After today's match, we have only two home games left... Leigh on Sunday, 12th April and Wigan on Easter Monday.

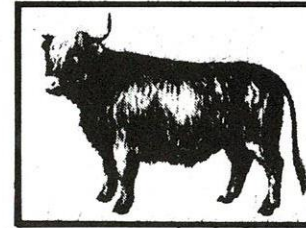
Next Sunday, we go to Barrow and then the following Wednesday we take on Wigan at Central Park. Our final away game of the league season will be at Salford on Good Friday.

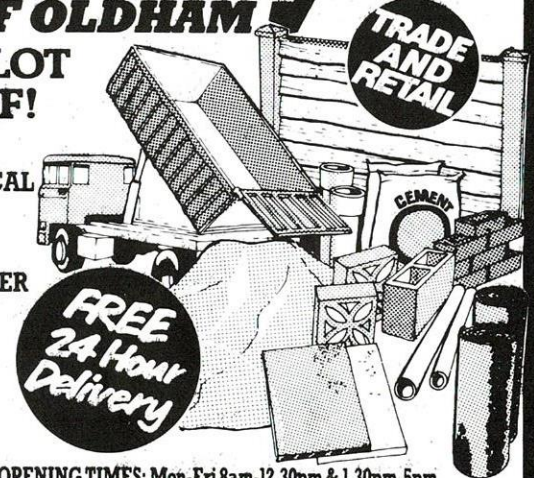

CLASSY CAS CHASING TOP FOUR SPOT

Like most First Division clubs these days, Castleford have been hit by the recent departure of four Aussie stars – Bob Lindner, Brett Atkins, Chris Johns and Colin Scott.

Nevertheless, the reservoir of local at Wheldon Road is so deep that Castleford are still strongly fancied to finish in the top four and they even have their sights set on the runners-up spot following a run of four consecutive First Division wins.

After a bad spell while Great Britain prop Kevin Ward was out of action with a broken ankle, Castleford got back on winning ways with victory over Oldham at Wheldon Road a few weeks ago and they have since had wins over St Helens, Widnes and Barrow, the latter a record of 70-10 win in which Bob Beardmore scored a record 38 points.

His 11 goals and four tries had the record keepers thumbing through their books, and as the 70-point haul closely followed the 44 points scored against Widnes, it is obvious that the classy Cas's scoring machine is well oiled at present.

Of course, they are bound to miss their Aussies, especially now that full back Scott and second-row man Atkins have flown home this week to create even bigger gaps following the departure of Lindner and Johns some time earlier.

Lindner, the Kangaroo's Test star, had a good tour here last autumn and he showed his strength, pace and skill when he produced a stunning display in Castleford's win over Oldham at Wheldon Road.

How Mal Reilly will fill the gaps is open to some debate, but it seems certain that David Rookley will take over at full back.

Beginning to make a strong claim for a regular wing spot, thus helping to compensate for the loss of centre Johns, is local lad Grant Anderson, a 17-year-old who signed from the Colts team a short time ago, made his debut against Widnes and retained his place against Barrow last weekend.

Skipper and veteran back John Joyner has spent much of the season competing with youngster Shaun Irwin for the No. 6 jersey, but it now seems certain that Joyner will play at centre, alongside Tony Marchant, with Irwin returning at No. 6 after playing for Great Britain colts against France last weekend.

The loss of Lindner and Atkins from the pack is bound to be felt in the back-row, but the recent return of Ward after injury has coincided with a big upturn in fortunes and it will still take a good, strong pack to get the better of the Castleford six.

Problems in the back-row may encourage Reilly to use Alan Shillito at No. 8 with Ward in the second-row, but the more likely permutation is for Ward, Kevin Beardmore and Barry Johnston to form the front-three down with Keith England at loose-forward and Martin Ketteridge and possibly Dean Mountain in the second-row.

Out of their six remaining games, Castleford have only one home match remaining and five away, so they will be anxious to complete a league double here tonight if they are to fulfil their ambition of earning a home tie in the first round of the play-off.

