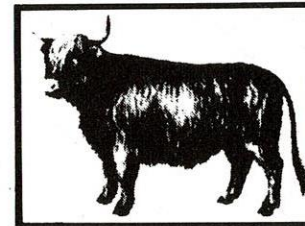
Mick Morgan is now on Castleford books and Ian Birkby with Doncaster and we wish these two every success at their new clubs.

LOOK AT LEEDS

It will be a new-look Leeds team that takes the field at Watersheddings this afternoon to officially open the new Stones Bitter championship. The "Lioners" came good in the second half of last season to finish sixth in the first Division behind Halifax, Wigan, St Helens, Warrington and Widness. But they have never won the First Division championship since two Divisions were introduced in 1973, and coach Peter Fox would love to put that right and see his Headingley lads become the first holders of the Stones Bitter championship. Already, though, Fox has suffered a mighty blow with the forced retirement through injury of big Jeff Grayshon, the man who followed him from Odsal to put vital strength and experience into the Leeds front-row.

Grayshon's sad departure from the League scene because of back trouble will leave an enormous gap in the Leeds forwards, but Headingley regulars will be hoping that Aussie Peter Smith, signed from Illawarra, will prove an adequate replacement when he arrives from Down Under soon. Two long serving Leeds stalwarts have also departed to find fresh fame and fortune with last season's champions Halifax - prop Roy Dickinson and utility back Neil Hauge. Former skipper David Ward's future is uncertain. The ex-Great Britain hooker could be at Leeds again - or at Hunslet. A Rugby League inquiry into the tug-of-war between the two clubs has taken place, but the problem was not resolved immediately. It is all-change, too, on the Aussie scene. Terry Webb is moving out and looks destined to join Hunslet, while Tony Currie and Cliff Lyons will be staying in Australia this time.

LOOK AT LEEDS

They have been succeeded by Down Under replacements Robert Morris, a hooker from New South Wales country football and the aforementioned Smith. Aware of possible back-line weaknesses following the loss of Lyons, Currie and Hauge, Leeds were also hoping to recruit another centre from Down Under and were being linked with Peter Jackson, a young, up-and-coming player from Brisbane, who is said to have a big future in the game.

There seems to be no shortage of forwards at Headingley when you think of Paul Medley, surely one of the fastest back-rowers in the game, big prop Brendan Hill, the Rayne twins, Keith and Kevin, £40,000 buy Colin Maskill, Gary Moorby, Roy Powell, youngster Richard Gunn, and club captain and loose-forward David Heron.

Mark Conway and Kevin Dick will again figure around the half-back spots, while it is rumoured that veteran John Holmes, a hero of many years of creative football for the "Lioners", could be set for a comeback after missing the whole of last season and seemingly going into retirement. Paul Gill or Ian Wilkinson will sort it out for the No.1 job, but unless the late-summer recruiting plans materialise, Leeds could be thin on the ground for centres and wings.

Andy Smith and David Creasser could well form one flank, while there will certainly be big expectations of Carl Gibson, with players like Andrew Stainland and Pat Mitchell, who once had trials here, challenging for places.



FANCY A FLUTTER?

Around the Clubs . . . with Roughyed

You can get odds of 33-1 against Oldham winning the first Stones Bitter championship, which starts today. Coral bookmakers make Wigan 2-1 favourites for the £20,000 record prize, with the Central Park glamour outfit looking for their first title success under New Zealand national coach Jimmy Lowe since 1960. Hull KR, bidding for a fourth First Division success, are second favourites at 7-2, followed by St Helens (6-1), Warrington (7-), Widnes (9-1) and current champions Halifax (10-1). Other First Division odds are Leeds (10-1), Hull (12-1), Bradford (20-1), Castleford (25-1), Leigh (33-1), Oldham (33-1), Salford (50-1), Featherstone (250-1), Barrow (500-1) and Wakefield (1,000-1).

There will be 23 referees this season graded to take charge of first-team games. There will be 12 from East of the Pennines and 11 from the West, including two from West Cumbria for the first time. They are Cliff Hodgson of Maryport, already well known, and Alex Bowman from Whitehaven who, at 28, is the youngest top graded referee since Fred Lindop hit the top 20 years ago. Fred, who takes charge today, is the League's most experienced official and is still among the officials considered for the international panel.

