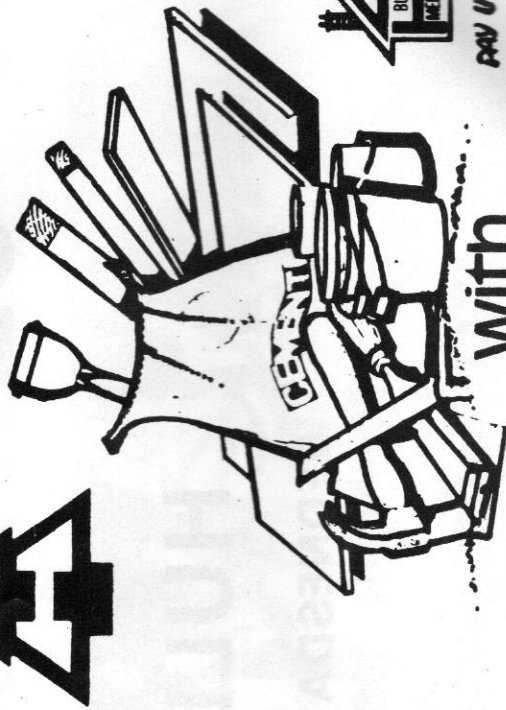

WATERSHEDDINGS SURVEY

TONIGHT we stage our penultimate home game of the season with the visit of Hull. Sadly, three consecutive home defeats by St Helens, Bradford Northern and Featherstone mean that it is now unlikely that we will qualify for the top-eight play-off.

The way recent results have gone for us, since those two good away wins over Easter at Swinton and Wigan, can be put down to several factors.

A smallish squad...the fixture pile-up...cruel luck with injuries...the aftermath of what the run to the cup semi-final took out of us both physically and mentally.

All these factors have had some part to play and we can only hope that, having had a week off since the Featherstone game, the players will be more on their mettle tonight.

Unfortunately, we suffered more injury blows against Rovers with Mick Parrish having to retire in the first half due to a broken jaw which was later wired; David Hobbs being forced to quit with a torn hamstring; Keith Atkinson also having to leave the field with a dislocated finger in which the ligaments were also torn.

We will certainly not see Mick Parrish again this season and it is unlikely that either David Hobbs or Keith Atkinson will be fit to appear in our last four games against Hull tonight, Hull K.R. away on Friday, St Helens away on Sunday and Wigan at home next Tuesday night.

We are merely hoping that Terry Flanagan, Des Foy and Wally Jones will be fit to play tonight, while we also have several long-standing injury victims such as David Finch and David Topliss.

Of course, this is where a strong squad comes into its own and you cannot have a strong squad without the money to fund it.

Wherever players come from — overseas, the junior game or other English clubs — they cost money to buy.

That is why it is absolutely essential that we have a successful Development Association and why we urge all and supporters of the club to give their utmost backing to Tom Morley and his commercial "team."

Tom and his team are doing a good job both locally and nationally in "selling" the club to potential customers whether they be the man in the street buying his lottery ticket or the multi-national firm prepared to spend considerable money on advertising and sponsorship.

We can now reveal that, in talks last week with Nike rep Nigel Melville, the England RU scrum-half, we have landed a sponsorship deal for playing kit and sports gear worth £10,000 for the 1986-7 season.

We are also involved in talks with YTS and a national firm of contractors with a view to finding employment for youngsters with rugby talent.

All these schemes are for the long-term betterment of the club, and the development association would like to pass on their thanks to all those local people who have backed them in so many ways over the past few weeks.

We had a successful buffet lunch for the lucky Lifeline members who drew horses in the Grand National and we have heard several complimentary remarks since about our hospitality.

The Lifeline may also get another boost later in the year with the staging of a major concert featuring either Jasper Carrott or Bev Bevan of ELO.

Also, we had a highly successful evening recently at Royton Assembly Hall when committee man Eddie Bayliss organised a sporting dinner with entertainment and all-in wrestling.

The commercial department has invoiced more than £10,000 worth of advertising to come in over the next few months and it is pleasing to report, too, that lottery sales are rising.

Tom Morley also has several more schemes up his sleeve, including the launching of a monthly paper, probably called the RoughYeds News, and he is on the look-out for potential advertisers and contributors.

He also intends to re-design a new programme in time for next season.

WELCOME TO HULL

OVER the past few years Hull have remained one of Rugby League's strongest sides — and they remain so to this day. The bumper Boulevard gates of a season or two ago may be on the decline, but there is no doubt that Hull are potentially one of the strongest clubs in the game.

The list of Hull honours in the past few seasons makes interesting reading — champions in 1983 and runners-up in 1982 and 1984; Rugby League Challenge Cup winners in 1982 and runners-up in 1980, 1983 and 1985.

John Player Trophy winners in 1982 and runners-up in 1985; BBC2 Floodlit Trophy winners in 1979; Slalom Lager Premiership runners-up in 1981, 1982 and 1983; Yorkshire Cup winners in 1982, 1983 and 1984.

Need anyone say more to show the massive impact Hull have had on the Rugby League scene in the last five years.

The crowds have rolled in to the Boulevard to watch big-name players from both this country and overseas. Five-figure crowds were common-place until this season and several receipts records were smashed in 1982 and 1983.

In March, 1982, receipts for a State Express Challenge Cup quarter-final tie with Halifax totalled £20,578 — a Boulevard record for a cup-tie.

In November of the same year, when Hull clashed with the all-conquering Kangaroos, receipts totalled £29,058, and in the following April a massive crowd for the First Division derby with Hull KR paid £21,700 — a league game record for the Boulevard.

That, then, has been the Hull success story over the past few years — big games, big crowds, and big personalities.

When building up their team of all talents Hull's management made a three-pronged attack — on overseas talent, on the home market, and on the amateur youth game.

Among the stars bought for big money from other English clubs were Steve Norton, Trevor Skerrett, David Topliss, Steve Evans, Paul Rose, Charlie Stone, Charlie Birdsall and Sammy Lloyd.

From overseas came New Zealanders James Leuluai, Fred Al Kouli, Gary Kemble, and Dane O'Hara, Frenchman Patrick Solal, and, more recently, Australians Peter Sterling, John Muggleton, and Geoff Gerrard.

From the youth game came Lee Crooks, Shaun Patrick, Gary Schofield, Gary Divorty, and Andy Dannatt, among many others.

Hull have been involved in most of the big finals over the past few years. The experience of their players at the highest level is second to none, though it is true to relate that, with the exception of our heavy defeat at the Boulevard with almost an 'A' team in action earlier this season, we have put up several stunning displays to shock Hull since our promotion to the First Division in 1982.

We have won at the Boulevard — not many teams do that — and who will forget that interception try by David Topliss, which gave Hull victory here in the last few minutes of a match which we had totally dominated.

Only a handful of players have played for both the Oldham and Hull clubs, among them Barry Kear, the late Clive Sullivan and more recently Dave Topliss, who is now our skipper, having joined us as a free agent from the Boulevard during last summer.

Clive, who died recently, had a brief spell here at Watersheddings towards the end of a glittering career in which he was a firm favourite for both the Hull and Hull KR clubs, captained Great Britain to World Cup glory, and will long be remembered as one of our game's greatest players.

He scored 250 tries for Hull between 1961-1974 and 1981-2.

David Topliss also made a big impact at the Boulevard and reached the pinnacle of his Hull career when he scored two tries in that memorable Challenge Cup final replay of 1982 against Widnes at Elland Road, to lift the coveted Challenge Cup on a night which will be etched forever in the talk lore of Hull FC.
