Former Post Office Road men David Hobbs and Neil Clawson are likely members of their squad today and are sure to be out to 'put one over' their old team mates..

### NO STOPPING CHRIS

Rovers young full-back Chriss Bibb continues to go from strength to strength. His remarkable rise to fame received another boost last week when Malcolm Reilly chose Chris to play for the Gt. Britain Under 21's side which faces the French this afternoon.

This honour comes quickly after the youngster's successful debut for the Gt. Britain Colts side which drew with the French just a few weeks ago.

There is no doubt that if Chris can maintain his rapid progress then he will have little trouble in gaining full international honours in the near future.

We at Featherstone are delighted for Chris and wish him well for a good game this afternoon.

### TOUR GAME FOR POST OFFICE ROAD

For the first time in fourteen years Featherstone Rovers will play a touring international side when Papua New Guinea will visit Post Office Road next season.

The Tourists are in Great Britain for an eight match programme which will include a World Cup Test Match against Great Britain at Wigan.

Rovers applied to the league some months ago and were pleased to hear that they have been granted the opening game of the Tour on Saturday 10th October.

The match, which is bound to create a great deal of interest, has been arranged for a Saturday in order to give supporters of other Yorkshire Clubs the chance to see the Papua side.

The last touring side to visit Post Office Road were the Australians who defeated Rovers by 18pts to 13 in 1973 when 5,659 spectators attended.

### QUICK RETURN FOR GRAHAM

Missing from last Sunday's line up at Warrington with a leg injury was stand-off-half, Graham Steadman.

His absence from the team was more precautionary than serious and he is fully expected to return to action for Rovers this afternoon.

Also back in consideration for selection should be prop-forward, Alan Dakin, who has recovered from the effects of a nose operation and Gary Siddall was expected to play in the Alliance Cup quarter final against Wakefield Trinity last Tuesday evening after shaking off a minor shoulder injury.

Andy Mackintosh and Peter Clarkson continue to make good progress after knee surgery and are looking forward to returning to Rovers' ranks next season.

It is hoped, too, that threequarter, Alan Banks, may soon be playing again after being unavailable for the past few games. Alan's defensive qualities in particular, have certainly been missed.