After today's game, Oldham travel to Thrum Hall on Wednesday night to take on champions Halifax. It will be 'Fax's first home game of the season, so there will be a big crowd to welcome the side as First Division champions, and a lot of pressure on the Oldham lads, who will be keen to deliver an early-season shock. Halifax, like Oldham, have undergone several team changes since last season, and on Wednesday we will probably come up against Joe Kilroy's full back successor - the former Australian Test star and ace goalkicker Graham Eadie. After three years out of the game, Eadie is back and has agreed to link up with his former Kangaroo team mate Chris Anderson, the Halifax coach.

The first round draw for the Grunhalls Lancashire Cup has been kind to Oldham by pairing us with Second Division champions Leigh here at Watersheddings in the first round two weeks today. Leigh have released Jeff Clarke, their Maori forward, to make way for a fourth Aussie behind half-back Mike Davis, who joined them from Fulham last season, and new signings Ian Schubert and Garry Howell, two back-row forwards.

There was a boost for Oldham when the League Council amended its laws on imports to include all overseas players, not merely Kiwis. This effectively freed Hussein M'Barki from this season's quota and allowed Frank Myler to sign 21-year-old forward Stuart Raper, son of the legendary Johnnie. If he is half as good as his dad, he'll be some player. Breaking with tradition, the Alliance League for "A" teams will be split into two this season. There are three new teams and the Divisions were decided on the positions in last season's final table. Oldham thus find themselves in Division Two, playing mainly Yorkshire opposition, apart from Swindon. Their opening fixture was against Dewsbury at Watersheddings on Friday. Nearly all our home games for the "A" team will be played on Friday nights so make a habit of making Friday night Oldham "A" night.

Salford have announced a lucrative £25,000 sponsorship deal involving an Oldham lifting gear company, Trenchman, and brewers Greenall Whitley.

The influx of Aussie players into our game shows no sign of drying up despite the fact that many of the Sydney and Brisbane players will be here with the Kangaroos in October. Latest club to recruit are St Helens who were expected to land two Sydney stars in half-back Brett Clarke of Wests and prop Pat Jarvis of St George.

OLDHAM 86

KEITH ATKINSON: Full-Back. Product of Oldham Rugby Amateur League. Came into the side at full-back at the end of last season and produced some very fine games. One for the future.

HUSSEIN M'BARKI: Wing. El Morrocan International Rugby Union player, signed for Fulham in 1981, later signed for Warrington, but only stayed for one season before joining Oldham last season. Versatile player, can play in most positions in the back line.

DES FOY: Centre. Local boy made good. Selected to tour in 1984 played in the 1st Test against Australia. Product of Saddleworth Rangers. Started his career with Widnes. One of the fastest centres in the game.

GARY WANNECKIE: Centre. Australian born spending his second season with Oldham, very durable player not missing a game last season. Played Western Suburb in Sydney before joining Oldham. Player with plenty of talent.

MICK TAYLOR: Wing. A former Huddersfield junior signed for Oldham 1982-83 season. Developed into a very sound player both in attack and defence.

DAVID TOPLISS: Stand-Off. In many people's eyes, one of the all time greats, a player of many talents, perhaps his greatest gift is the way he reads the game, a talent not in abundance in our game at the moment. Previous clubs Wakefield and Hull F.C.

RAY ASHTON: Scrum-Half. Product of the Widnes area. Signed for Oldham along with Flanagan, Goodway and Worrell which formed in the the late 70's one of the best Colts sides ever produced. Ray toured in 1984, but due to a back injury did not play many games. Since his recovery however he has come back to form and has played a big part in keeping Oldham at the Rugby map.

WALLY JONES: Prop. Most under rated player in the game. Tremendous worker both in attack and defence, always willing to take on the opposing team in his own 25. Product of Warrington, Rochdale, Blackpool.

IAN SANDERSON: Hooker. Came into the side through the suspension of Alan McCurrie the start of last season and kept the number nine spot throughout the season. Named Young Player of the Year, also selected for Lancashire, but the game was called off due to the weather but if he keeps up the form of last season, will surely be in the reckoning for the County side this season. Product of the Leigh Amateur League.

DAVID HOBBS: Oldhams record buy cost £40,000, but you won't find a fan in Oldham who would begrudge a penny spent. Named Player of the Year last season. Previous club, Featherstone Rovers. Honours, Great Britain, Yorkshire, Toured Australia in 1984.

