

# From the coach's viewpoint

# LEN CASEY talking . . . .

Not exactly as I had planned, but honours came out even in the holiday double with Featherstone Rovers. In the first meeting at the Boulevard we took time to settle into the rhythm which had enabled us to give Wigan such a close encounter. Initially our



defence looked susceptible but once we had opened the scoring against the run of play we always had the upper hand. That score was a classic as Andy Dannatt slipped a pass to Phil Windley on our twenty five and the ever improving youngster broke into the clear before finding Garry Schofield in support on halfway and I suppose you can guess the rest. That narrow advantage was retained until two minutes into the second period when Gary Pearce confirmed his rapid development by dummying three defenders and crashing in close enough to improve his own touchdown. The Welshman also had a hand in our next two scores as he firstly popped the ball up for Dane O'Hara to score an opportunist try and then featured in a dazzling move inside Rovers' twenty five - it followed a copy-book move from a scrum, Phil Windley provided the initial quick service, Pearce fed Garry Schofield who handed onto Gary Kemble and the Kiwi sent Paul Eastwood diving over in the corner. Great Britain scrum half Deryck Fox salvaged some consolation for the Colliers with a late try but we had the last word when Lee Crooks whom I had rested somewhat by including him as substitute, showed his prowess by powering over. Once again the foundations for victory were provided by our young props Andy Dannatt and Alan Tomlinson whose constant driving set up scoring positions. Sadly both sustained injuries as well as Shaun Patrick which kept them all out of the return game at Post Office Road two days later and how their absence was felt.

With **Dane O'Hara** also sidelined with influenza I was enforced into several changes. Young **Paul Welham** took the vacant second row berth

The continued excellence of Phil Windley meant Kevin Dick again having to be satisfied with the substitutes berth. Always notorious for their heavy pack, Featherstone looked to have the edge in this division with the experienced Keith Bell and Peter Smith supplemented by the class of rising star Paul Lyman. There was little to choose between the two sides for the opening quarter, only a Deryck Fox penalty breaking the deadlock. Then a lapse in concentration at a scrum left Peter Smith free and he sent Great Britain Colts' full back Chris Bibbs on a fifty yard run to the posts. Eight points in arrears we desperately needed a score and Tracy Lazenby provided the answer with a magnificent break, showing the pace of a threequarter before handing on to that man Schofield and once our flyer has the line in his sights there seems little stopping him. With the wind in our favour after the interval we would have been happy to go in at 4-8 down but disaster struck just on the interval when Keith Bell was allowed to move the ball out of the tackle to **Peter Smith** and he strode between the posts to leave us trailing by ten points and a lot to do on the restart. Try as we did we could not secure the forward dominance to create scoring positions and when impressive prop Karl Harrison broke a tackle to send Richard Marsh over in the corner the game looked out of our reach. Ironically we played our best football of the game in the closing quarter when Rovers surprisingly tired and our superior fitness began to have its effect. Lee Crooks moved the ball out of a two man tackle to Phil Windley who scooted between the posts but unfortunately just as Gary Pearce was negotiating the simple conversion the ball fell over and the Welshman was unable to lift it high enough for the two points. We continued to hound the Rovers line and chances went begging until Paul Eastwood was given room to crash over in the corner. Sadly it came too late to save the day but with more composure we may well have snatched the points though on the balance of play it would have been a slight injustice.


With our away trips still reaping little reward it is imperative that we win our home fixtures in order to stay out of the relegation zone and the visit of Oldham this afternoon presents no easy task. The Roughyeds promised so much last season before falling away and finishing with nothing — a familiar story for the Watersheddings' supporters, who saw some superb football at times from their team. Inspired by Aussies Mal Graham, Gary Warnecke and David Liddiard, Oldham topped the league early season and had genuine hopes of achieving that elusive Wembley appearance the club has craved so long for. In the end, they finished in ninth place, just outside the play-offs and their Wembley dreams were shattered at the semi stage by eventual winners, Castleford.

Gary Warnecke has returned with new Aussie blood in the shape of the strong running Gary Bridge and heavyweight prop Bruce "Bruiser" Clark. Coach Frank Myler has again found his side flattering to deceive although narrow away defeats at Hull K.R., Warrington and Halifax has meant the difference between a top six and a current mid table position.

This afternoon's fixture also sees the return to the Boulevard of former skipper **David Topliss** and he is sure to receive a rousing welcome from our supporters.





# Featuring Oldham in Person

**GARY BRIDGE.** Australian—played last season for Balmain and on his return will join Eastern Suburbs. Equally at home in the centre and at stand off, he is a strong runner with a good kicking game.

**GARY WARNECKE.** Affectionately known as the "The Gipsy" he played for Oldham last season, and unlike so many of his overseas colleagues, never missed a game. Though centre is his natural position, he can fill in more than adequately in any of the back positions. He is a resolute defender and ever dangerous in attack.

MICK TAYLOR. Most improved player at Watersheddings — very strong and direct in attack and a fine tackler in defence. He is a product of the Huddersfield A.R.L.