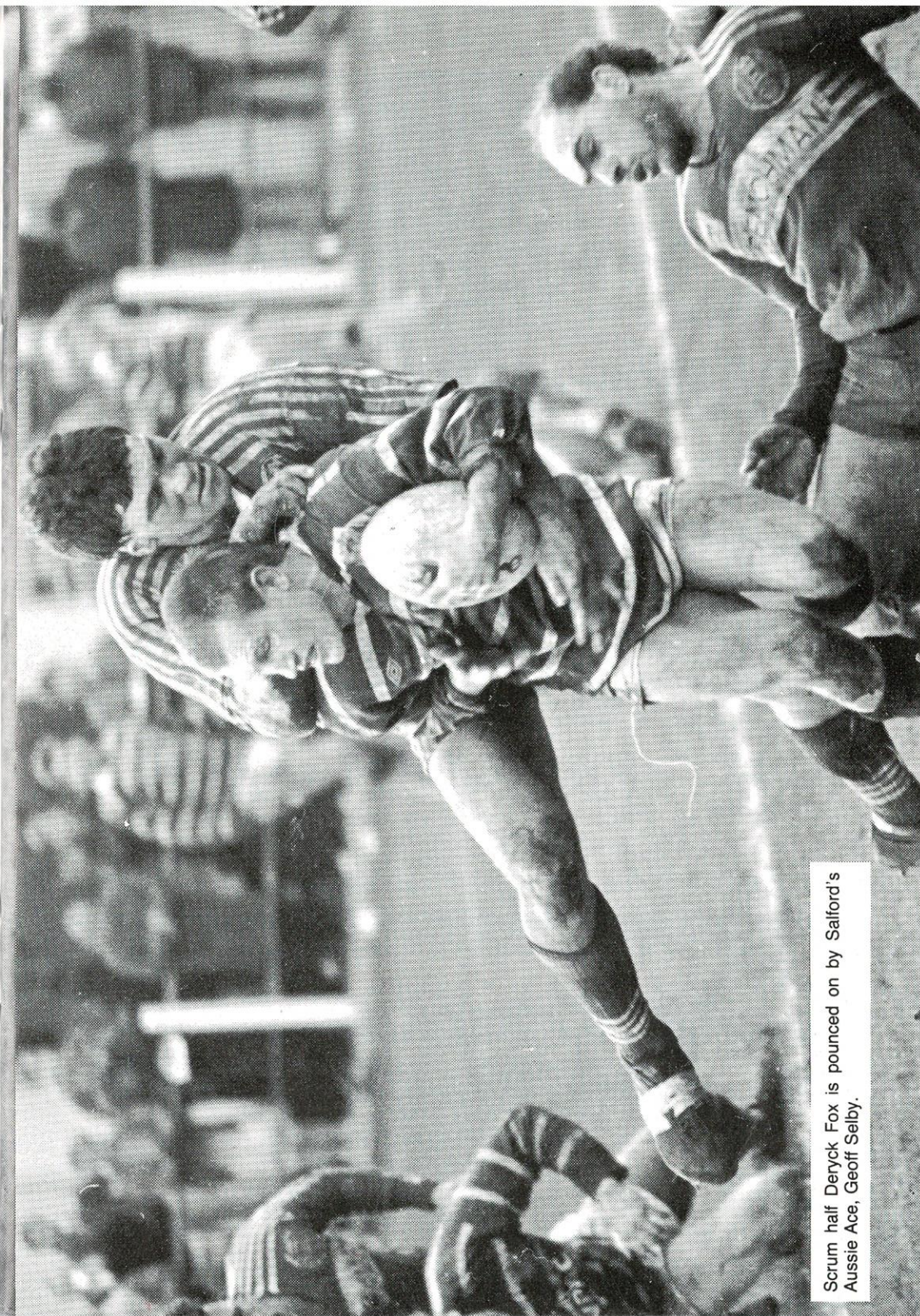

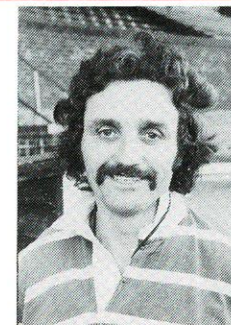

# WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Oldham came to Post Office Road boasting a fifty per cent record in League matches this season and they will be hoping to continue that form so as to qualify for a place in the Top Eight and a crack at the Premiership. The fact that Oldham have a team to compete with the best was evidenced in their victory over mighty Wigan in the First Round of the Challenge Cup a few weeks ago.

Team Manager **Frank Myler** has developed a good squad and has shown with recent signings that he is not afraid to enter the transfer market if he feels it will be for the benefit of the team. Frank is in his third season back at the Watersheddings since holding the Gt. Britain coaching job.

One of the new arrivals at Oldham is fall back **Mick Burke** who was signed from Widnes in a £40,000 transfer fee. Mick is of course, a Gt. Britain international and will relish the challenge at his new club. He originally signed for Widnes from Waterloo R.U.F.C. in 1978 and as well as being excellent all round full-back is a very fine goalkicker.

Amongst the three-quarters Oldham can select two Australians. One is **Gary Warnecke** who plays for the Western Suburbs club in Sydney and is in his second season at Watersheddings. The other is centre or stand-off **Gary Bridge** who has played for Blamain in his own country and will return to play for Eastern Suburbs. Gary is a strong runner who has a good kicking game.

Centre **Des Foy** is an Oldham lad who originally turned professional for Widnes before returning to his home town. His lightning breaks from the centre of the field have made him a candidate for a Gt. Britain spot.

On the wings Oldham can choose from experienced and speedy flanker **Mick Taylor** or Moroccan **Hussein M'Barki** who started his career with Fulham and is capable of scoring long-range tries.

At stand-off Oldham have one of the most experienced players in the game in **Dave Topliss**. Dave started his career back in 1968 when he joined Wakefield Trinity from Normanton juniors. Dave is a former Gt. Britain international who has gained most of the game's honours including the Lance Todd Trophy in the Wembley Final of 1979.

At scrum-half **Paddy Kirwan** has made the position his own especially since the departure of Ray Ashton to Leeds. Paddy signed from Oldham Colts and is a former Colts international.

Up front the Oldham team can field two more Aussies in **Bruce Clarke** and **Stuart Raper**. Bruce plays with Western Suburbs in Sydney and is a strong running prop with ball skills to match. Stuart is the son of Johnny Raper the Aussie Test loose forward. He is showing immense potential and plays for the Cranulla team in Sydney.

