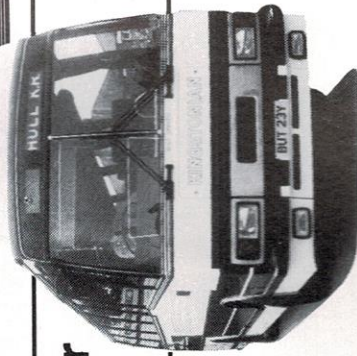

Our Visitors

Tonight, just midway in our final sequence of home league matches, we bid a welcome to Oldham. Still one of the few remaining Members clubs in the league, rather than a Limited Company, they are also one of the few First Division sides yet to reach Wembley. Indeed when they contested the semi-final a few weeks ago it was the first time they have qualified for this stage of the competition since 1964, when our two clubs played out a protracted semi-final.

Just before Christmas Oldham were topping the table. Since then they have fallen away somewhat and as these notes are being compiled they are striving to ensure they retain a top 8 place.

Since they were last at Craven Park Oldham have lost a couple of their leading players. One of the great personalities of Rugby League, **Mick Morgan** has retired over a dispute whether he is a free agent, which has aborted a proposed short term transfer to York. **David Liddiard**, a full back from Sydney, has returned to Penrith Panthers without the club being able to make full use of his undoubted abilities; a broken jaw, two dismissals, and weather enforced match postponements all combined to limit his appearances.

Younger brother **Glen**, a 16 year old youngster who came over to England on holiday from school ended up playing as an amateur at wing and off half, and thus became the youngest player ever to appear in a Challenge Cup semi-final.

Liddiard's replacement at full back **Keith Atkinson** has sustained a broken jaw and will miss the remaining matches this season.

Frank Myler: Coach. A truly great British middle back of the post-war era, Widnes born Frank played for his home town team. His 34 tries for the Chemics in 1958-59 still stand as a club record and he started with them for eleven seasons before moving to St. Helens in 1967. In the four years he was at Knowsley Road he won Lancashire Cup and Championship winning medals, and was the Harry Sunderland Trophy winner in 1970. He made 24 appearances for Britain, being the only man to appear in both the 1960 and 1970 World Cups. He toured in 1966 and in 1970. As Tour Captain he became the last British skipper to bring home the Ashes. He moved on to Rochdale where he became player-coach. He also coached Widnes when they won their solitary Championship in 1977/78 an achievement that won him the Trumann's Coach of the Year Award. He coached Swinton before first taking over at Oldham in 1981. After 18 months in charge of the Great Britain side, Frank returned to Oldham last season and quickly transformed them into a side capable of winning honours.

Brian Gartland: Assistant Coach. St. Helens born coach who has spent most of his career in the Oldham area coaching the Oldham Colts and reserve grade sides in recent seasons before stepping up to first team duties in the middle of the 1983/84 season, doing an excellent job for the club in a crisis period which saw the resignations in quick succession of former coaches Dave Cox and Frank Barrow.

Alan Taylor: Full back. A signing from Swinton in 1981, Alan has also played for Widnes. After establishing himself at Oldham he left this country with his wife to take up a post in Bermuda teaching handicapped children. He returned last season and got his first team place back, only to lose it to David Liddiard this season. With Liddiard now back in Australia, Alan is back in contention, but on the transfer list.

Hussein M'Barki: Wing: 29. Was brought to England by Fulham in 1981 for £25,000 from the French club Cahors, traded under the name of Des Smith for a while at Craven Cottage and became one of only seven players to score a try against the 1982 Australians, during Fulham's Tour match. Joined the exodus to Warrington last season before being released by them and moving on to Oldham. The first and only Moroccan player in British Rugby League.

Des Foy: Centre or off half: 21. Boy wonder who signed for Widnes in July 1980 for a then record £17,000 contract from Saddleworth Rangers after playing for England Schoolboys. Made only 18 appearances for the Chemics before transferring to Oldham in January 1983. Scored a try on his Test debut in Avignon in January 1984 and went on the 1984 Tour playing at stand off opposite the great Wally Lewis in the First Test at Sydney Cricket Ground, his only Test appearance on tour.

Mick Parrish: Centre: 27. Signed from Hunslet for £20,000 in September 1980 whom he had joined from Morley R.U.F.C. Is the only man in the history of the game to play and score in every match in a season for two different clubs, Hunslet in 1979/80 and Oldham in 1981/82. The elder brother of Bradford centre Steve, he has just had a broken jaw wired.

Mick Taylor: Wing. This is Mick's second season at the Watersheddings, being signed from Huddersfield Amateur club Britannia Works (now Paddock).

David Topliss: Off half and captain: 35: 5' 8": 11st. 2lbs. A former Normanton junior who served Wakefield Trinity brilliantly for 13 seasons, winning the Lance Todd Trophy in their 1979 Wembley defeat. Played for Penrith Panthers in the mid 70's and joined Hull F.C. in 1981, captaining the Airlie Birds to six major finals, his finest hour being the 1982 Challenge Cup replay with Widnes at Elland Road, scoring two tries of outstanding courage and importance. Nevertheless his brilliance gained him only four caps, making his debut versus the 1973 Aussies at Wembley and his last as captain in the Final Test at Headingley in 1982. Was a replacement tourist in 1979 and has scored over 200 tries in a great career. Joined Oldham last summer, but has only recently returned to action after receiving a neck injury in a car accident.

Ray Ashton: Scrum half: 25. Widnes' born half back signing for Oldham in 1978. He went on tour in 1984 as third choice No. 7 to Holding and Gregory, but injuries ruined his Tour, restricting him to playing in only four matches.

