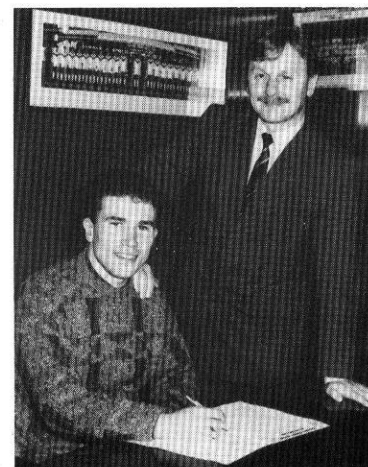

It was a real pleasure to be part of the Oldham Team that shocked the Rugby League world with our win at Warrington. It proved what can be achieved when a team of blokes with the right attitude and the willingness to play their hearts out for each other, for the club and the fans go out determined to tackle the odds.

The Warrington people said afterwards that, far from underestimating us, they had prepared better for Oldham's visit than at any other time this season. By comparison we had big problems. For one reason or another, several players could not train on the Monday before the match and by Wednesday night we were going down like ninepins with either injury or illness. Come Friday, the pitches were not really firm enough to train on and we had to go down to the all-weather floodlit area at Hathershaw Sports Centre to do our final preparations there.

To overcome such obstacles and still beat Warrington in their own backyard shows what the team is really made of.

I daresay all the big guns in the semi-finals would be hoping to get Oldham because we are a Second Division side. But I'll say this. If we stick to our game plan, keep up the tackling, and play with the spirit we displayed against Bradford and Warrington then I think we'll prove that even the best and strongest teams are only human and prone to error and frustration.

FACE IN THE CROWD

JACK DEARDEN — our man on the terraces

As one would expect, the great Alex Murphy was not a bit shy with his comments at a recent sports forum at Oldham Cricket Club. Alex is not everybody's cup of tea but he was very entertaining on this occasion and very honest when answering some tricky questions.

Asked if he had ever instructed a player to take an opponent out of the game, he said: "No. But I said that I want certain players watched 'closely'".

He went on to say that Oldham had "pinched Paul Round at £65,000" while he (Alex) was away on holiday. It is not true that an Oldham director asked him when he was going away again!

I asked Murphy about the gamble of signing Union players, for example, Stuart Evans, and he has promised listeners that the Welshman would become one of the best forwards in the game.

I think it is incredible that clubs pay out enormous sums of money to players who have never played our code. Many Union men have been successful in the past (Martin Offiah is hitting the headlines right now) but I think it is more of a gamble now than ever before.

Murphy also made the point that good referees were being forced to retire too early and that the replacements did not have the necessary experience. I agree. Great referees like Eric Clay and Billy Thompson will have been missed as much by the players as by the spectators.

Referees in any sport are on a hiding to nothing and face a difficult job. The authorities do not always help them, either. Take the sin-bin, which is hardly ever used for the correct purpose.

Murphy would like to involve ex-players in refereeing and while I am sure it would help, there would still be problems. I feel it is as hard to become a good, established referee as it is to develop into a good and respected player..

Finally, congratulations to everyone concerned in the great wins over First Division teams Bradford and Warrington which have earned us the right to a semi-final appearance in the John Player Special Trophy.

I have a message from the terraces to everyone at the club. We are right behind you. Keep up the good work!

Iain McCorquodale – on the local scene.

Hard lines for Saddleworth Rangers who went out of the Lancashire Cup in the semi-final at Leigh Miners by 25-19. The young side played well but should really have consolidated when they held a 14-0 lead midway through the first half. A series of unforced handling errors prevented coach Ray Hicks from preparing for a major amateur final at Watersheddings and entry into the preliminary round of the Silk Cut Challenge Cup.

Ray, incidentally, has become regional coach following the promotion of Eric Fitzsimons to staff coach - a role he shares with Maurice Bamford, Tony Barrow and Ellery Hanley. Good luck, Ray, on your promotion.

Oldham's only current grade-one referee, Alan Burke, has been receiving some excellent reports on his handling of senior professional games and this is no surprise to those who have watched his progress over the last decade.

In the early 70s, he was a hard-tackling full back in one of the sides I took at Hathershaw School but even in those early days his real love was refereeing and he has now handled 374 schoolboy games. Add to this the vast number of amateur and professional commitments he undertakes and it is no surprise to learn that he has 'reffed' more than 1,500 Rugby League matches of one description or another in 14 years - a fantastic record.

Every Saturday he handles a town team game as well as countless inter-school fixtures and he even saves his holidays to have afternoons off to referee local schoolboy finals.

In my 15 years association with local school teams he has yet to turn down a request to referee any fixture and he will often referee two local games before going off to a professional commitment.

It was unanimously decided that Alan be invited to accompany the under-13s on their Australian tour in 1988 and it was no surprise that he accepted the honour on one condition - that he pay his own way. A typical gesture from a man dedicated to Rugby League.