NEIL CLAWSON: Second Row. Son of Terry Clawson, played along side David Hobbs at Featherstone. Signed during the close season, Neil will prove to be a very cheap buy for this day and age. Standing at Six feet 3 inches will prove a very formidable partnership alongside Mick Worrall

MICK WORRAL: Second Row. Member of the 1984 Touring team Mick turned out to be one of the successes of the tour, only to be injured late on the tour. On returning from Australia he also picked up another knee injury which limited his appearances with Oldham. He was also injured in the St Helens game (Charity) last season and missed most of the early part of the season, but thankfully finished the season in great style. One of the best forwards in the game on his day.

TERRY FLANAGAN: Signed while only sixteen years old. Proved a very good signing over the years although still in his early twenties as earned every honour in the game, shows good ball skills and along with his tackling qualities as proved to be a very formidable player.

AROUND THE LEAGUE

Record Prize for Champions

A record Rugby League champions prize of £20,000 and a first ever end of season Premiership double header are the main features of the new Stones Bitter sponsorship showcase.

The League's biggest purse will be handed over along with the Stones Bitter championship trophy in a £60,000 prize structure which, for the first time, includes runners-up cash prizes.

The inaugural final of the Second Division top-eight premiership competition will be staged in a double bill with the premiership final on Sunday, 17th May in a "two for the price of one" climax to the campaign.

These major innovations highlight the first season of a three-year £400,000 championship and premiership sponsorship campaign.

Of the 1986-87 sponsorship fee of £210,000, 50% will be invested in the League's capital development fund for ground improvements, the remainder will be distributed as follows:

First Division champions £20,000 - Runners-up £8,000

Second Division champions £10,000 - Runners-up £4,000

Premiership winners £9,000 - Runners-up £3,500

Second Division Premiership winners £4,000 - Runners-up £1,500

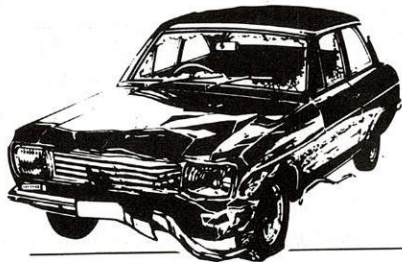
Eight teams therefore, will receive Stones Bitter League and premiership prize money - five more than last year when Slalom Lager was on the the name of the competition.

Says new League Chairman David Wigham "The introduction of the Second Division premiership, the expansion of the prize structure to 50% of the sponsorship fee plus runners-up awards are part of the positive, forward-looking policy adapted by the League."

"The aim is to provide greater incentives for clubs while maintaining a central fund for development of grounds particularly in respect of the Safety of Sports Grounds Act."

"Increased incentives are open to all clubs, emphasised by last season's seven major titles being shared by six different clubs - Halifax, Leigh, Castleford, Warrington, Hull KR and Wigan twice."

The Stones Bitter championship is streamlined to 14 clubs for the start of the 1987-88 season. To accommodate the reduction of two clubs, there will be a promotion and relegation format four-down and two-up in the present season, thereafter reverting to a three-up and three-down.

THE EDITOR TALKING

Here We Go... To a Bright New Future

The Secretary General of the Rugby Football League David Oxley told club officials and members of the Press at the pre-season Stones Bitter lunch that there was a time, in days long ago, when Rugby League enjoyed a close season. This was no longer the case. The summer of 86 had been a desperately busy time for the League and the clubs and with barely a break on the administrative side, we were now on the threshold of another season. He was talking of the game in general, but he could so easily have been pin-pointing Oldham such has been the enormous amount of work that has gone on here during the summer months. The League Secretary also said that the aftermath of the Bradford fire disaster had provided our game with its biggest crisis since its formation in 1895, but the League clubs were facing up to the problems and challenges and looking forward to what should be a terrific season, highlighted by the visit of the Australian tourists in the autumn.

We are also facing up to problems and challenges... and we are certainly looking forward to a bright new future as a limited liability company with a board of directors and shareholders. Without progress you stagnate and there is no doubt that Rugby League football as it approaches its centenary in 1995 is all about enterprise, investment, commercialism, and major sponsorship. Big business is now involved in the higher echelons of our game and it is of great significance that authorities such as the Rugby Football League and the local Council are 100 per cent behind our move to change from a members' club to a limited company.