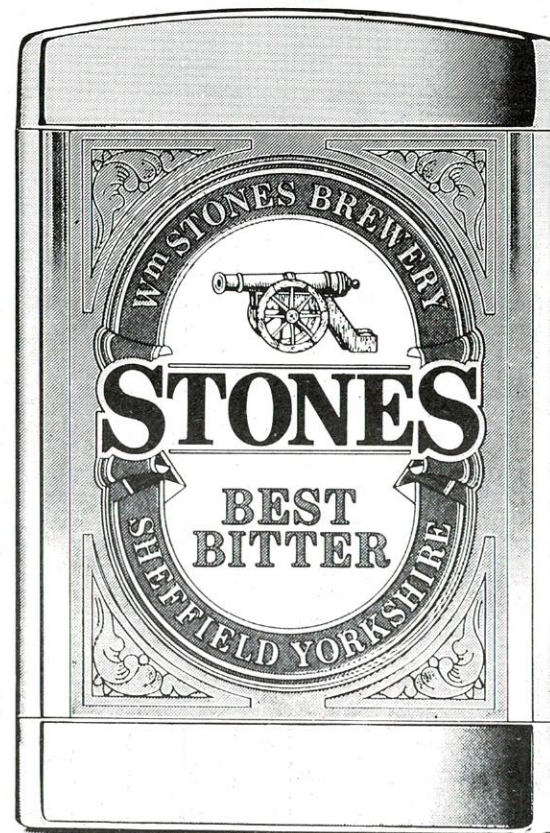
**Ian Sanderson** has established himself as hooker since signing from the Leigh area five years ago. It is likely we shall see **Hugh Waddell** at blind-side prop. Hugh was recently signed from Blackpool Borough and gained representative honours for England whilst with that club. No doubt he will relish the opportunity to enhance his international claims at higher level.

The second row positions could be taken by two more international players in **Mick Worral** and **Dave Hobbs**. Mick is an extremely mobile forward who was a Gt. Britain tourist in 1984 to Australia. Dave needs no introduction being a prolific try-scoring forward with the Rovers before his transfer to Oldham. He has represented his country in the front row position.

At loose forward we should find another 1984 Gt. Britain tourist in **Terry Flanagan** who is one of the best ball playing forwards in the game.

