OLDHAM

ALAN TAYLOR: Alan began his career with Widnes, before moving on to join Swinton. It was from the Lions, that Oldham signed Alan, and although he spent a while out of the game due to work commitments, he is now back in the full back jersey for the Roughyeds.

HUSSEIN M'BARKI: Hussein began his rugby career in the 15 a side code in his native Morocco, where he represented the National side, before joining French league club Cahors. He was then brought across the Channel by Fulham, where he spent three years before moving north to Warrington from where he joined Oldham.

DES FOY: Former Great Britain centre threequarter who was a product of the Saddleworth Amateur Club, signing for Widnes in July 1982. However, his time at Naughton Park was short and in January 1983, Oldham stepped in to sign Des. Toured Australasia in 1984 and was Britain's stand off in the first test at Sydney Cricket Ground.

GARY WARNECKE: Equally at home in the threequarters or in the back row of the pack, Gary is in his second season at Oldham, having played in every game last season. Gary hails from Sydney, where he plays for the Western Suburbs Club.

GARY BRIDGE: Another Australian in the Oldham ranks, Gary is a strong running centre and a fine tactical kicker. The 25 year old Sydney based player represented Balmain Tigers last season, but on his return home will be joining the Eastern Suburbs Club.

DAVID TOPLISS: Still one of the finest stand off halves in the game today, David is a product of Normanton Juniors, from where he joined Wakefield Trinity and enjoyed a long and successful career at Belle Vue, being rewarded for his service with a Testimonial, before moving on to Hull F.C. where he captained the side in several cup finals. Joined Oldham two years ago after being released by the Airlie Birds.

PADDY KIRWAN: Paddy signed professional from the Oldham Colts side in 1979, and up to quite recently had to battle with Ray Ashton for a regular first team place. Paddy spent a time on loan to Leigh in 1979 and last season, Hull F.C. showed more than a passing interest in Paddy, but he decided to stay and fight for his place and was guaranteed his place when Ray Ashton signed for Leeds.

WALLY JONES: Wally signed for Oldham two seasons ago from Rochdale Hornets for a small fee, since when he has been a regular first teamer. One of the games most underrated prop forwards, Wally was Oldham's Player of the Year in his first season at the Watersheddings.

IAN SANDERSON: Talented young hooker who took over the hooking role in the first team last season, when he was robbed of the opportunity of appearing for his native Lancashire, when, after being selected against the Touring Kiwis, the game was postponed due to the weather. Ian could well miss today's encounter should he receive a suspension for his sending off in the Cup against St. Helens.

MICK WORRALL: Former Oldham Colts player who graduated through the ranks to the first team and in 1984 he was a Great Britain Tourist, playing in the first two Tests. Can play either prop or second row and has experience of the Australian game, having spent a season in the Brisbane competition in 1985.

BRUCE CLARK: Bruce is a team mate of Gary Warnecke both here and back in Australia with the Western Suburbs Magpies. A fiery prop forward, Bruce is nicknamed 'Bruiser' back home because of his hard non-stop tackling.

DAVID HOBBS: Former Featherstone Rovers player who won the Lance Todd Trophy for his two try performance in Rovers magnificent 1983 Challenge Cup Final victory over Hull F.C., for whom team mate David Topliss appeared on the losing side. A £40,000 signing, David was a G.B. Tourist in 1984 and is still a member of the national side.

COLIN HAWKYARD: Began his career in local amateur football in his native Huddersfield before moving over the Pennines to sign professional for Oldham. Although better known as a second rower, Colin can play in the threequarters, however, wherever he turns out, he always gives 100 per cent effort.

TERRY FLANAGAN: Product of Saddleworth Juniors, Terry joined Oldham in 1979 and only a year later was given the club captaincy role. Made his Great Britain debut in the 1983 Anglo French Tests and a year later made the Tour squad, appearing in two Tests in Australia. Could well fill the hooking role today should Ian Sanderson be suspended.

Visitors Form Guide

The early season promise shown by the side has not been maintained and, like ourselves they have struggled to find their true form as the season has progressed. Their form, notably away from home, has deteriorated somewhat. Many Oldham fans will have been desperately disappointed that their side did not progress further in the Challenge Cup after sensationally knocking out 3/1 favourites Wigan in the opening round, however, I am sure they will agree that on the day, Saints fully deserved their victory.

The side reached the Final of the Lancashire Cup, only to be well beaten by Wigan at Knowsley Road, with Gary Bridge scoring the sides only try on the day.

Currently holding 9th spot in the First Division, Oldham must be strongly fancied to qualify for a top-eight Premiership Place come the end of the season, and hopefully a chance for their supporters to see the side lift a piece of silverware at long last after so many disappointments.

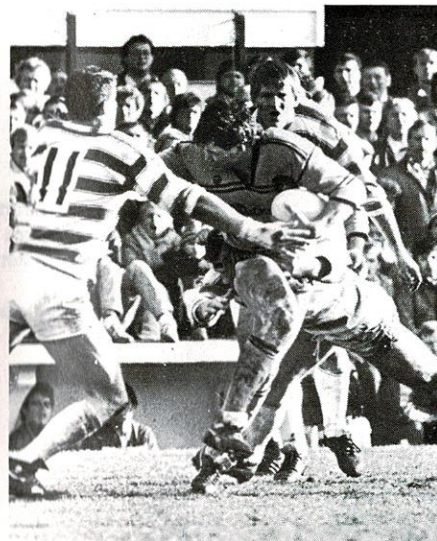