The truth is that we have no alternative. The members realise this and have already made a "moral commitment" to approve the big decision soon. Protracted discussions on the limited company issue have taken up much of the summer months and, hopefully, will soon provide us with the historic day when the changeover takes place. But that has been one of the many crucial decisions made in the past few months, all of them with the good of the club as the underlying theme and the crucial need to see the club into the big-time commercially. There was the decision to enter into a major deal with Blackburn brewers Matthew Brown, already well known in League circles for their recent Slalom Lager sponsorship. The link-up can only benefit both parties as, hopefully, will our new association with Nike, the sports wear manufacturers.

Talks have also been going on in great detail with the local authority regarding both short-term and long-term plans for the development of Watersheddings. The work that has had to be done on the ground during the summer has been enormous, and the club is indebted to the local authority for the help it has received short term and the interest that has been generated at the town hall for the future development of the stadium which has a soft spot in the hearts of so many Oldhamers, both young and old. A steering committee comprising local authority and club officials has been set up, and recently the club commercial manager Tom Morley enjoyed a fact-finding mission to Watford soccer club to examine a scheme at Vicarage Road that has also involved local authority backing.

Finally, there was the club's decision to lease out the social club and we can only reiterate that this was done with the club's best interests at heart. The future, we are sure, will show the wisdom of our move, not only providing a guaranteed source of income but allowing for the upgrading of the social club and assisting in the overall growth of interest in the Oldham RL Club. On the field, too, we have much to look forward to. Aussies Gary Bridge, Bruce Clark, and Stuart Raper should be with us soon, we have signed Neil Clawson from Featherstone, David Topliss is back with us, and Graham Starkey has been entitled to help with the training and coaching and form a three-man backroom team with Frank Myler and Brian Gartland.

Here we go then at the start of a brand new season. It has been a traumatic summer in many ways... but faith, hope and sheer hard work have brought us up to the starting gun once more. Now its up to the players to run the race!





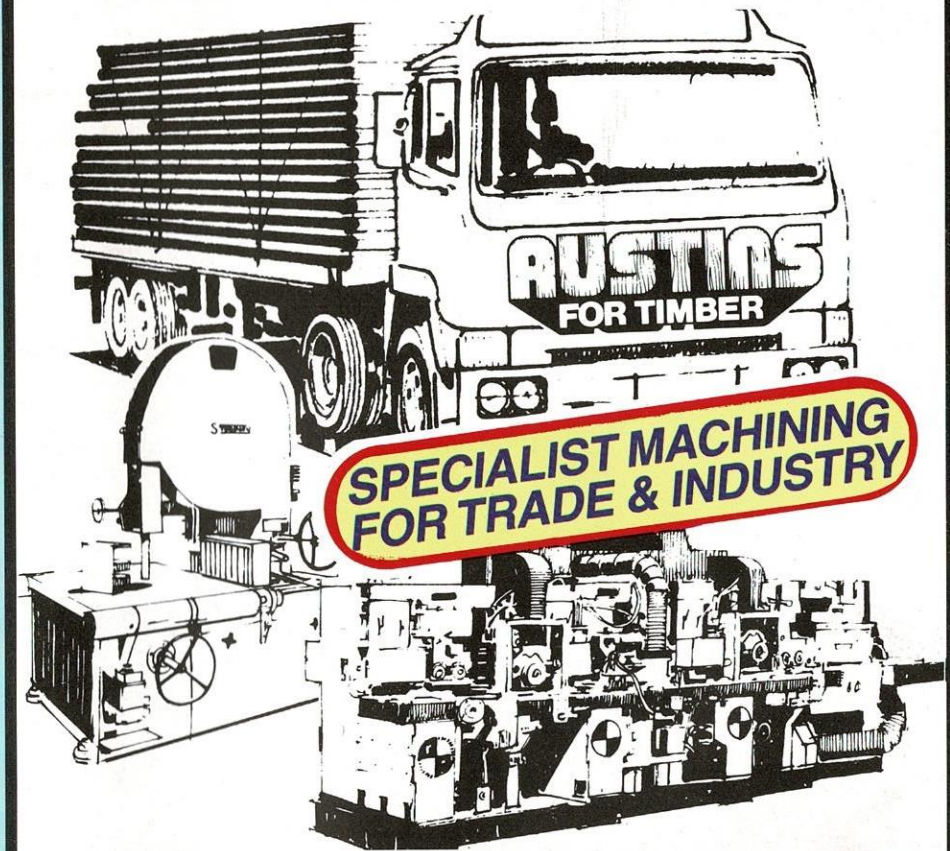
