

LOOKING BACK

by Tom Beardsley

When the 'Roughyeds' won the Second Division championship of the '81/82 season, they met the Dons on three occasions. Twice at the Watersheddings and once at Tattersfield. Oldham's record that season was outstanding. They would gladly be satisfied this season with a '81/82 playing record which read, 30 wins and 2 defeats with 734 pts scored and 276 conceded.

The first Oldham/Dons clash took place at the Watersheddings on the 27th September 1981. After being relegated from Division One the previous season, the Roughyeds had started the '81/82 Second Division campaign in fine style by winning their opening 5 games. A Watersheddings crowd of 1806 watched Oldham make it 6 wins out of 6 games as they easily brushed aside the Dons by 38-10, scoring 8 tries (Kirwan 3, Caffrey, Parrish, Ashton, Taylor, Herbert) and 7 goals all kicked by Parrish. The Dons points came from a Keith Millet try and from 3 Noble goals plus 1 drop goal. The Tattersfield club returned to the Watersheddings 3 weeks later for the 1st round of the John Player cup. 1894 assembled to see these two sides fight it out for a second round place;

OLDHAM: Murphy, O'Neill, McEwan, Parrish, Cafferey, Taylor, Kirwan, Alexander, O'Mahoney, Harris, Nicholson, Goodway, Flanagan.

DONCASTER: Wright, Millet (I), Noble, Buckton, Millet (K), Russell, Finerty, Ellis (K), Knott, Mason, Davies, Rhodes.

Alan Rhodes' side put up a much better performance in this tie than in their recent Div. 2 thrashing on this ground. They badly missed their open side prop, Graham Perigo, but nevertheless battled away hard to restrict the high flying Oldham side to a half time 8-2 lead. As the game progressed in the second half, the Dons could find no answer to the skills of Oldham's loose forward Terry Flanagan who scored a deserved second half hat-trick of tries. Mick Parrish contributed 2 tries and 3 goals. Buckton scored a try for the Dons and 'Nobby' kicked 2 goals in the 21-7 defeat.

By the time the Roughyeds visited Tattersfield, for the return Division Two game the following April, they were almost assured of taking the championship. They brought plenty of supporters to give the Dons their 3rd highest 'home' gate of the season, 1005. (The two highest gates that season were the 1309 who saw the Dons' Belle Vue game v Cardiff, and the 1286 who saw the Halifax game. Oldham had suffered only two league defeats, 9-15 at Halifax and a 7-22 Watersheddings reverse v Carlisle, the only side who could now take the Second Division title from them. Since the reversal v Carlisle, they had won their last 19 games - The Dons had won only 2 of their previous 19! So it really came as no surprise as the 'Roughyeds' ran in 8 tries (Parrish 2, Flanagan, Cafferey, Taylor, Cook, O'Neill, Hunter), Parrish kicking 6 goals. The Dons gave a spirited display and scored 3 tries through Dave Wilson, Kevin Knott and John Russell, with Alan Harrison kicking 2 goals. Oldham being full value for their 36-13 victory. The Watersheddings side went on to win at Hunslet and a crowd of 3485 came to their last home match on 9 May '82 to celebrate the winning of the championship. Workington being beaten by 29-7.

1981/82 was a relatively good season for the Dons. Alan Rhodes side finished second from the bottom with 5 wins, 1 draw, 26 defeats, scoring 319 points and conceding 793. Not bad considering the Tattersfield Club's record of the mid 1970s when in 4 consecutive seasons, 1973 to 1977, they only managed to win 7 of 104 Second Division fixtures! (Must not forget the draw they forced in the 1974/75 season).


The Colts also got off to a good start this season drawing at Dewsbury 14–14 and then beating Sheffield Colts 28 points to 12 points – well done lads!






