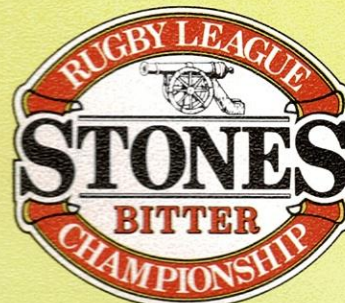

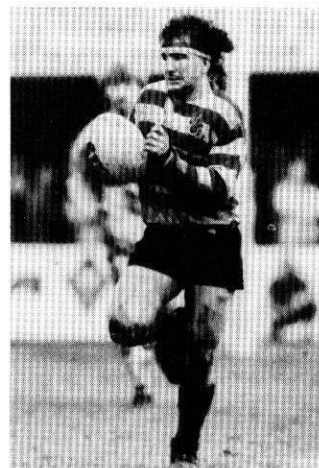

JOHN PLAYER TROPHY SEMI-FINAL

Alan Gaskell (News of the World): What a fight gallant Second Division Oldham made of it. It was fitting that the man of the match award should go to Oldham's giant prop Hugh Waddell, who rocked Saints time and again with his barnstorming runs.

John Huxley (Sunday Mirror): Oldham held the lead for six minutes in the second half and looked the better side for long periods.

Even though we haven't got prime viewing time, it's good to see a new Rugby League programme and I think it will prove very popular even though it is being shown at 11.30 pm. I also hear that Channel 4 is due to screen the film 'The First Kangaroos' on Boxing Day so by the time these notes are read some of us will have been able to see Dennis Waterman as English hero Albert Goldthorpe.

CORKY'S COMMENTS . . .

(Iain MacCorquodale on the local scene)

The column this week is devoted to the Greater Manchester Youth League and spotlights, in particular, the flourishing Royton Tigers club which will be providing a curtain-raiser in the near future with their talented under-nine side.

Reformed in 1986-7, the league has gone from strength to strength under the leadership of secretary Tony Finan and chairman Stephen Bithell and the committee has achieved a success story that is the envy of all youth and junior leagues in BARLA.

This season the league has over 40 teams playing at under-11,13,15 and 16 and it also caters for under-9s in friendlies and cup competitions for under-17s in conjunction with the North West Counties League.

The league has a mix of clubs with established open-age sides, plus clubs which just run junior teams. The league is proud of its development and is constantly striving to expand further. Playing standards are improving and in a series of regional fixtures at Barrow the league's representative sides performed admirably despite losing.

The league has agreed to a request from development officer Neil Wood to introduce mini-rugby for its under-9s next season. This will hopefully encourage more teams to start at under 9, as less players are needed, and mini-rugby teaches boys correct skills at an early age, as proved in Australia. This progressive move, if successful and copied elsewhere, could have a massive impact in improving standards and the league is to be congratulated for its willingness to take up this initiative.

Royton Tigers can undoubtedly be regarded as one of the success stories of the current upturn in junior and youth rugby. Formed in October, 1986 by Stephen Bithell and his wife Marilyn, the club is one of the most progressive in Oldham, catering for boys from 6 to 16 and fielding four teams each week.

Success is not measured by winning trophies but by making Rugby League a game in which the whole family can take part. Sisters and mums join in at training sessions as well as supporting the teams on match days. Opponents can be assured of a warm welcome at the Duke of Edinburgh in Royton after the match, as landlord Tom Clare is the club president. The club has no formal committee, preferring to have meetings for all parents to have a say.

The club's success shows there is a wealth of talent in Oldham which, correctly coached and encouraged to seek enjoyment first and foremost, will provide the Oldham senior club with an endless supply of players and spectators for years to come.

Steve Deakin, the St. Anne's coach, reports that 11 local lads have been selected for the Lancashire squads: Graham Robinson (open age), Gary Flanagan, Jason Bloor, Paul Kay, Glen Galbraith, Martin Ogden, Ian Charnock, Mick Welden (under-19), Martin Kay, Andrew Sherrat, Chris Tessier (under-17).

Says Steve :With Saddleworth going out in a closely-fought semi-final to eventual Lancashire Cup winners Leigh Miners and Oldham schools proudly flying the flag, the Oldham public have every right to feel proud not only of the professional team, but of all aspects of Rugby League in the town.