Paddy Kirwan: Scrum half. Signed with Ashton and Terry Flanagan in 1979 from Oldham Colts, a creative player and graduate of Manchester University, who also played for Saddleworth.

Wally Jones: Prop. Signed from Rochdale Hornets, the rugged prop was Oldham's Player of the Year in 1983-84 and was at one point in Frank Myler's pre-1984 Tour Great Britain Training Squad.

Martin Hall: Hooker: 17. Oldham's latest signing, the son of former Oldham and Blackpool Borough forward Fred Hall. When his father played for Oldham, Martin was the club mascot. Later he played for Lancashire Schools and was in the England Schools squad. He signed for Oldham a couple of weeks ago from Waterhead Juniors, having also earned Lancashire Under 17 honours.

Ian Sanderson: Hooker: 20. A Leigh born player who has come through the ranks at Oldham and when given his chance following the suspension and subsequent transfer of Alan McCurrie he has retained his place on merit.

Mick Worrall: Prop: 23. Warrington born former Colt who went on tour in 1984 playing in two Tests versus Australia. Guested for Brisbane Norths last summer. **David Hobbs:** Prop or second row. A club record £40,000 signing from Featherstone Rovers who had been one of the few 1984 Tour successes. Seems unfortunate to have been out of this season's Test squad, he won the Lance Todd Trophy for his two try display against Hull at Wembley in 1983. Recently suffered a torn hamstring, keeping him out today.

Terry Flanagan: Second row: 24. Signed from Saddleworth in 1979, was club captain at only 19, captaining the side to the Second Division title. Was Britain's loose forward versus France in the 1983 Tests and went on tour as a late replacement for Arkwright playing in two Tests in 1984.

Mal Graham: Second row. Mal found fame with Hunslet last season, being outstanding in the side although they were relegated to Division Two. A Newcastle, New South Wales player and typical aggressive Australian forward.

David Finch: Second row: 27. On loan from Castleford for whom he kicked two goals against Bradford Northern in the 1981/82 Yorkshire Cup Final. An outstanding goal kicker, he has also had a lot of experience on the wing.

Gary Warnecke: Loose forward. Signed from Wests, Sydney, and scored the try that earned a valuable draw at Naughton Park. Can also play centre.

Craven Park, Hull is one of Terry Flanagan's favourite grounds. The Test forward has always enjoyed his visits to the Robins although success has been hard to come by.

And despite their defeat in the recent John Player tie he is looking forward to today's visit by Oldham.

He said: "Oldham are a big-game side. We raise our game for the big occasion and playing Rovers at Craven Park certainly qualifies for the 'Big Game' tag."

Only a point separated the teams a couple of weeks ago and Flanagan says that Oldham are determined to go two better this time.

"We have got some top class players playing at peak form in a side full of team spirit. That should put us in with a great chance of beating Rovers this time."

And Flanagan recalled an occasion not many seasons ago when Oldham,

again, came close to winning at Craven Park. He recalled: "We were trailing 16-0 and reduced to 12 men when Alan Platt broke his leg, and then we had Andy Goodway sent off. But we will managed to fight back and draw 16-16."

"Craven Park pulled the best out of us and me in particular."

Tourist Flanagan believes that Oldham are now capable of reaching the potential they have promised for the last two decades. He explained: "We have now got strength in depth at the club and since the arrival of our Australian trio we have added that vital missing ingredient — pace."

"We have always had a more than useful pack of forwards but lacked that important pace in the three-quarter line. Nobody can accuse us of that this season."

And Flanagan has a word of praise for Oldham's Australian trio of David Liddiard, Gary Warnecke and Mal Graham: "They have not only added to our team performance with their individual skills but they have slotted in to our dressing room life well and are valued members of our team."

"I have never known the Oldham team spirit at such a high level. We sorted out so many of our problems earlier this season and the only thing I can see for the future is more glory."

In contrast to the tremendous anticipation and excitement before the Cup semi-final games, there was an unreal atmosphere at the start of the league match with Leeds at Craven Park. With our Championship chance having evaporated — unlike the heavy rain which had fallen most of the day — one look at the pitch was enough to suggest that the game was going to be a mudlark with rugby at a premium.

How wrong that proved to be! Although there was ample opportunity for every player to take an early bath without leaving the field, the quality of the football with incredible. An early six pointer fell to Leeds when our defence was split wide open, although there was more than a hint of forward pass about the move.

Then Rovers set about saving the day. A splendid long range goal by Fairbairn was the signal for a concerted attack. When **Garry Clark** kicked ahead and followed up, the sort of stuff needed in the conditions, it brought a thrilling try followed by another fine goal from Fairbairn to put us ahead. Only a marginal forward pass decision stopped Hogan, but Fairbairn's long range penalty put us further ahead. Then came a shock. One fumbled pass on our line and Leeds were credited with the touch down, the goal kick putting Leeds ahead again.

A couple more moves, only narrowly failed to produce points for us, before **John Dorahy** again profitted from the conditions with another fine try, giving us a 14-12 advantage at the interval.

George Fairbairn, who had distinguished himself with some tremendous tackles, hit the woodwork from a long kick. Then a great run by **Laws** set up the position from which orthodox passing was all that was needed for **John Lydiat** to burst over. A move in which most of our back division handled and would have done credit to a dry ground brought **David Laws** a try, before a repeat of the same saw **Gavin Miller** under the sticks, Fairbairn goaling. **John Lydiat's** powerful running at centre brought him the match honours.

Our 28-12 win was the perfect answer by our players to the "knock" that no one would want to watch them.