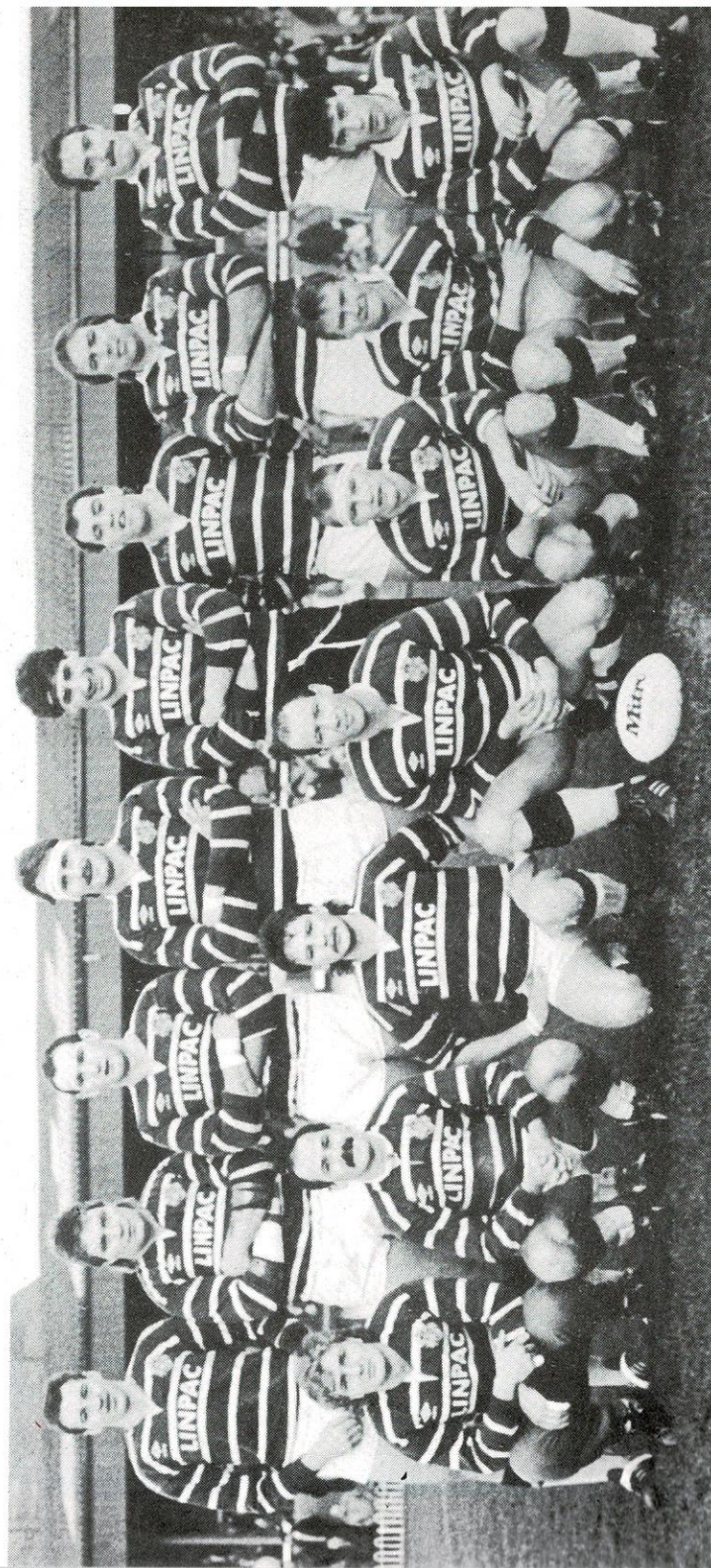

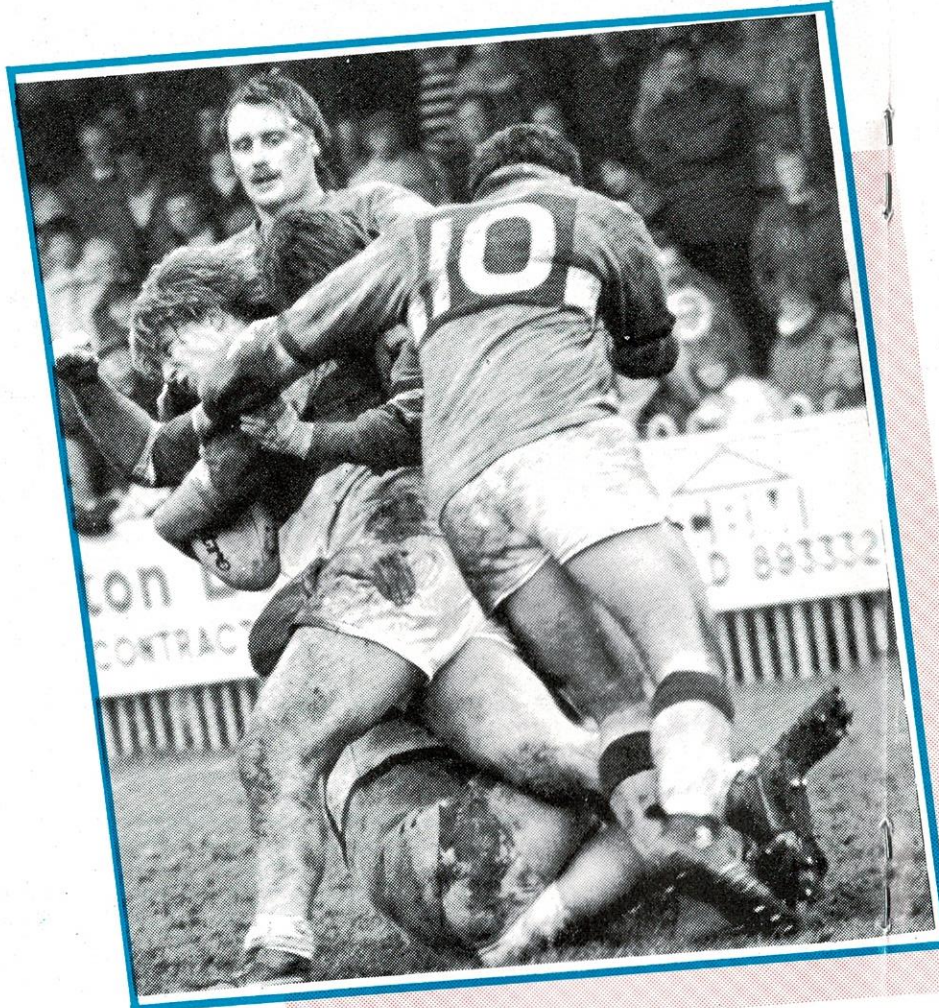

A series which reviews past encounters between Rovers and their opponents of the day.