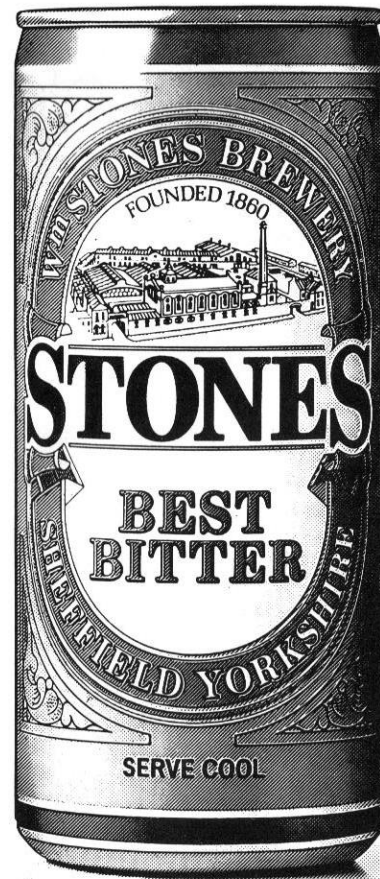

Around the League... with Roughyed

Gary Schofield needs three tries for a century of touch downs for Hull. Still only 21, the Test centre is poised to become the youngest ever player to total 100 tries for a club, and these figures were compiled before Hull's game against Salford on Wednesday. A former Hunslet Parkside Junior player, Schofield signed for Hull soon after captaining the Great Britain Amateur Youth Squad to New Zealand in 1983. He made his debut for Hull in a 22-23 home draw against Warrington on 21st August, 1983 and his next appearance was as a substitute when he scored his first try in a 30-8 Yorkshire Cup Second Round win at Keighley on 14th September, 1983. It was the start of a remarkable season in which he became the youngest player to finish at the top of the Try Chart with 38, including 1 for Great Britain Under 24's. He was only 18 years 10 months when the season finished. Schofield's 97 tries for Hull have come in 114 appearances, including 6 as substitute. He has scored four hat-tricks for the club.

In the Silk Cut Challenge Cup Semi-Final at Headingley yesterday Widnes appeared in their 9th Semi Final since 1975. Their only defeat in this period was 10-5 against Hull at Swinton in 1980 with victories in 1975, 1976, 1977, 1979, 1981, 1982, and 1984. Widnes overall total of Semi Final appearances, including this year, is 18 with 12 victories. It was Halifax's 20th Semi Final which have brought 10 victories. Their last Semi-Final appearance was in 1980 when they lost 20-7 to Hull K.R. at Headingley. They were last a Wembley in 1956 when St Helens beat them 13-2.

Bob Beardmore of Castleford broke the Division One record for points in a match with his 38 at home to Barrow on Sunday. The scrum half scored 4 tries and kicked 11 goals in the 70-10 victory. The previous record was held by John Woods with 36 points from 8 goals and 5 tries in Bradford Northern's 48-20 home defeat of Swinton on 13th October, 1985. Woods had taken the record off Beardmore who scored 34 points (11 goals, 3 tries) in Castleford's 54-4 home defeat of Leeds on 2nd October, 1983.

Doncaster hit the half-century mark for the first time with the 50-6 home defeat of Keighley on Sunday which produced the following records:

- It beat their previous highest score of 43-5 at home to Batley on 17th April, 1965 when they scored 11 tries compared with Sunday's 9
- David Noble's 18 points from 7 goals and a try equalled the club match record. Others to have scored 18 are David Towel (9 goals) v York 9th September 1967, and Ian Fortis (6 goals, 2 tries) v Blackpool 5th September 1970.
- Doncaster registered the club record sixth successive win and equalled their longest unbeaten run. All but one have been at home. They beat the five successive wins in their inaugural season of 1951-52, equalled earlier this season when they won five in a row then drew one for a club record run of six unbeaten matches.
- Sunday's win equalled their best Division Two haul of 33 points which they set last season with 16 wins and a draw. Under the old one League system, Doncaster's best season was their first when they took 43 points from 36 matches in 1951-52.

