

OUR appearance in Saturday's Silk Cut Challenge Cup semi-final tie at Central Park, Wigan, gives an ideal opportunity to the whole town of Oldham to get behind the Watersheddings club in its quest to reach Wembley for the first time in its history.

In a history of a million memories there is an inexplicable void when it comes to Wembley and, at Wigan on Saturday, we have the best chance for more than two decades to reach our goal and satisfy a craving of this town for well nigh 60 years.

To this end, we are now selling a supply of replica Oldham jerseys from the development office and we hope to get a lot more to sell in the event of our reaching Wembley for the first time.

We shall also operate executive coaches to the match - stand seat and lunch included in the price - and in this commemorative brochure we are asking local firms and businesses to back a player for £250.

There will be a top-class cash prize for the punter whose player scores the first try in the semi-final.

Win or lose on Saturday, though, the commercial side of the enterprise has to go on and make money, otherwise there will be no club to support.

We have just been joined in the department by Peter Foxcroft from Grimsby who will do the job of lottery manager under the ausprices of commercial man Tom Morley, who has overall responsibility for money raising.

The lottery, the Lifeline, sponsorship, commercial advertising, the Ambassador club, executive boxes, ...all are ways and means of raising money which our club so urgently needs.

So follow Oldham to Central Park on Saturday...and follow the commercial department to the sort of success it must have if the fruits of our labours are to be reflected in excitement on the field of play.

One of the most fascinating things about sport is the way it throws up some strange twists and coincidences and that is the case in this year's Silk Cut Challenge Cup semi-finals.

It does not seem so long ago that I was watching Mal Reilly crunching his way through the Australian defences from Darwin to Sydney on the 1970 tour.

Mal was a sensation on that trip and one of the men who admitted his approach and ability was playing behind him in the threequarter line...Britain's shrewd skipper and centre Frank Myler.

Now the fates have combined to thrust Reilly and Myler into a head clash in the first Silk Cut Semi-Final as Castleford and Oldham's team bosses.

It is going to be a battle of wits between two of the finest players this country has produced since the last war.

But this semi-final is going to be one for the connoiseur. There will not be any fancy football or foolhardy moves with so much at stake as a Wembley trip.

Oldham have never been there as a club and Reilly has never been there as a coach.

Myler was there as a player in 1964...the year they beat Castleford in the semi-finals and then Hull K.R. to lift the trophy. That year the semi-finalists were Widnes, Oldham, Hull K.R. and Castleford.

Oldham are obviously looking to sound Yorkshire stock in former Featherstone star David Hobbs, a Great Britain tourist himself in 1984, to maintain this season's marvellous form and set the standards in this semi-final.

They have another 1984 tour man in tough tackling forward Mick Worrall and scrum-half in Ray Ashton, not forgetting centre Des Foy, who played in that First Test against the Aussies.

The Liddiard brothers David and Glen did such a superb job in the quarter-final that Reilly will clearly be planning to counter their skills.

Oldham have had great service out of Australian forward Mal Graham and men like to hard grafting Wally Jones but they will need teamwork to triumph in this tie.

That is the quality Reilly will be looking for in his side where Bob Beardmore and John Joyner are capable of doing the damage at half-back.

Beardmore is one of the game's most skilful scrum-halves and behind him Castleford boast new Great Britain cap, classy centre Tony Marchant who marked his debut against France with a fine try this year.

The Castleford forwards have a reputation for matching the best in the game and the signing of pacy Australian back row man lan French was a top class move. He can steal through the tightest of defences and is one of the most exciting stars on the First Division front.

Then there is the tough, cagey forward Kevin Ward who has done great service with the Wheldon Road outfit and balances the brilliance of ball distributor Barry Johnson.

Hull K.R. are rated among the most professional sides in the game and here again we have another 1970 Ashes winning star in Roger Millward as their coach with a remarkable record.

Millward has set tremendous standards at Craven Park in winning every honour and has got some great players in his side with Australian loose-forward Gavin Miller and his countryman John Dorahy, a menace at either stand-off or centre.

Rovers are a side packed with experienced men and plenty of skill. Full-back George Fairbairn has been a great pro and capture even though he once cost the record fee of £72,500 from Wigan.

Second row man Chris Burton did a great job for Britain on the 1984 tour, earning plenty of respect for his defence and graft from the Aussie players and fans alike.


Skipper David Watkinson has had one of his finest seasons, a solid anchor for Britain as hooker in holding New Zealand and playing well in the two games against France.

Leeds are responding now to the experienced coaching of Peter Fox with a great spell of consistency. The signing of Carl Gibson to benefit from men like Tony Currie, David Creasser and Cliff Lyons is paying off handsomely.

Hooker David Ward is an experienced campaigner as are the Rayne twins Kevin and Keith while Jeff Grayshon's great effort against New Zealand was vital in squaring the series.

Young Pail Medley is one of the most exciting forwards to burst on the First Division scene for seasons and David Heron a talented forward with the ability to prise open gaps in the toughest defences.





A CUP CAMPAIGN TO REMEMBER

WHATEVER happens in Saturday's Silk Cut Challenge Cup semi-final tie against Castleford at Wigan's Central Park, the 1986 cup campaign is one that will be long remembered in the Oldham camp.

It is, after all, the first time since 1964 that we have reached the last four so it is clearly a special occasion which merits the publication of a souvenir brochure.

Time dims the memory and there will be many older supporters who can vividly recall some aspects of those fascinating semi-final battles with Hull KR of 22 years ago, while finding difficulty in remembering detail.

So that the 1986 cup campaign will never be forgotten — not even in another 22 years — we publish details of the first three rounds for posterity's sake.

ROUND ONE

Due to the worst February weather for 40 years, the first-round tie against Second Division club Carlisle was switched from Watersheddings to the heated pitch at Oldham Athletic's Boundary Park ground. The tie took place on February 9, 1986 and will be remembered for the way in which David Liddiard took the starting kick near his own line ...and finished up under the Carlisle posts in a record 18 SECONDS!

Oldham won 56-10 in front of a crowd of 2,785. It was 28-4 at half-time, the referee was Ken Spencer, and a total of 11 Oldham tries were scored with David Liddiard bagging four of them.

Mal Graham (2), Paddy Kirwan (2), Mike Taylor, Ian Sanderson and Des Foy completed the try-scoring with David Hobbs landing six goals.

In a reshuffled back division at half-time, 16-year-old Glen Liddiard moved to outside half ...an experiment that was to prove significant over the next few weeks.

ROUND TWO

The draw for the second round paired us with Warrington at home. The tie was originally scheduled for television but when the winter continued to bite, the Rugby League and the BBC decided not to risk the tie being frozen off so they switched the Bradford-Wakefield tie to the heated Headingley pitch and televise that instead.

The weather affected ties badly and Watersheddings was harder hit than most. When the League was looking for another TV match on the revised date for outstanding second-round ties, they felt they could not risk Watersheddings again, and decided to go for the Wigan-St. Helens clash at Central Park.

Worrall also kicked two goals and Ray Ashton dropped a goal. Worrall's solo try just before half-time set us on the way and then the brilliant team try, scored by Foy and made by Ashton, Graham and Sanderson, finally delivered the killer blow to the Wires.

We led 7-6 at half-time, the referee was Mick Beaumont of Huddersfield, and there was a crowd of 6,526.

It looked as though it might be enough, but Oldham had different ideas and the whole ground erupted with seven minutes to go when David Liddiard broke clear to score a stunning try under the posts after a defence-splitting pass by his younger brother, Glen.

Hobbs kicked the goal and it proved enough to give us a 6-1 win ...and passage into the semi-finals.
