## John Player Special Trophy

John Player celebrate 21 years support of Rugby League - New agreement gives 76 per cent increase.

A 76 per cent increase in the value of their support in the coming season - making a total of £150,000 - will mark the 21st anniversary of the association between John Player and the Rugby Football League, the longest running major sponsorship in British sport.

The increased support is part of a new two-year agreement which will benefit the Rugby League with a total of £320,000 by the end of the 1988-89 season.

When the partnership started in 1967 it was worth just over \$6,000 to the sport. In the coming season it will be worth a record £150,000 divided into two parts - £85,000 in prize money for the John Player Special Trophy competition, a 45 per cent increase over the previous season and \$65,000 to the League's Capital Development Fund, almost three times as much as last season.

Announcing the new agreement, Peter Dyke, head of sponsored events for Imperial Tobacco, said: It is most appropriate that these increases should come in this particular year. It means that since 1967 and including the new agreement, Imperial Tobacco has provided over £1m worth of support to the sport, mainly through the promotion of the John Player Special Trophy competition and also through a variety of other events in the earlier stages. In addition we have given help to the amateur side of the sport during the same period.

'My company has enjoyed a long and very supportive relationship with everyone concerned in the running, playing and watching of Rugby League and we are proud of our part in its development, particularly with John Player Special Trophy competition now in its 17th successive

Bob Ashby, Chairman of the Rugby League, added: 'The massive increase in the overall sponsorship and prize money reflects the ever growing stature of the competition. The quality of the tournament has been mirrored in the high standard of play particularly in recent top class

All 34 First and Second Division clubs and the two leading amateur clubs will take part in the John Player Special Trophy competition in the coming season. It will start with a preliminary round of four matches on Sunday, 1 November and continue through to the end of the year with the final being scheduled as the first major Rugby League event of 1988 on Saturday, 9th January.

The BARLA teams taking part this season are Thatto Heath, of St. Helens, and Heworth, of York, as winner and runner-up respectively of the Whitbread National Cup competition. Both start in the preliminary round. Dates for the 1987-88 John Player Special Trop