Great Britain Under 21's defeat of France at St Helens on Sunday was a record score for a Junior International match. It beat Britain's 48-1 defeat of France in an Under 24 International at Oldham on 4th December, 1983. The Under 21's previous highest score was this years 40-7 win in France. Paul Loughlin broke the Junior International points record with 22 from 7 goals and 2 tries on Saturday, while Neil Puckering's hat-trick equalled the past try haul.

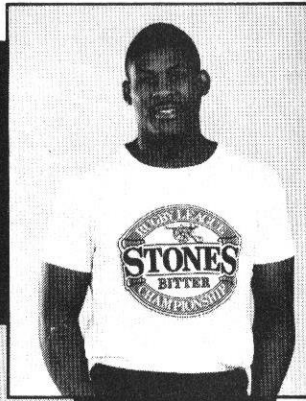
Steve Lidbury equalled the Sheffield Eagles record of 16 tries in a season when the winger touched down in the 28-7 win at Batley on Sunday. He shares the record with loose forward Paul McDermott who scored 16 in their inaugural season of 1984-85. This is the winger's first season as a professional having being signed from Lock Lane (Castleford) amateurs. He scored 2 tries on his debut in the opening match of the season, a 48-5 home defeat of Mansfield Marksman on 31st August, 1986.

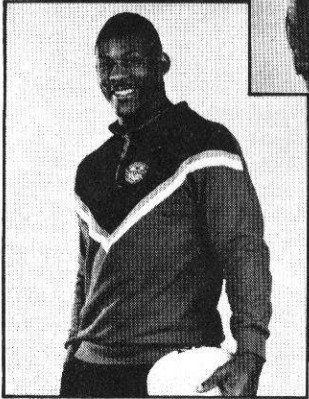

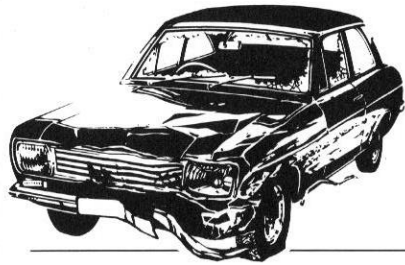

THE EDITOR TALKING

... on the season's big finale

The news that this year's Silk Cut Challenge Cup final at Wembley between St Helens and the winners of yesterday's Halifax versus Widnes semi-final could produce one million pounds for the first time is most encouraging. Officials will be looking for a full-house 95,000 crowd in order to reach the £1 million target, but the signs are good with the 43,000 seats having been sold already, apart from those kept back for the competing clubs.

Such seats are always sold in rapid time once the finalists are known, so we can assume that so far as seats are concerned it will be another Wembley sell-out irrespective of whether Widnes or Halifax line up against the Saints. The key will be whether all standing places are taken, but the League report that the £6.00 tickets are going at a brisk rate and all the signs indicate that the magical million target could be reached. It is a far cry from 1929 when the first Wembley final drew £5,614. So far as crowd pulling power is concerned I think a Halifax-Saints final would prove more attractive than a Widnes clash.

I have nothing against Widnes and, in fact, when you consider their path to the semis – away wins at Castleford and Leeds and a draw at Bradford before a home win in the replay – they certainly deserve to walk out once more on 2nd May. On the other hand, the Halifax success story over the past three seasons has been a phenomenal one. From obscurity they stormed to championship success last season, thanks to their Aussie influence, and to walk out at Wembley would crown a remarkable triumph for coach Chris Anderson and the man behind the big revival, David Brooke.

A lot of the glamour of a Widnes appearance at Wembley has gone – outside Widnes, of course – and I think that a Halifax-Saints clash would not only create an inter-county clash and 'spread' interest across the North of England but it would appeal far more to the non-committed RL supporters. By the time these notes are read we will know the outcome of the semi. I hope it's Halifax for the greater good of the game as a whole, but you can never write off the Chemics in the Challenge Cup and if they are walking out on 2nd May, you can bet that Saints will have a battle on their hands.

A fortnight later, at Old Trafford, Manchester, the Rugby League will stage another 'first' with the First and Second Division premierships double header in what should be a marvellous finale to the season. Old Trafford will provide the perfect setting on a spring day for the competing teams to produce all that is best in Rugby League – and it will be a big occasion for the Second Division clubs, too. Sunday, 17th May, is the date, with the Second Division premiership final kicking off at 1:30 p.m. to be followed by the Stones Bitter premiership final at 3:30 p.m.