**Oldham** first visited Post Office Road **March 15 1922** in a league Championship game that attracted over 4000 spectators who paid around £200 to see the 'Roughyeds' win a dour struggle by 3 points to nil. The game ended in uproar when a number of Featherstone Partisans rushed the field and struck the referee. The Committee decided to take proceedings against two of those responsible and commented in the following match programme;

"All hot-headed enthusiasts who imagine their shilling entitles them to a shot at the referee, can take it that Featherstone Sportsmen expect them to stay at home and chop sticks or alternatively put their heads under the cold water tap."

A month earlier Rovers had visited Oldham and lost 28-5, also in the Championship. It is

believed there were no reports of trouble.

Since this time Oldham and Featherstone have met at Post Office Road on 26 occasions. The Colliers have won 11 to the Roughyeds 12 with 3 drawn. Rovers best result came in 1943/44 when they won 35-5 while Oldham recorded a 30-8 win in 1958/59. At the Watersheddings there have been 25 meetings, Oldham have won 16 Rovers 8 with one drawn. Rovers managed a 32-17 win in 1981/82 while Oldham scored a 53-15 drubbing in 1923/24.

**Our most recent encounter** took place earlier this year on January 18 at Oldham. The Lancashire men were victors by 20-16. Scorers for Rovers were Bibb, Steadman and Fox (tries) and Fox (2 goals).

Rovers side was Bibb, Marsh, Crossley, Banks, Jones, Steadman, Fox, Slatter, Slater, Harrison, Bell, Smith, Lyman, subs B. Kellett, Dakin.

## The History of RUGBY LEAGUE by Ian Clayton.

### 1910/1911 — "A credit to their Union"

The first tour by the Northern Union (known in Australia as "England") was a resounding success. Clubs had been asked to nominate players "who would do honour to the N.U. both on and off the field". There were doubts about the fitness of **Billy Batten** to tour, but after proving himself in a match between **Hemsworth** and **Normanton St Johns** in which he scored 3 tries he was included in the tour party.

The 'Union' played 2 games against Australia winning the first at the Agricultural Ground Sydney at 27-20 in front of 42,000 spectators and the second at The Exhibition Ground, Brisbane, by 22-17 in front of 18,000.

Two games were also played against 'Australasia' the first at Sydney attracted a record Northern Union crowd of over 50,000 and ended in a 13-13 draw. The second 4 days later at The Wentworth Ground Sydney resulted in a 32-15 win for the Antipodeans.

A short tour of New Zealand was undertaken one test was played at The Cricket Ground Auckland in front of 16,000 fans and The Northern Union were victors by 52-20.

On their return, the Tourists who had travelled 34,000 miles in 5 months, were greeted at Leeds Station by a large crowd. Mr J Wood said "The men were a credit to the Union" and Mr Clifford added that he thought "The Australians and New Zealanders were well taken with the game of Northern Union".

On the domestic front — a special meeting of the N.R.L. met to consider the formation of a mutual insurance scheme. Most clubs voted in favour of paying a small deposit. After the deadline for receipt of monies it was reported that only **Wigan**, **St Helens**, **Bramley** and **Merthyr Tydfil** (who disbanded due to lack of finance 3 months after) had declined to join.

**Runcorn** were warned about the bad behaviour of their supporters and ordered to erect dressing rooms for visiting teams.

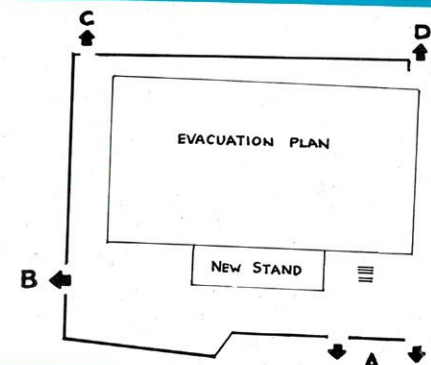

The Yorks League title was taken by **Wakefield Trinity** with Hunslet runners up.

In the Country Challenge Cups, **Oldham** won a dour encounter at **Wheaters Field Broughton** scoring 4 points to **Swinton's 3**. **Wakefield** completed a county double by winning the Yorkshire Cup at **Headingley** with a 8-2 win over **Huddersfield**.

The Northern Union Cup also served to show off the stranglehold that the 'Roughyeds' of **Oldham** and the **Wiganers** had on the game when in the final at **Wheaters' Field** the men from **The Watersheddings** beat **Wigan** by 20-7 in front of 15,500 partisans.