"Long may this success continue and here's hoping that Iain MacCorquodale's dreams of an Oldham team playing at Wembley with Oldham lads comes true."

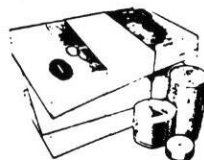

THE BOSS TALKING...

(A personal view by Oldham coach Eric Fitzsimons)

A warm welcome to everyone from Rochdale Hornets. I will always hold the club warmly in my thoughts as they gave me my first opportunity to coach the game. Hornets have struggled, like many clubs, to keep their heads above water. Let's hope the sale of the ground, accompanied by some astute spending, helps to win them long-term success. I believe that the game is helped locally when both clubs are doing well.



The semi-final against St. Helens has pre-occupied the club, the town, spectators and players for the last three weeks and it has had its effect on league fixtures against Doncaster and Barrow. It is now vital that the team gets back to ground zero and puts all cup thoughts out of their minds.

I cannot emphasise enough to everyone connected with the club that our main priority must be promotion. Let's concentrate very hard on each league fixture and not allow any more distractions. We have no sooner finished our involvement with the John Player than the draw is made for the Challenge Cup. The players are undergoing a serious test of character and an assessment of their ability to mentally blank off distractions and focus on what should be bread and butter - the league.

From a coach's point of view what I need above all else now is serious competition for places to keep players on their toes. Injuries have created situations in some positions where no cover is available. We cannot afford apathy. Life is difficult enough without us beating ourselves!

Some encouraging news on the playing front. Ian Sherratt is approaching match fitness and Ian Bates appears to have shaken off his shoulder injury. Colin Hawkyard gets his pot off any time and should be available within the next couple of weeks or so if he can get strength and mobility back in his hand. Steve Patterson has pleased us with his 'A' team form, and playing at No.6, he has given Paul Lord some serious competition. Leo Casey recovered quickly from what he thought was a torn muscle and he is working hard to re-establish himself as a first team contender, which has to be how he sees himself. Tony Copeland has also recovered from a rib cartilage injury.

A personal tribute to Ossie Rowe, our conditioner. Not only has he got Jim Knox and Ray Hill pumping iron on Mondays and Wednesdays, he has played a large part in our progress this season through his care and attention to detail. The martial arts discipline has been brought to bear in the weights room and the results are clearly evident.

Incidentally, how many of you can manage 600 sit-ups in a single session? Nick Burke did just that. At the same time Neil Clawson did a 45-minute training programme in 25 minutes and Paddy Kirwan completed three full circuits with his pot on!

Welcome to Oldham, Trevor Croston. I hope you have a long and successful career with us. Get down to work in the 'A' team and let me see you ready when I call on you for first team duty.

Finally, to all our fans a big THANK-YOU for your terrific support. We really appreciate it. Best wishes to you all for the New Year. Let's keep on the winning path and finish the second half of the season in style.

