nursing Home at Rochdale last Sunday night.

There were hopes early on that he might be fit, but it soon became apparent that he could not possibly be ready in time to play in the third round today.

The draw for the third round was made on television last Monday morning and we were first out of the hat and paired with the winners of the replay between Bradford and Bramley, who drew 20-20 at Odsal last Sunday.

It meant that we did not know who our opponents would be until Wednesday night, but there was never any doubt on the night with Northern sweeping to an easy victory.

They are bound to be coming here today with spirits high and it will take the sort of commitment and endeavour we displayed last Sunday if we are to advance into the last four for the first time since those memorable 1964 clashes with Hull KR.

May we take this opportunity to apologise to those fans who were inconvenienced last Sunday due to the mix-up over some seats and tickets. We are sorry for the inconvenience caused and we immediately implemented steps to try to ensure that it does not happen again.

Over the past few months we have "lost" a lot of seats due to alterations in the stand under ground safety regulations, and we have now renumbered seats and adjusted blocks in a new administrative system that should prevent problems arising again.

You will no doubt know, having read the press, that we have had to altar our main stand paddock, again for ground safety reasons.

We have to restrict the number of fans who stand in the paddock on either side of the players' tunnel and the only way we can do that is to enclose the area and control numbers coming in.

Considerable work has been involved in this, not only in blocking off the ends of the paddock, but in altering or replacing exit doors at the back of the stand.

We will also need to employ many more stewards, not only at today's game but at subsequent games, so there is quite a lot involved.

There will be a 50p admission charge to the paddock for today's tie, but we would like to point out that this extra 50p will not be charged to standing members in the remaining league games this season.

We have had long discussions with the safety officers this week and another outcome is that the forthcoming Wigan game, which will attract our biggest crowd of the season, will be an all-ticket affair... probably our first all-ticket match here at Watersheddings for many years.

It is due to be played next Sunday but if either Wigan or Oldham are involved in the first semi-final of the Challenge Cup next Saturday it will obviously have to be played at a later date.

Finally, may we wish the team good luck in today's tie.

WELCOME TO BRADFORD

SPOTLIGHT ON BRADFORD

BRADFORD earned the right to come to Watersheddings today for this third-round Silk Cut Challenge cup-tie by virtue of their resounding victory at Bramley on Wednesday night in a second-round replay.

The Second Division side held Northern to a 20-20 draw at Odsal in the first clash last Sunday, but there was seldom any doubt which side was the stronger in the replay and Bradford ran out comfortable winners to put themselves in the right mood for today's quarter-final encounter.

They beat another Second Division side — Wakefield in a televised first-round tie on the heated pitch at Headingley and with little chance of honours in the league they will be coming here today with all guns blazing.

In recent times the Bradford side has taken on a completely fresh look with the world-record sale of Ellery Hanley to Wigan and the signing of such accomplished and pacy backs as John Woods from Leigh and Steve Donlan and Phil Ford from Wigan.

All those captures caught the headlines, but none more so than the sensational signing of Wales and British Lions RU scrum-half star Terry Holmes earlier this season.

The capture of men like Woods, Donlan, Ford and Holmes shows that Bradford mean business in their attempts to put Northern back at the top of the Rugby League tree.

Sadly, in his first game in the professional code at Swinton, Holmes dislocated a shoulder which put him out of action for several weeks. Then, on his return at Odsal in an 'A' team game, he suffered a recurrence.

This was a bad blow for Northern and all people with Rugby League at heart will wish him a speedy recovery so that he can display on the RL fields of the North the talent and courage that made him a firm favourite with the demanding Welsh RU fans for so long.

With or without Holmes, however, Northern have a line-up which, on paper, can match up to the best.

Full back Keith Mumby is one of the most experienced in the game and has been with the club since signing as a 16-year-old in 1973. He has toured twice, in 1979 and 1984, and was the First Division player of the year in 1983.

Ford and Donlan form a right flank that has pace, skill and finishing power. Centre Donlan made his name with Leigh, transferred to Wigan, and toured in 1984.

Winger Ford, a Welshman, came north to sign for Warrington in 1981. He moved to Wigan for £40,000 in February, 1985, and later on to Odsal as part of the Ellery Hanley deal.

Veteran David Redfearn, left centre, is an Odsal stalwart of many years standing while his left-wing partner is young Roger Simpson, a talented lad with pace who has earned Great Britain colts honours and is tipped for a big future in the game.