This double-header is a special 'two for the price of one' promotion with tickets available at £7.00 and £6.00. 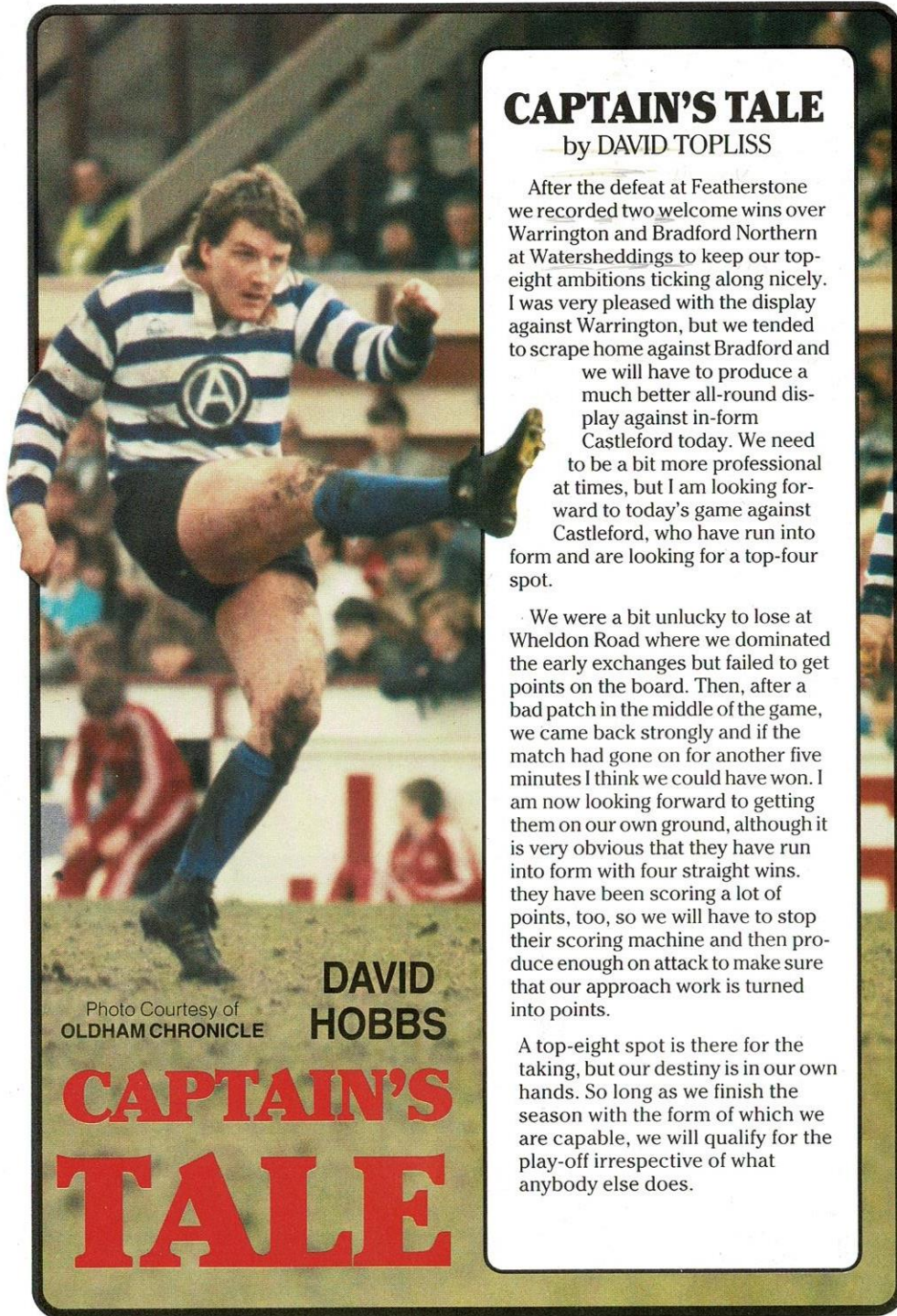