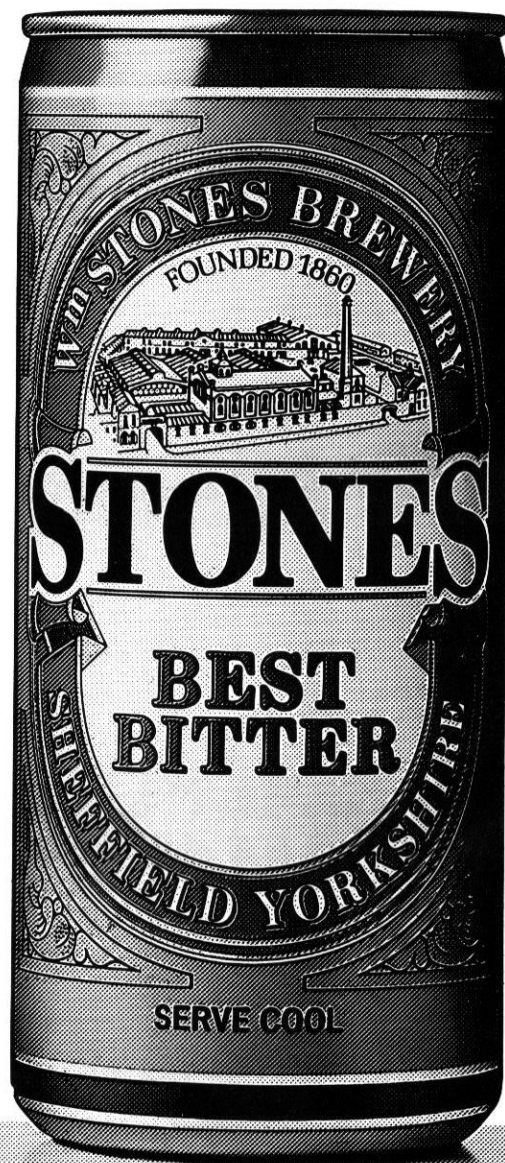

Here Come Hornets !

Rochdale Hornets, our friends from the other side of Summit Hill, come to Watersheddings today for the first time since both clubs were last in the Second Division in season 1981-2.

We don't have many derby clashes these days, a far cry from yesteryear when we always used to meet in the traditional pre-season Law Cup game and then played home-and-away league games in a one-division set-up.

Since two divisions came in the clubs have found themselves in different sections, oftener than not, and what's more we have usually been kept apart in the various cup competitions.

Five seasons ago, the last time we met, we won 17-5 at Watersheddings and 23-5 at the Athletic Grounds six days later on our way to the Second Division championship.

The match at Rochdale was postponed on Boxing Day and ultimately played on April 15, less than a week after we had won here on Good Friday.

There is every reason to believe that the Hornets will come here today fired up to put one over on the old enemy. What terrific games there have been between the clubs in the past. One's memory slips back easily to the days of the 50s team at Oldham and their battles with Ted Cahill, Norman Short, Johnnie Fishwick etc.

Even before that, Rochdale had a clutch of Aussies during the days when Cec Fifield was manager and he brought over players like Reg and Ron Stamford, Wally Ellean, 'Babe' Kelly and several others.

These days, the Hornets can also boast players from Down Under, including scrum-half Aaron Sawyer, skipper and back-row forward Gerry Byron, both Aussies, and a New Zealander in front-row forward Scott Barrow.

Our coach Eric Fitzsimons, of course, was boss at the Athletic Grounds last year, so he should have first-hand knowledge of what they can do even though there have been several new recruits in a side now handled by former Widnes and Great Britain centre Eric Hughes.

The Ruane brothers, Dennis and Andy, are doing well in the Hornets side at present and the best-known names are Hughes himself, in the centre, record buy Brian Garrity at stand-off - bought from Runcorn for £20,000 - and the experienced Alan Fairhurst, who competes with Sawyer for the No. 7 jersey.

In the pack, one can look out for local lad Dave Brown on the open side of the front-row and possibly Sean Hoare at No.10. Some years ago, Hoare move to Fulham for a £30,000 fee but he is now back at the Athletic Grounds on loan and is ready to step up to senior duty after a string of impressive displays in the 'A' team.

Whether skipper Byron plays will depend on his fitness - he has been out for several weeks with Achilles tendon trouble - but the Hornets will nevertheless boast a mobile back-row, possibly featuring former Wakefield Trinity star Dean Williams in the second-row and Mark Sanderson, brother of Oldham's Ian, at loose-forward.

The Sanderson boys have never played against each other in a competitive match before - one of several interesting tit-bits in what should be a terrific holiday derby.

FOLLOW THE 'A' TEAM

The 'A' team has had a frustrating time in recent weeks. They won well at Doncaster 20-8, but the next two games were both postponed, through no fault of our own.

At Doncaster, Ian Sherratt returned to action after his long lay-off in fine style, and there were pleasing displays from Bob Marsden, Leo Casey, Keith Atkinson, Richard Irving and half-backs Steve Patterson and Jeff Edwards.

After turning round level at 8-8, Oldham took command and finished with three tries by Patterson, Edwards and a trialist. Sadly, the next game against Barrow was called off by Barrow because they could not raise a team - notwithstanding the fact that we went up there earlier in the season with eight or nine trialists - and then the match at Dewsbury was postponed due to a waterlogged pitch.

Our new youth signing, Trevor Croston, was due to make his debut at Crown Platt, but he will now have to wait a little longer.