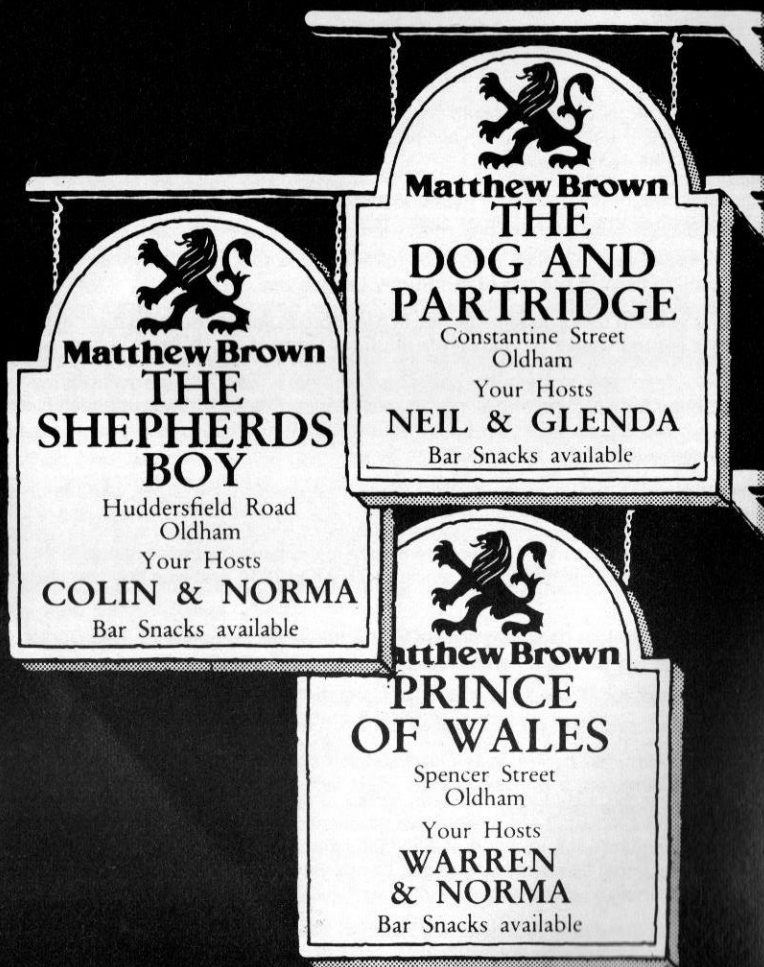
Stand-off Woods needs no introduction. A £65,000 signing from Leigh at the start of the season, Woods is one of the most lethal finishers in the game. Dangerous from any part of the field, he can create and score tries out of nothing and has established several scoring records.

Scrum-half Heath Godfrey is a youngster who earned his chance at No. 7 following the injury to Holmes and the departure of Dean Carroll to Carlisle.

It's goodbye now to the international season until the arrival of the Australian touring side next October for what promises to be a tremendous Test series.

Britain's boss Maurice Bamford, assistant Phil Larder along with manager Les Bettinson can look back with a great deal of satisfaction on this season's internationals.

When we consider that New Zealand came here as clear favourites to take the series after their performances against the Aussies, Britain did well to square a marvellous series.

It was a pity we did not take the series because we had that memorable First Test in our grasp and let it slip.

There was no doubting Britain's supremacy in the Second Test and clearly the loss of Tony Myler in the Third drawn encounter proved as big a handicap to Britain as New Zealand's loss of Mark Gibson in the Second.

But the crowds, which were very encouraging in size, enjoyed some superb football and the moments of fierce exchanges you come to expect in a decider that Australian referee Barry Gomersall allowed to get out of hand.

Perhaps after the way New Zealand whipped the French 22-0 in the two Tests we expected to hand out similar treatment.

But French pride finally surfaced under new coach Tas Baitieri and the 10-10 draw in Avignon flattered Britain in the end.

Still the right approach and spirit earned us a 24-10 win in the Second Test at Wigan despite the loss of four key members of the squad.

It was a bonus to see Halifax's Neil James emerge as such a fine prospect in the second row where Leeds star Kevin Rayne stepped in for a successful first run.

Castleford's Tony Marchant took the eye in the centre with strong, direct running that we needed behind the talented Tony Myler.

Marchant is another player to look to in the future because he seems to have the right approach which is as important these days as having ability.

Bamford has emphasised that Britain will step up their preparation for Australia's visit when a squad is named in September.

You can bet that the Aussies will bring a strong squad and it is essential we have plenty of depth if we are to make a real challenge to regain the Ashes trophy.

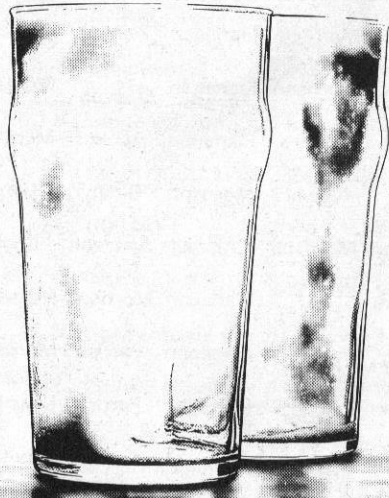

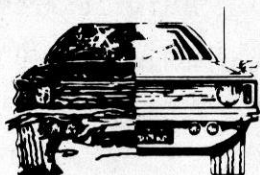