Thanks also to Oldham club dentist Neil Gibbison, who has made a fantastic gesture by offering to make gum shields for the boys going Down Under. Both the RFL and BARLA encourage all players to wear gum shields and it is reassuring to know that our boys will be equipped with the best. Thank you Neil.

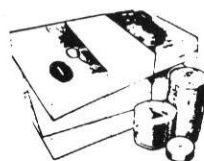

THE BOSS TALKING...

(A personal view by Oldham coach Eric Fitzsimons)

A warm welcome to all our friends from Doncaster. We came away from Tattersfield without a point and the Doncaster team played with a lot of spirit. I was particularly pleased for my old adversary 'Nobby' Noble. He scored the last-second try and has continued to create club records for playing and scoring in every match. I used to hold a similar record at Hunslet and it isn't easy having to play with the pressure of having to score in every match.



I admire Nobby more for the position from which he has achieved it. Playing on the wing and kicking goals is one thing, but playing in the pack and doing it is another, and it is nice to see a lad who has been loyal to a club getting the recognition he deserves.

However, neither 'Nobby' nor Doncaster can expect any favours today because we are well motivated to avenge our defeat at Doncaster. This is one of the few league fixtures where the lads will not need raising. They have a point to prove!

A big thanks to all the fans who followed us at Batley and Warrington. Didn't we do well? And what a tremendous boost to know that most of the noise was coming from the Oldham fans. Keep it up. We are going to need it at Central Park in the semi-final on Saturday, December 19. Let's fill that big ground full of Oldham people and cheer us on to the final. We know we can do it. Give us every lift you can on the day.

Apologies, incidentally, to the supporters who waited in vain at the social club after our games at Batley and Warrington. We usually leave away venues 1½ hours after the final hooter and head back to the social club, but on the last two away trips we have been the guests of two of the players' 'locals'. Colin Hawkyard looked after us at the Woolpack, Huddersfield and Steve Peters in his own pub, the Elephant, Thatto Heath.

I have had several phone calls from Wigan, thanking us for beating Warrington. After the fifth call I became curious about how they had got hold of my number. When I inquired, the voice at the other end of the 'phone replied very sheepishly: "Maurice Lindsay!".

What do I think of the draw? We have a strong West Lancs. contingency, who will want to prove a point against their old club. We also have a number of lads who were in the side that lost to St. Helens in the Challenge Cup at 'Sheddings last season. They are still smarting and they want revenge.

We have a good defence, we have players who are capable of scoring from their own '25, we have a confidence in ourselves as individuals and as a team. We believe in ourselves! I don't have a crystal ball. Rugby League is a great game and one of the chief reasons is that it is full of unpredictability. Saints have all the pressure on their backs. They are the First Division side with pedigree and they are expected to win.

Let them have the pressure. We get our share of it as 7/4 favourites in the second division. We aim to enjoy ourselves on the day, knowing you'll all be cheering us on. No one has the right to expect us to win except for the players themselves. It's their game and I know they are not planning on letting themselves down at Central Park.

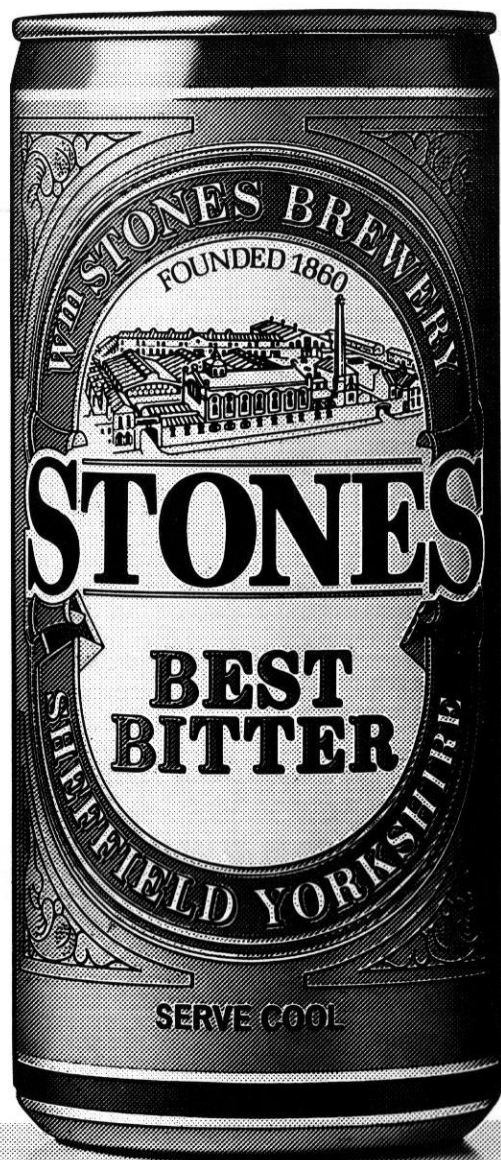

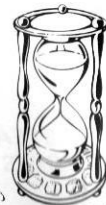
